

Finding the Right Fit

An Analysis of Freshmen Who Dropped Out of ISU and Graduated Elsewhere

Of the full-time students who began at Indiana State University between 2009 and 2012, on average 62% of the freshmen returned for their sophomore year. Approximately 22% graduated in four years. Of the students who left ISU after one year, 616 students (17%) went on to earn an associate or bachelors degree from another institution. This analysis is about those students who left and graduated elsewhere.





Had all of these students stayed at ISU, the retention rate could have increased as much as 8%, and the 4-Yr graduation rate could have increased by 3%. Most of those students (80%) left in good standing.

As one would assume, the vast majority (87%) of the students return to their home state to earn a degree. Nationally, students at public 4-yr institutions are on average 82 miles away from home. (Hillman and Weichman, 2016). Similarly, 62% of the students from the Wabash Valley earned a degree from lvy Tech and 12% earned a degree from Vincennes.



Eastern Illinois Chicago State Of the students who went on to earn a bachelors degree elsewhere, 49% earned that degree within four years. The top three institutions where they earned that degree were Ball State, IU-Bloomington, and IUPUI.

Ninety-three students who were a Nursing Non-Designated major earned a degree elsewhere; 13 of them graduated with a Registered Nursing degree. A little less than half (42%) earned their degree at Ivy Tech. A majority of them (n=45 or 48%) earned a degree in Health Professions and Related Programs, primarily as a Medical/Clinical Assistant.
