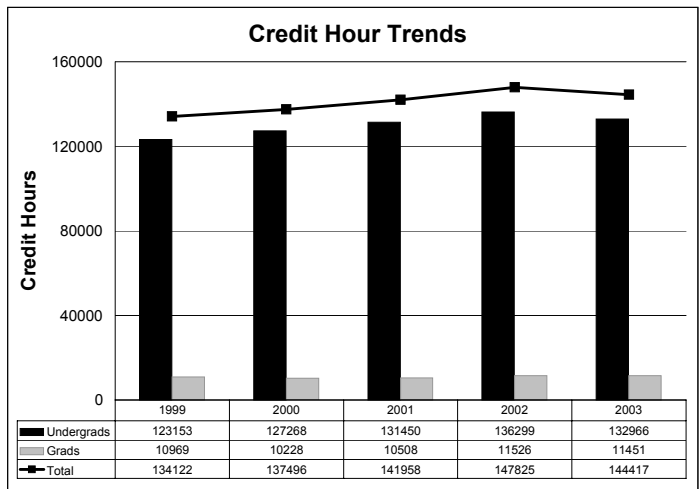
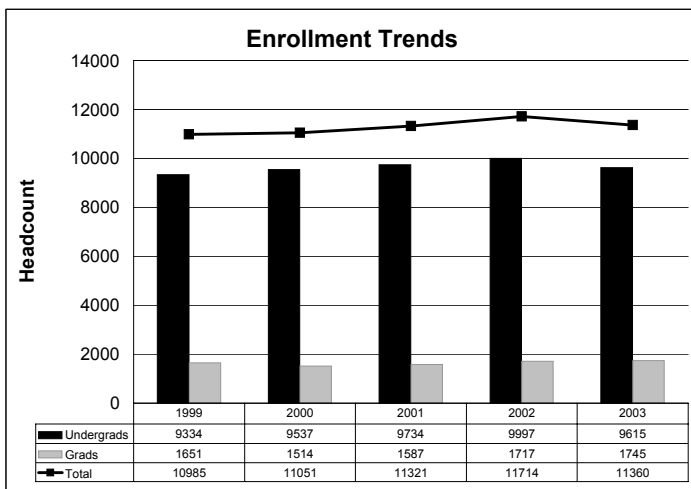

HIGHLIGHTS

ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM FALL 2002 TO FALL 2003

► **UNIVERSITY TOTALS**

Total enrollment decreased by 354 students or 3.0%.
 Total undergraduate enrollment decreased by 382 students or 3.8%.
 Total graduate student enrollment increased by 28 students or 1.6%.
 Total full-time equivalent (FTE)³ students decreased by 228.4 or 2.3%.

► **CLASSIFICATION⁴**

Freshman enrollment decreased by 484 students or 10.5%.
 Sophomore enrollment decreased by 56 students or 2.9%.
 Junior enrollment increased by 100 students or 6.0%.
 Senior enrollment increased by 58 students or 3.2%.

► **SCHOOL / COLLEGE**

Enrollment increased in Graduate Studies (28 students or 1.6%) and in Health & Human Performance (22 students or 3.0%). Enrollment decreased in Non-Degree (160 students or 42.0%), Business (94 students or 7.1%), Education (77 students or 7.8%), Nursing (30 students or 5.6%), Academic Services (20 students or 1.9%), Technology (16 students or 1.5%), and Arts & Sciences (7 students or 0.2%).

► **U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS**

Total U.S. minority student enrollment decreased by 2 students or 0.1%.
 Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment decreased by 31 students or 2.2%.
 Graduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 29 students or 17.7%.

► **FULL-TIME STATUS⁵**

Full-time enrollment decreased by 147 students or 1.6%.
 Full-time undergraduates decreased by 132 students or 1.5%.
 Full-time graduate students decreased by 15 students or 2.3%.

► **PART-TIME STATUS⁵**

Part-time enrollment decreased by 207 students or 8.3%.
 Part-time undergraduates decreased by 250 students or 17.3%.
 Part-time graduate students increased by 43 students or 4.1%.

► **IN-STATE RESIDENTS**

In-state students decreased by 377 students or 3.7%.
 In-state undergraduates decreased by 415 students or 4.6%.
 In-state graduate students increased by 38 students or 3.7%.

► **OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS**

Out-of-state students increased by 52 students or 4.5%.
 Out-of-state undergraduates increased by 44 students or 5.9%.
 Out-of-state graduate students increased by 8 student or 1.9%.

► **INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS**

International students decreased by 29 students or 6.2%.
 International undergraduates decreased by 11 students or 6.1%.
 International graduate students decreased by 18 students or 6.3%.

¹ The international count shown on Page 1 (436) is different from the international count shown on Page 3 (170+275=445), because Page 1 is based on country of origin at admission and Page 3 is based on ethnicity.

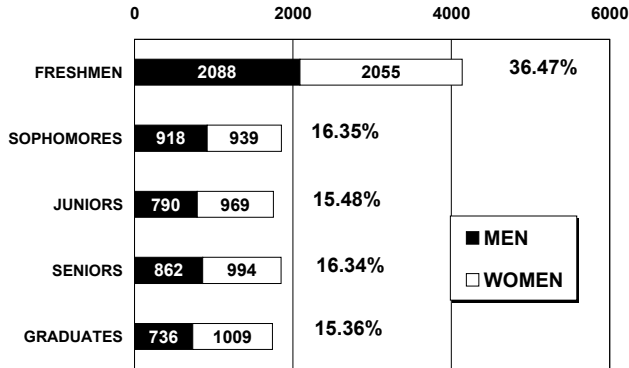

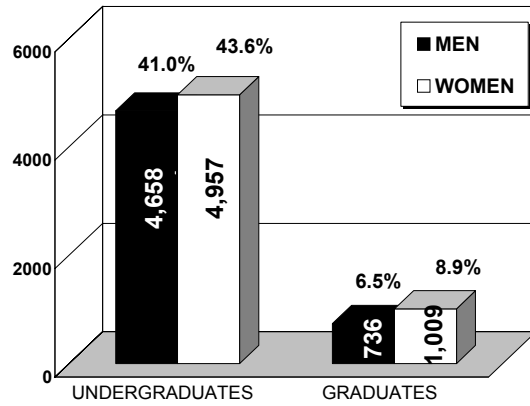

Enrollment by Gender and Classification



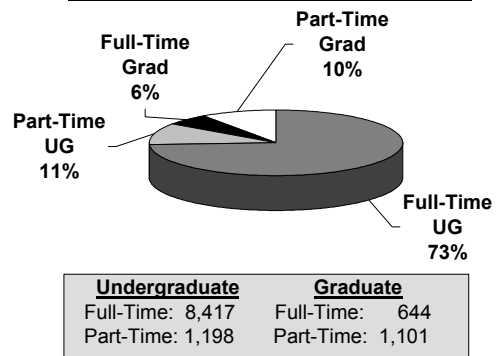
Enrollment by Gender and Level



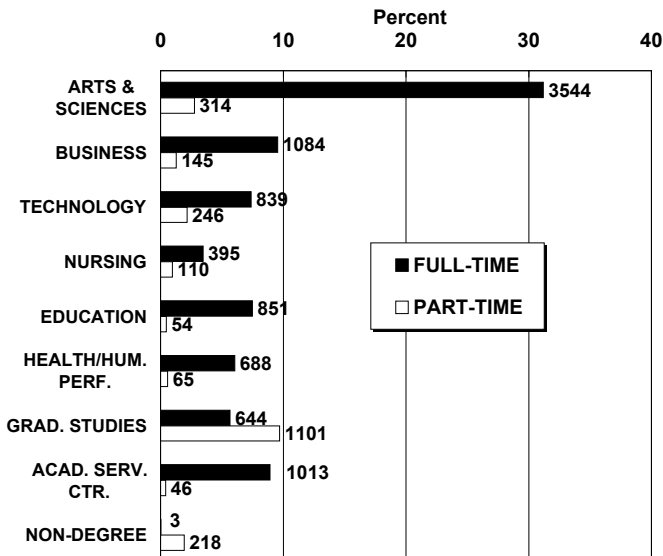

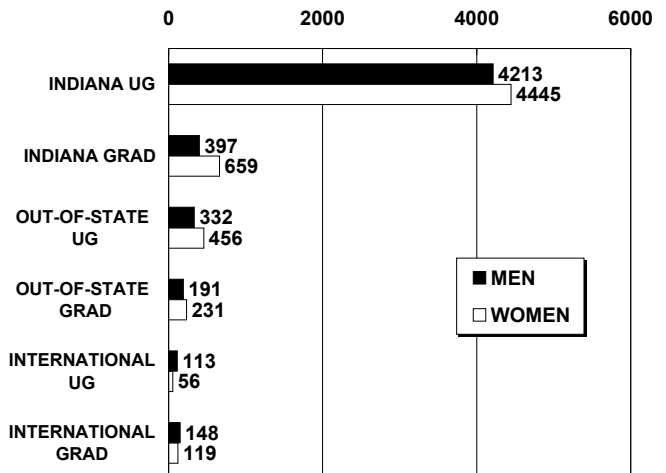
Enrollment by Status and Level



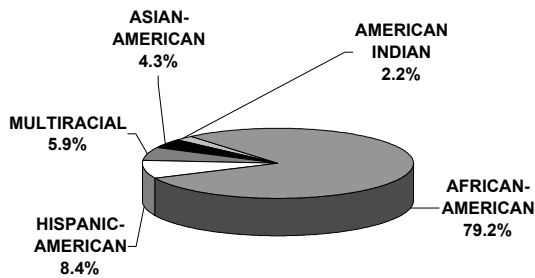
Enrollment by Status and School/College



Enrollment by Gender, Level, and Residency



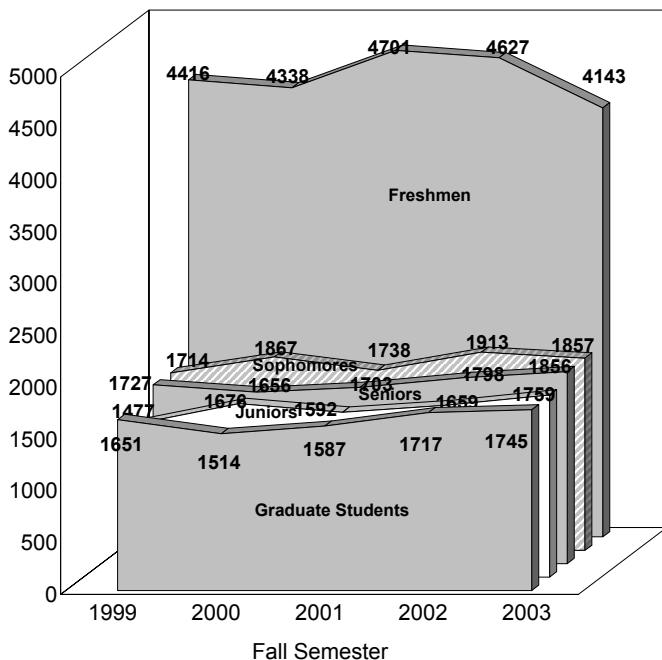

Enrollment Trends by Classification

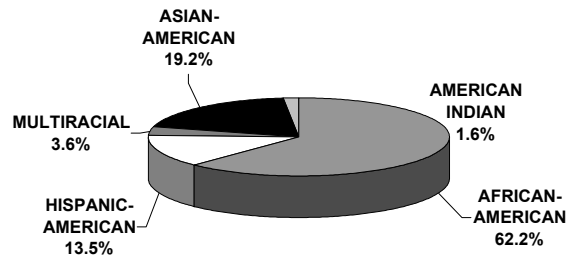

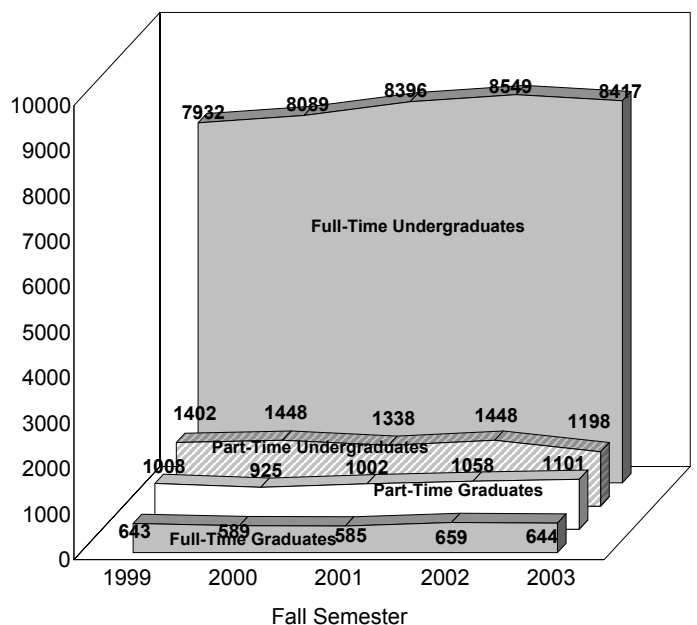
