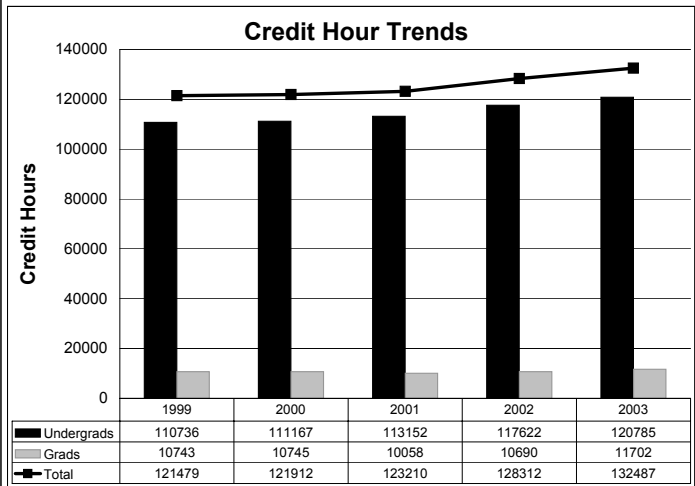
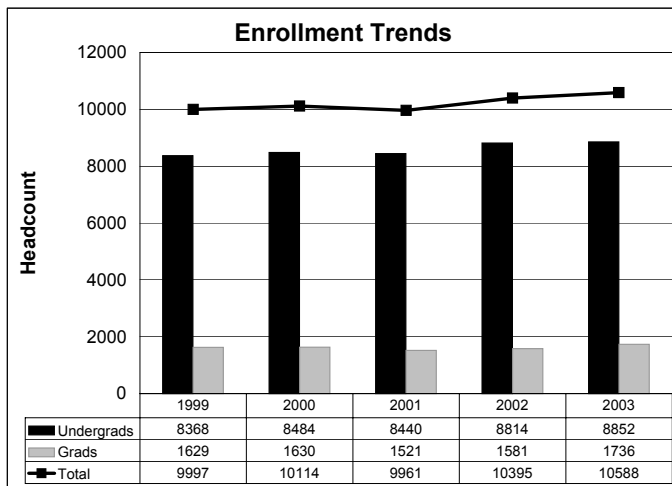

HIGHLIGHTS

ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM SPRING 2002 TO SPRING 2003

- ▶ **UNIVERSITY TOTALS**
 - Total enrollment increased by 193 students or 1.9%.
 - Total undergraduate enrollment increased by 38 students or 0.4%.
 - Total graduate student enrollment increased by 155 students or 9.8%.
 - Total full-time equivalent (FTE)³ students increased by 295.2 or 3.4%.
- ▶ **CLASSIFICATION⁴**
 - Freshman enrollment decreased by 186 students or 6.0%.
 - Sophomore enrollment increased by 14 students or 0.7%.
 - Junior enrollment increased by 204 students or 11.9%.
 - Senior enrollment increased by 6 students or 0.3%.
- ▶ **SCHOOL / COLLEGE⁵**
 - Enrollment increased in Arts & Sciences (234 students or 7.0%), Graduate Studies (155 students or 9.8%), Technology (39 students or 4.1%), Nursing (33 students or 7.5%), and Health & Human Performance (28 students or 4.2%). Enrollment decreased in Student Academic Services (169 students or 17.2%), Business (66 students or 5.3%), Non-Degree (34 students or 10.4%), and Education (27 students or 3.1%).
- ▶ **U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS**
 - Total U.S. minority student enrollment increased by 74 students or 5.5%.
 - Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 51 students or 4.3%.
 - Graduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 23 students or 16.3%.
- ▶ **FULL-TIME STATUS⁶**
 - Full-time enrollment increased by 281 students or 3.5%.
 - Full-time undergraduates increased by 219 students or 3.0%.
 - Full-time graduate students increased by 62 students or 10.4%.
- ▶ **PART-TIME STATUS⁶**
 - Part-time enrollment decreased by 88 students or 3.7%.
 - Part-time undergraduates decreased by 181 students or 12.8%.
 - Part-time graduate students increased by 93 students or 9.5%.
- ▶ **IN-STATE RESIDENTS**
 - In-state students increased by 125 students or 1.4%.
 - In-state undergraduates increased by 56 students or 0.7%.
 - In-state graduate students increased by 69 students or 7.2%.
- ▶ **OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS**
 - Out-of-state students increased by 88 students or 8.8%.
 - Out-of-state undergraduates increased by 12 students or 1.9%.
 - Out-of-state graduate students increased by 76 students or 21.2%.
- ▶ **INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS**
 - International students decreased by 20 students or 4.3%.
 - International undergraduates decreased by 30 students or 15.5%.
 - International graduate students increased by 10 students or 3.7%.

¹ International count shown on Page 1 (443) differs from international counts shown on Page 3 (166+290=456), because Page 1 is based on country of origin at admission and Page 3 is based on ethnicity.

² Average Age and Age by Level is based on 10,556 students for whom age data was available (99.70% of total enrollment).

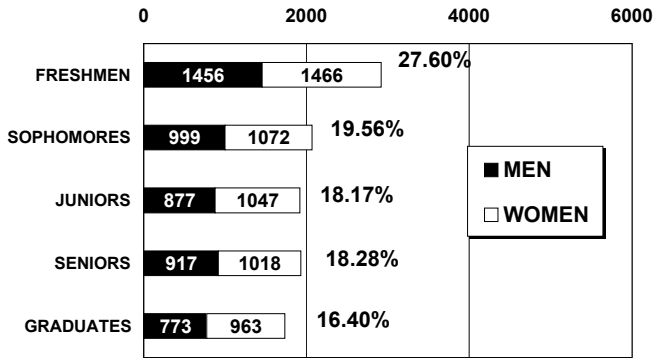

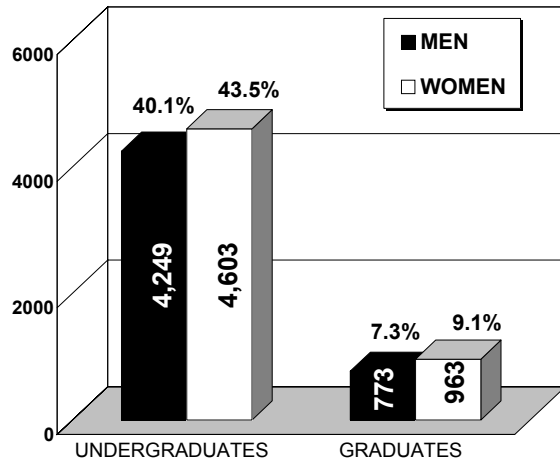

Enrollment by Gender and Classification



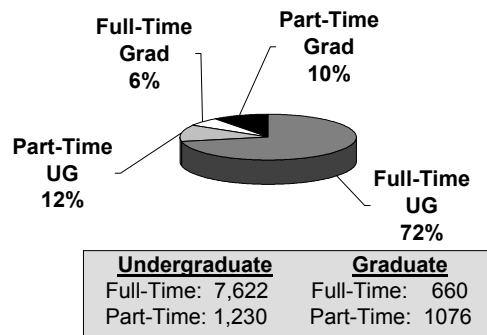
Enrollment by Gender and Level



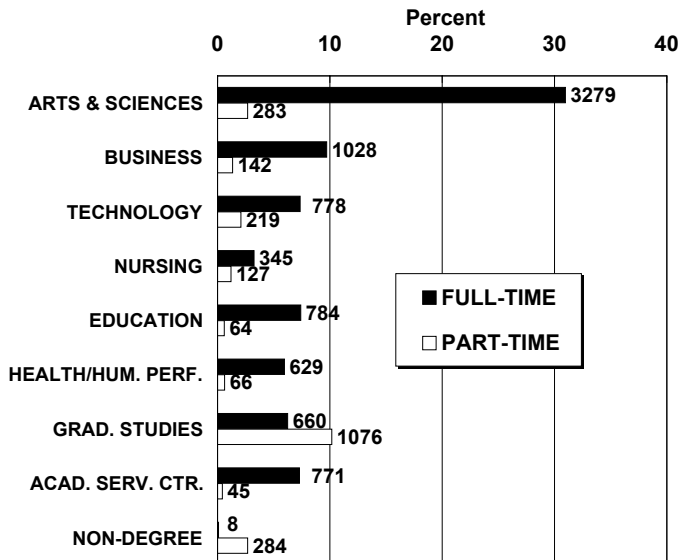

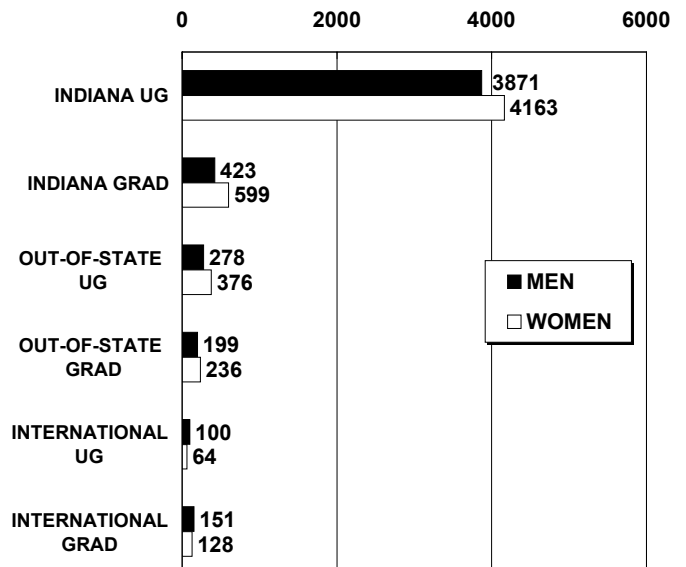
Enrollment by Status and Level



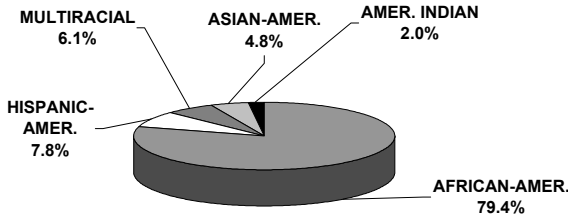
Enrollment by Status and School/College



Enrollment by Gender, Level, and Residency



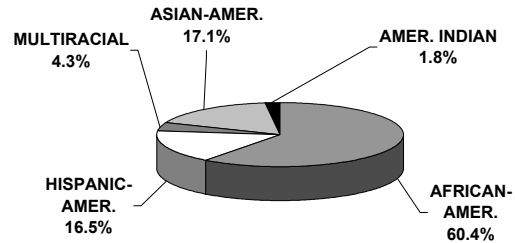
Undergraduate U.S. Minority Students

 Students of unknown origin comprise 1.4% (128) of all undergraduate students

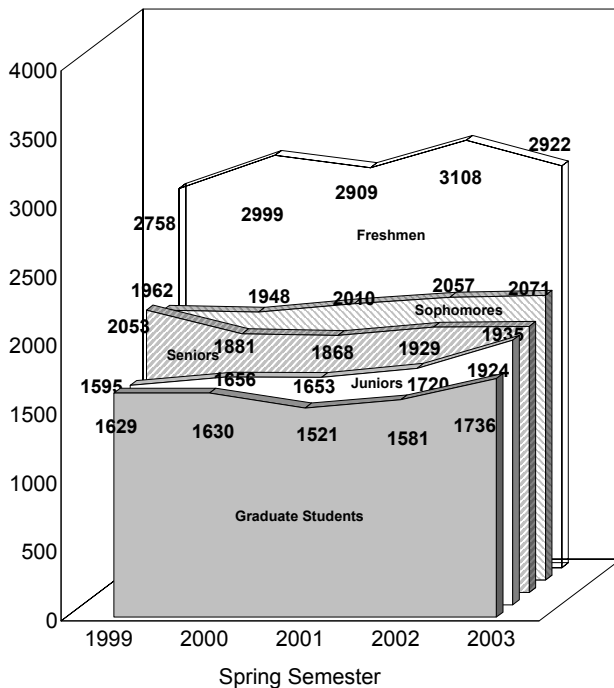
Graduate U.S. Minority Students



U.S. minority students comprise 9.4% (164) of all graduate students

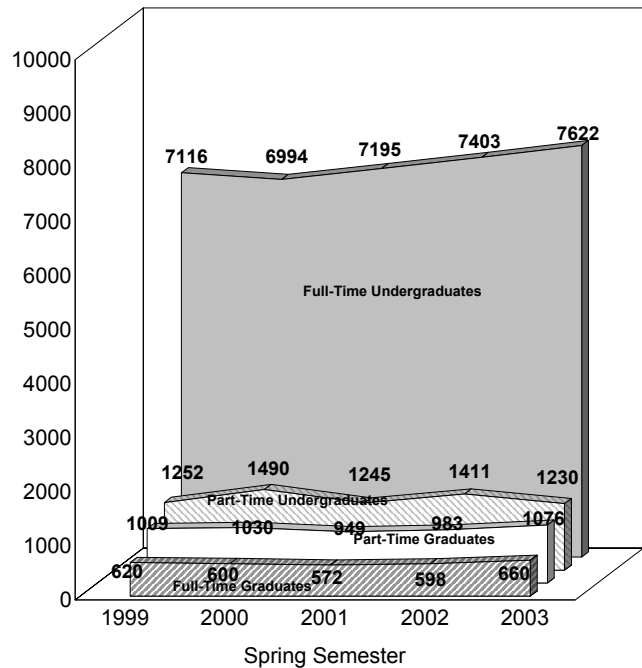
Caucasian students comprise 72.0% (1,250) of all graduate students
