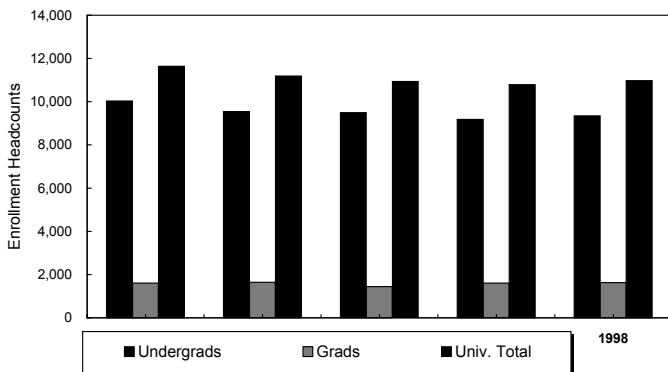

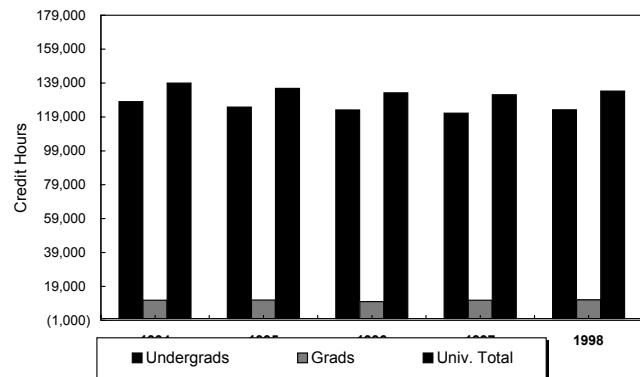

HIGHLIGHTS

ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM FALL 1997 TO FALL 1998

► UNIVERSITY TOTALS

Total enrollment increased by 186 students or 1.7%.
Total undergraduate enrollment increased by 163 students or 1.8%.
Total graduate student enrollment increased by 23 students or 1.4%.
Total full-time equivalent (FTE)*** students increased by 150.8 or 1.7%.

► CLASSIFICATION****

Freshman enrollment increased by 1,501 students or 52.5%.
Sophomore enrollment decreased by 316 students or 16.3%.
Junior enrollment decreased by 320 students or 17.0%.
Senior enrollment decreased by 702 students or 28.1%.

► SCHOOL / COLLEGE

The largest enrollment increases by school/college were in Technology (47 students or 6.2%) and Arts & Sciences (168 students or 5.1%).
Non-Degree enrollment increased by 35 students, or 12.9%.
Enrollment decreased in the School of Nursing (63 students or 11.1%) and in the School of Health & Human Performance (30 students or 3.6%)

► U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS

Total U.S. minority student enrollment increased by 162 students or 14.0%.
Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 156 students or 15.4%.
Graduate U.S. minority enrollment decreased by 1 student or 0.7%

► FULL-TIME STATUS****

Full-time enrollment increased by 121 students or 1.4%.
Full-time undergraduates increased by 130 students or 1.7%.
Full-time graduate students decreased by 9 students or 1.3%.

► PART-TIME STATUS****

Part-time enrollment increased by 65 students or 2.7%.
Part-time undergraduates increased by 33 students or 2.3%.
Part-time graduate students increased by 32 students or 3.5%.

► IN-STATE RESIDENTS

In-state students increased by 241 students or 2.6%.
In-state undergraduates increased by 210 students or 2.6%.
In-state graduate students increased by 31 students or 2.8%.

► OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS

Out-of-state students decreased by 10 students or 1.1%.
Out-of-state undergraduates increased by 7 students or 1.2%.
Out-of-state graduate students decreased by 17 students or 5.7%.

► INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

International students decreased by 45 students or 8.4%.
International undergraduates decreased by 54 students or 16.1%.
International graduate students increased by 9 student or 4.5%.

*The international count shown on Page 1 (491) is different from the international count shown on Page 3 (280+214=494) because Page 1 is based on country of origin at admission and Page 3 is based on ethnicity.

**Average Age and Age by Level is based on 10,918 students for whom age data was available (99.5% of total enrollment).

***Total FTE Students = (Total Number of Undergraduate Credit Hours Enrolled / 15) + (Total Number of Graduate Credit Hours Enrolled / 12).

****FULL-TIME: enrolled for 12 or more hours (Undergraduate), 9 or more hours (Graduate); *****PART-TIME: enrolled for less than 12 hours (Undergraduate), less than 9 hours (Graduate).

*****The calculation for classification (Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, Senior) was changed this fall, with the switchover to BANNER. Prior to Fall 1998, the calculation was Earned Hours + Current Hours Enrolled = Classification. However, beginning this Fall, the calculation for classification is Earned Hours ONLY (Current Hours Enrolled are NOT included)

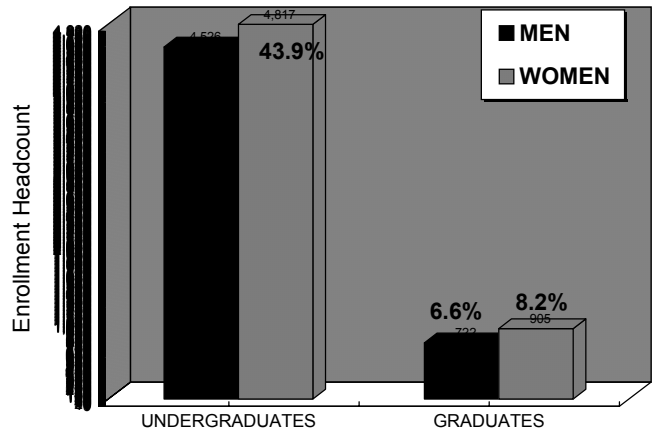

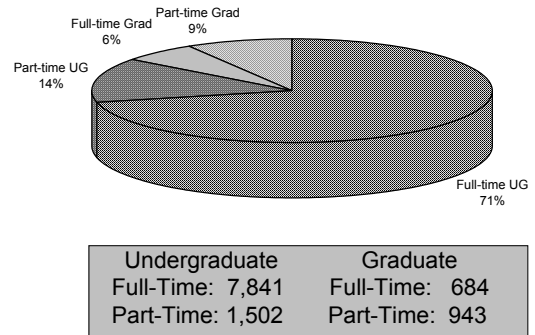

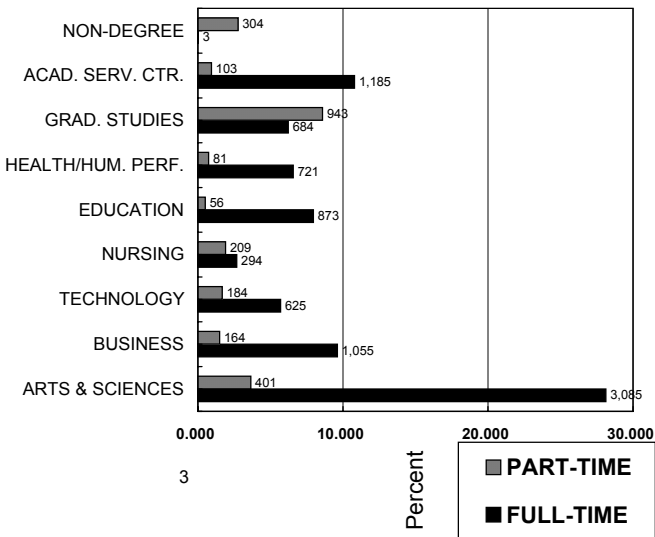
Enrollment by Gender and Level



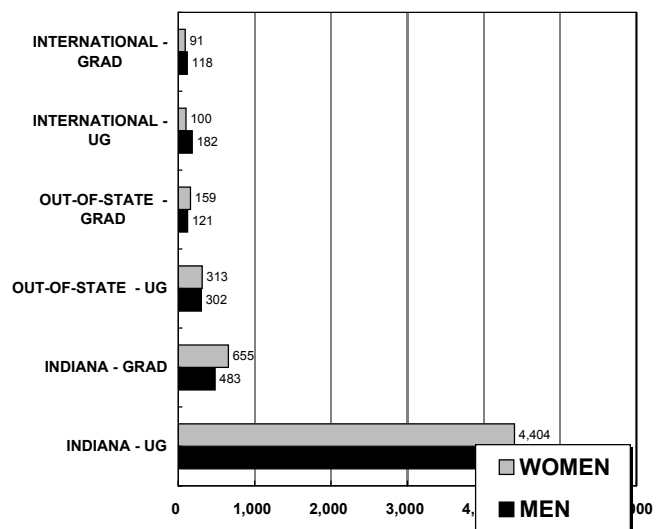
Enrollment by Status and Level



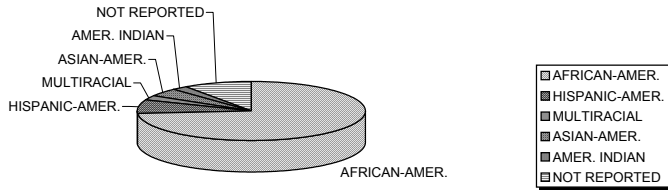
Enrollment by Status and School/College



Enrollment by Gender, Level & Residency



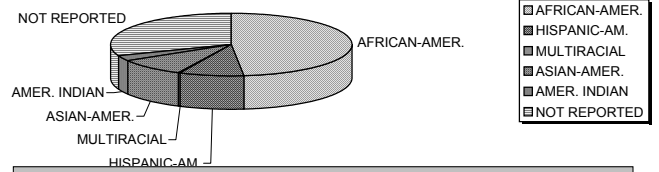
Undergraduate U.S. Minority Students

International students comprise 280 (3.0%) of all undergraduates.

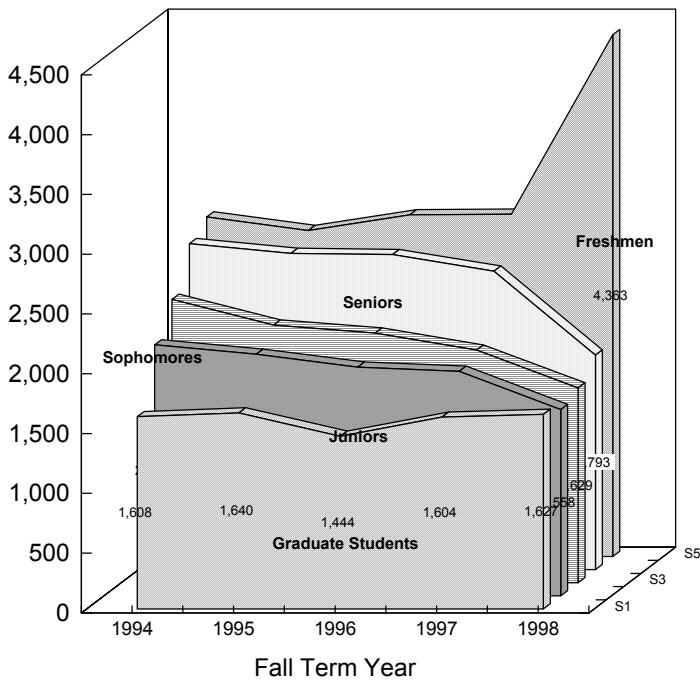
Graduate U.S. Minority Students

Enrollment Trends* by Classification

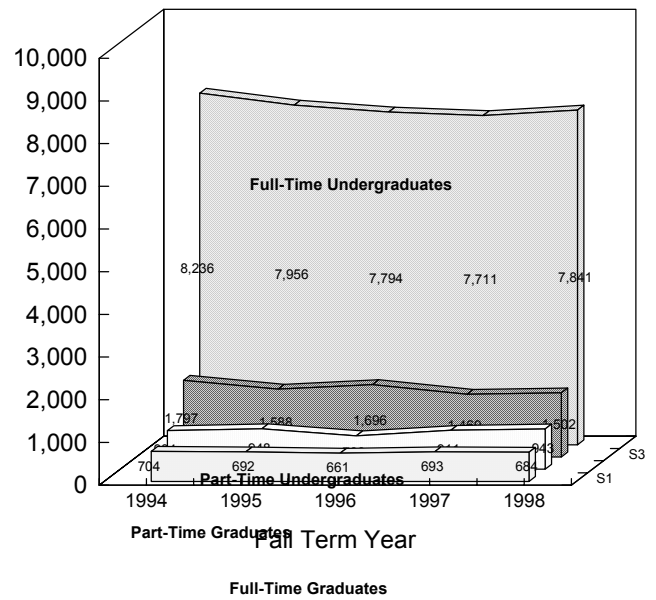
