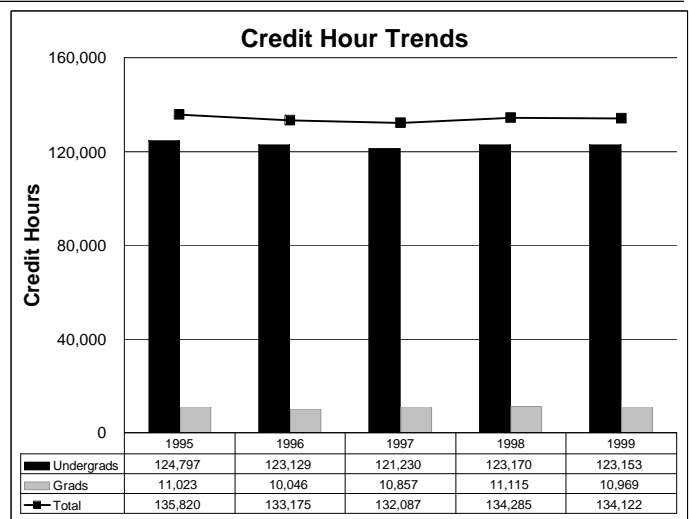
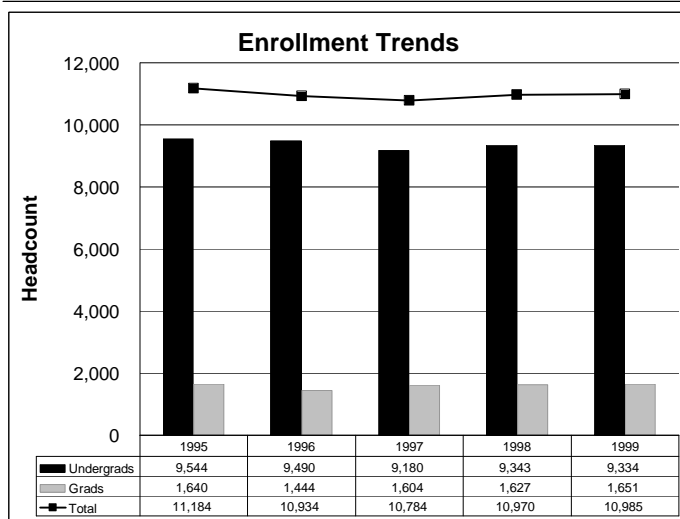

HIGHLIGHTS

ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM FALL 1998 TO FALL 1999

► **UNIVERSITY TOTALS**

Total enrollment increased by 15 students or 0.1%.
 Total undergraduate enrollment decreased by 9 students or 0.1%.
 Total graduate student enrollment increased by 24 students or 1.5%.
 Total full-time equivalent (FTE)** students decreased by 13.3 or 0.2%.

► **CLASSIFICATION******

Freshman enrollment increased by 53 students or 1.2%.
 Sophomore enrollment increased by 85 students or 5.2%.
 Junior enrollment decreased by 81 students or 5.2%.
 Senior enrollment decreased by 66 students or 3.7%.

► **SCHOOL / COLLEGE**

Enrollment increased in Technology (95 students or 11.7%), Education 75 students or 8.1%), Business (53 students or 4.4%), and Graduate Studies (24 students, or 1.5%). Enrollment decreased in Non-Degree (57 students or 18.6%), Health & Human Performance (90 students or 11.2%), Nursing (31 students or 6.2%), Student Academic Services (37 students or 2.9%), and Arts and Sciences (17 students or 0.5%)

► **U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS**

Total U.S. minority student enrollment increased by 24 students or 1.8%.
 Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 21 students or 1.8%.
 Graduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 3 students or 2.1%

► **FULL-TIME STATUS*******

Full-time enrollment increased by 50 students or 0.6%.
 Full-time undergraduates increased by 91 students or 1.2%.
 Full-time graduate students decreased by 41 students or 6.0%.

► **PART-TIME STATUS*******

Part-time enrollment decreased by 35 students or 1.4%.
 Part-time undergraduates decreased by 100 students or 6.7%.
 Part-time graduate students increased by 65 students or 6.9%.

► **IN-STATE RESIDENTS**

In-state students increased by 30 students or 0.3%.
 In-state undergraduates increased by 8 students or 0.1%.
 In-state graduate students increased by 22 students or 1.9%.

► **OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS**

Out-of-state students decreased by 7 students or 0.8%.
 Out-of-state undergraduates decreased by 6 students or 1.0%.
 Out-of-state graduate students decreased by 1 student or 0.4%.

► **INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS**

International students decreased by 8 students or 1.6%.
 International undergraduates decreased by 11 students or 3.9%.
 International graduate students increased by 3 students or 1.4%.

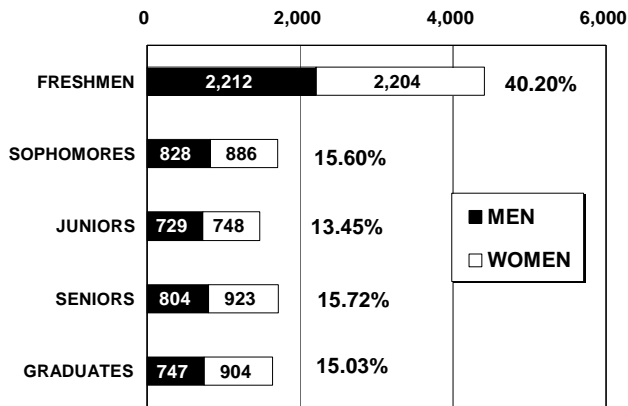

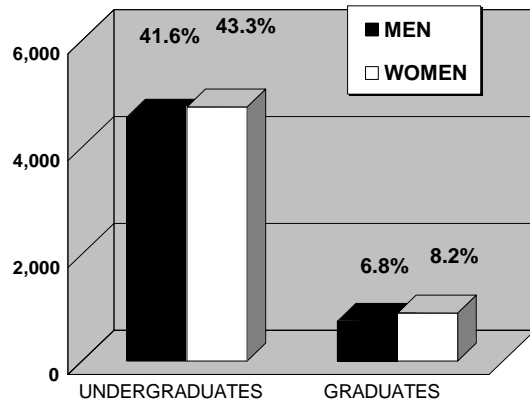

Enrollment by Gender and Classification



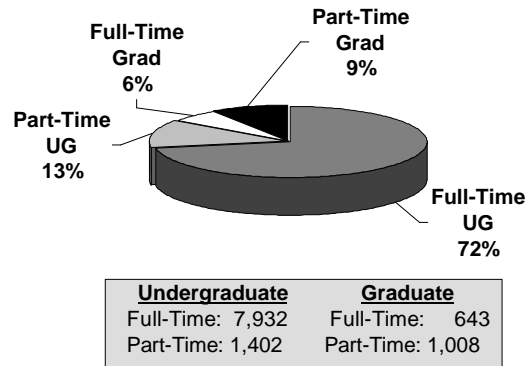
Enrollment by Gender and Level



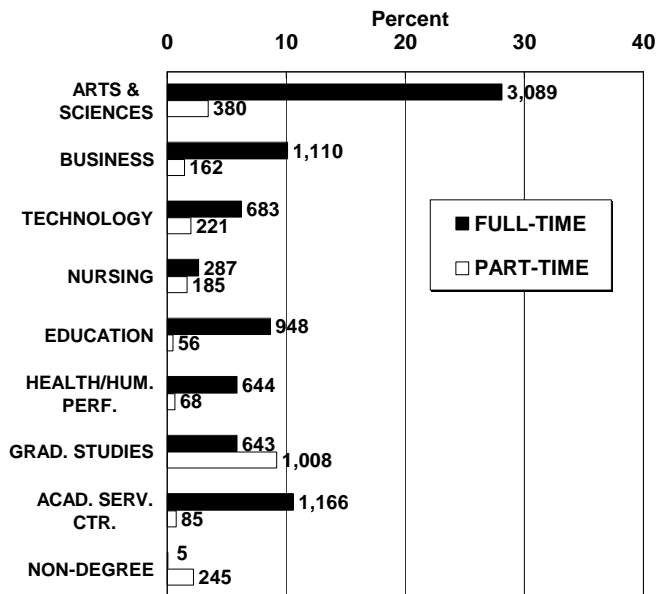

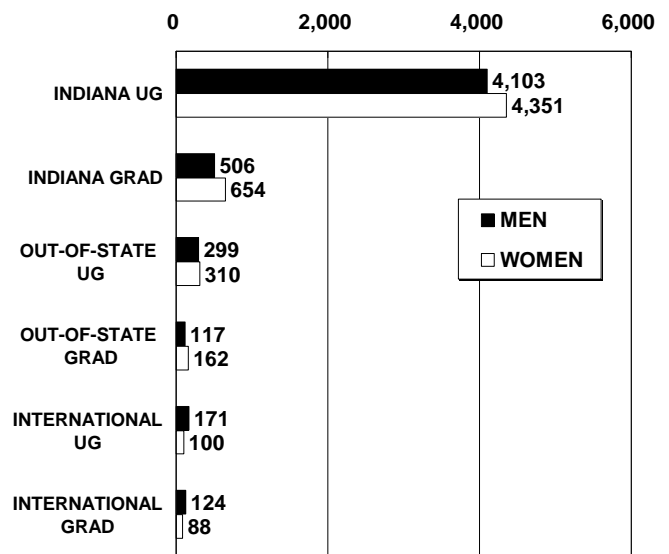
Enrollment by Status and Level



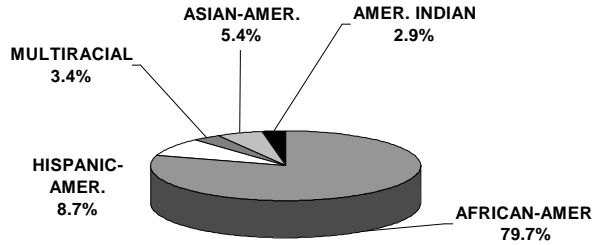
Enrollment by Status and School/College



Enrollment by Gender, Level, and Residency



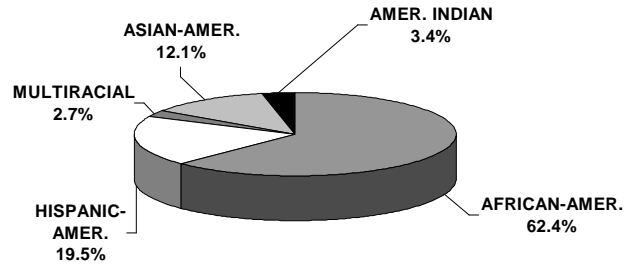

 Students of unknown origin comprise 112 (1.2%) of all undergraduate students

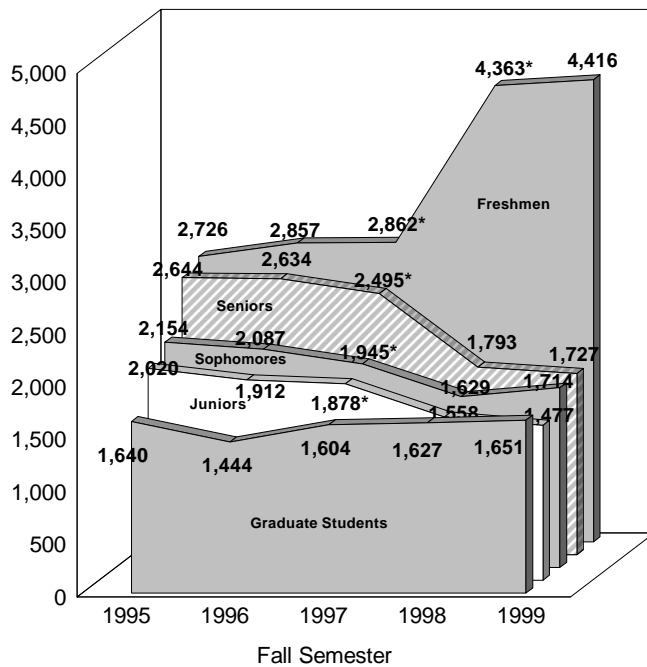
Graduate U.S. Minority Students



U.S. Minority Students comprise 149 (9.0%) of all graduate students

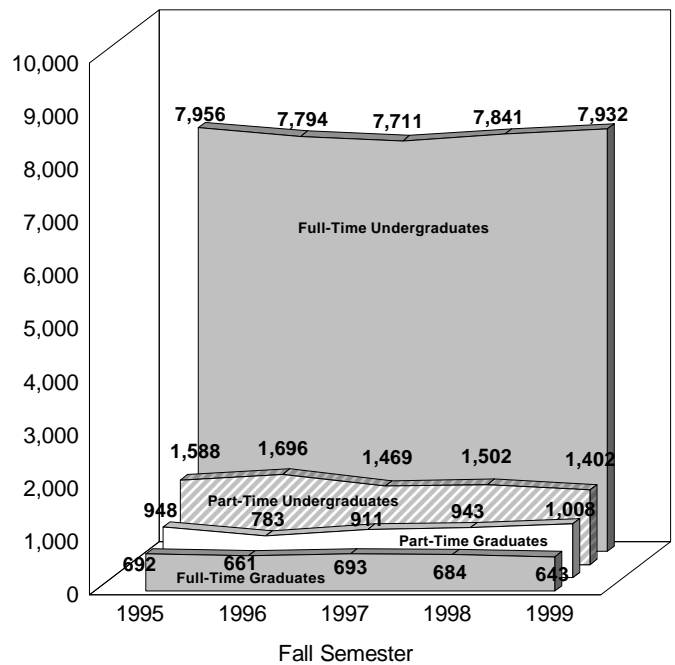
