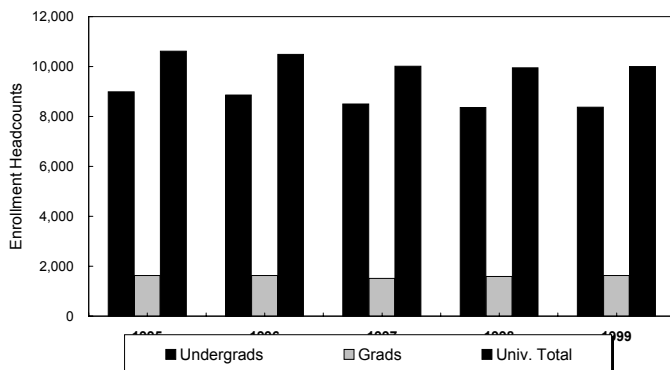

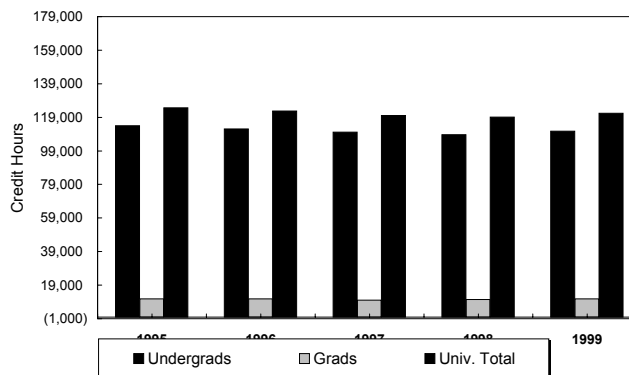

HIGHLIGHTS

ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM SPRING 1998 TO SPRING 1999

► UNIVERSITY TOTALS

Total enrollment increased by 47 students or 0.5%.
Total undergraduate enrollment increased by 10 students or 0.1%.
Total graduate student enrollment increased by 37 students or 2.3%.
Total full-time equivalent (FTE)*** students increased by 162.3 or 2.0%.

► CLASSIFICATION*****

Freshman enrollment increased by 758 students or 37.9%.
Sophomore enrollment increased by 167 students or 9.3%.
Junior enrollment decreased by 200 students or 11.1%.
Senior enrollment decreased by 715 students or 25.8%.
Graduate enrollment increased by 37 students or 2.3%.

► SCHOOL / COLLEGE

Enrollment decreased in the Non-Degree program (159 students or 52.7%), the School of Nursing (64 students or 13.6%), and the School of Health and Human Performance (43 students or 5.4%).
The largest enrollment increases were in Student Academic Services (64 students or 6.6%), the School of Business (60 students or 5.4%), and the School of Technology (37 students or 4.4%).

► U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS

The U.S. minority student enrollment increased by 128 students or 12.3%.

► FULL-TIME STATUS****

Full-time enrollment increased by 194 students or 2.6%.
Full-time undergraduates increased by 218 students or 3.2%.
Full-time graduate students decreased by 24 students or 3.7%.

► PART-TIME STATUS****

Part-time enrollment decreased by 147 students or 6.1%.
Part-time undergraduates decreased by 208 students or 14.3%.
Part-time graduate students increased by 61 students or 6.4%.

► IN-STATE RESIDENTS

In-state students increased by 91 students or 1.1%.
In-state undergraduates increased by 36 students or 0.5%.
In-state graduate students increased by 55 students or 4.9%.

► OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS

Out-of-state students increased by 18 students or 2.2%.
Out-of-state undergraduates increased by 22 students or 4.0%.
Out-of-state graduate students decreased by 4 students or 1.5%.

► INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

International students decreased by 62 students or 11.6%.
International undergraduates decreased by 48 students or 14.5%.
International graduate students decreased by 14 students or 6.8%.

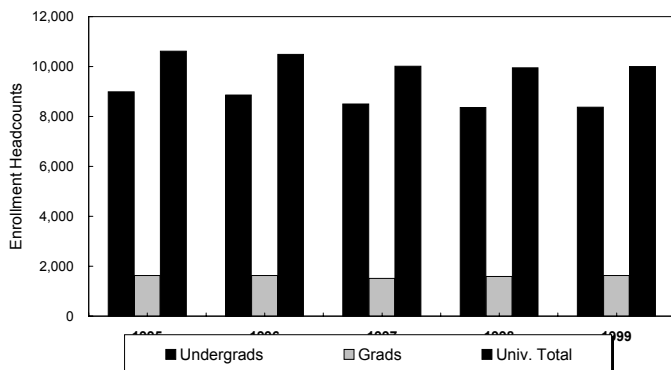

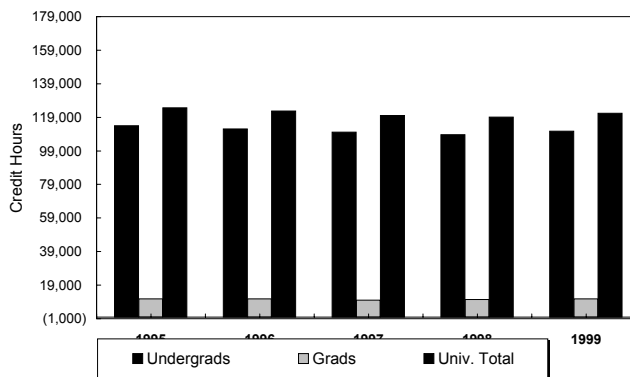

ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM SPRING 1998 TO SPRING 1999

► UNIVERSITY TOTALS

Total enrollment increased by 47 students or 0.5%.
Total undergraduate enrollment increased by 10 students or 0.1%.
Total graduate student enrollment increased by 37 students or 2.3%.
Total full-time equivalent (FTE)*** students increased by 162.3 or 2.0%.

► CLASSIFICATION*****

Freshman enrollment increased by 758 students or 37.9%.
Sophomore enrollment increased by 167 students or 9.3%.
Junior enrollment decreased by 200 students or 11.1%.
Senior enrollment decreased by 715 students or 25.8%.
Graduate enrollment increased by 37 students or 2.3%.

► SCHOOL / COLLEGE

Enrollment decreased in the Non-Degree program (159 students or 52.7%), the School of Nursing (64 students or 13.6%), and the School of Health and Human Performance (43 students or 5.4%).
The largest enrollment increases were in Student Academic Services (64 students or 6.6%), the School of Business (60 students or 5.4%), and the School of Technology (37 students or 4.4%).

► U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS

The U.S. minority student enrollment increased by 128 students or 12.3%.

Part-time enrollment decreased by 147 students or 6.1%.

In-state students increased by 91 students or 1.1%.
In-state undergraduates increased by 36 students or 0.5%.
In-state graduate students increased by 55 students or 4.9%.

► OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS

Out-of-state students increased by 18 students or 2.2%.
Out-of-state undergraduates increased by 22 students or 4.0%.
Out-of-state graduate students decreased by 4 students or 1.5%.

► INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

International students decreased by 62 students or 11.6%.
International undergraduates decreased by 48 students or 14.5%.
International graduate students decreased by 14 students or 6.8%.

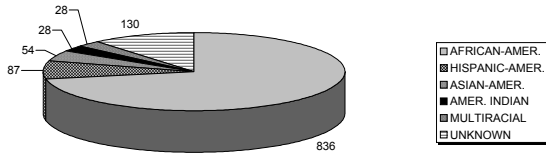

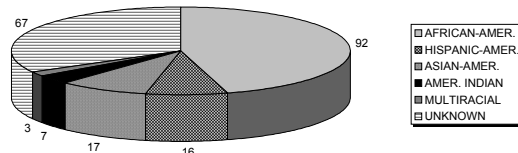
Undergraduate U.S. Minority Students

International students comprise 281 (3.4%) of all undergraduates.

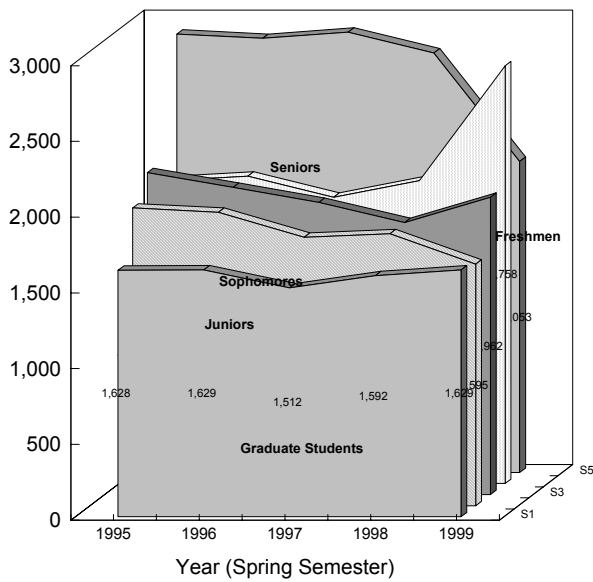
Graduate U.S. Minority Students



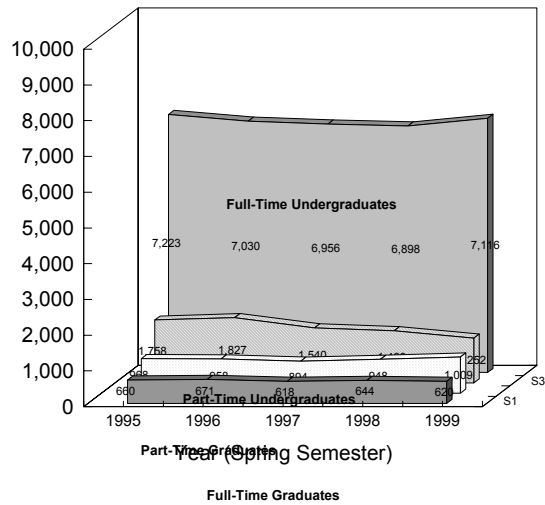
TOTAL - 135 U.S. Minority Students or 8.3% of the graduate population
