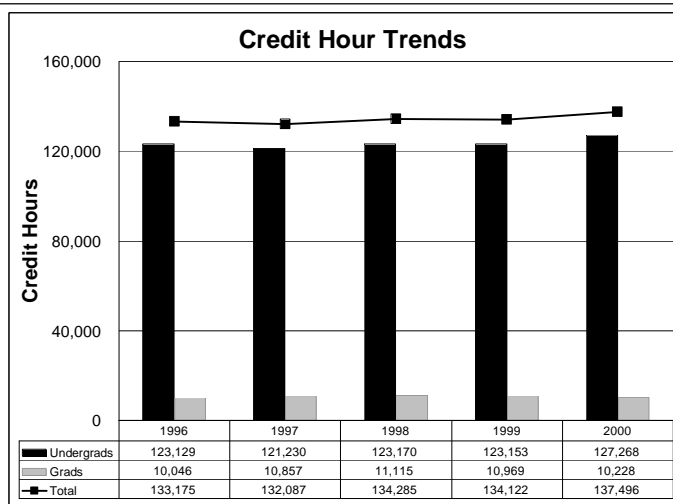
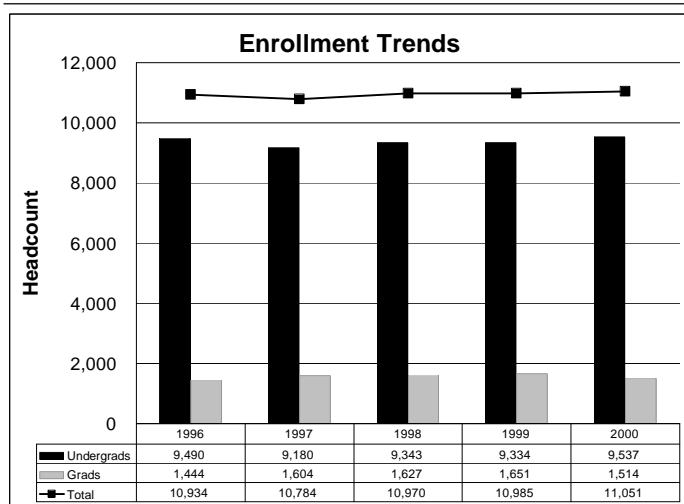

HIGHLIGHTS

ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM FALL 1999 TO FALL 2000

UNIVERSITY TOTALS

- Total enrollment increased by 66 students or 0.6%.
- Total undergraduate enrollment increased by 203 students or 2.2%.
- Total graduate student enrollment decreased by 137 students or 8.3%.
- Total full-time equivalent (FTE)³ students increased by 212.5 or 2.3%.

CLASSIFICATION⁴

- Freshman enrollment decreased by 78 students or 1.8%.
- Sophomore enrollment increased by 153 students or 8.9%.
- Junior enrollment increased by 199 students or 13.5%.
- Senior enrollment decreased by 71 students or 4.1%.

SCHOOL / COLLEGE

- Enrollment increased in Non-Degree (63 students or 25.2%), Student Academic Services (83 students or 6.6%), Technology (47 students or 5.2%), Nursing (16 students or 3.4%), Education (28 students or 2.8%), and Business (23 students or 1.8%).
- Enrollment decreased in Graduate Studies (137 students or 8.3%), Health & Human Performance (28 students or 3.9%), and Arts and Sciences (29 students or 0.8%).

U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS

- Total U.S. minority student enrollment increased by 109 students or 8.1%.
- Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 102 students or 8.6%.
- Graduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 7 students or 4.7%.

FULL-TIME STATUS⁵

- Full-time enrollment increased by 103 students or 1.2%.
- Full-time undergraduates increased by 157 students or 2.0%.
- Full-time graduate students decreased by 54 students or 8.4%.

PART-TIME STATUS⁵

- Part-time enrollment decreased by 37 students or 1.5%.
- Part-time undergraduates increased by 46 students or 3.3%.
- Part-time graduate students decreased by 83 students or 8.2%.

IN-STATE RESIDENTS

- In-state students increased by 46 students or 0.5%.
- In-state undergraduates increased by 158 students or 1.9%.
- In-state graduate students decreased by 112 students or 9.7%.

OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS

- Out-of-state students increased by 46 students or 5.2%.
- Out-of-state undergraduates increased by 69 students or 11.3%.
- Out-of-state graduate students decreased by 23 student or 8.2%.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

- International students decreased by 26 students or 5.4%.
- International undergraduates decreased by 24 students or 8.9%.
- International graduate students decreased by 2 students or 0.9%.

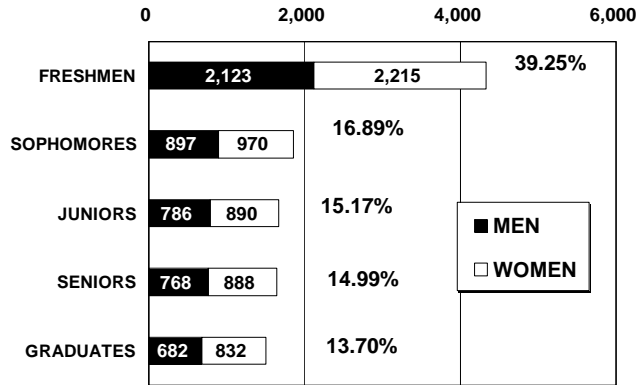

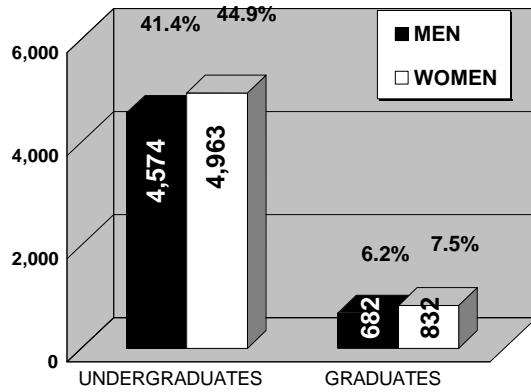

Enrollment by Gender and Classification



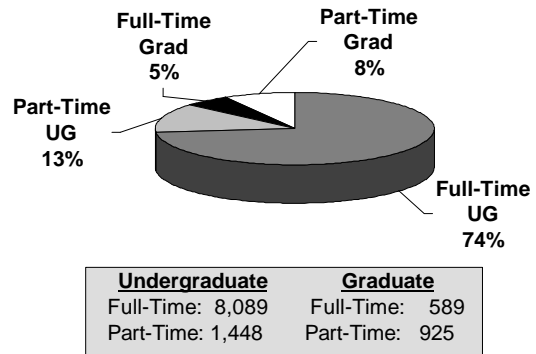
Enrollment by Gender and Level



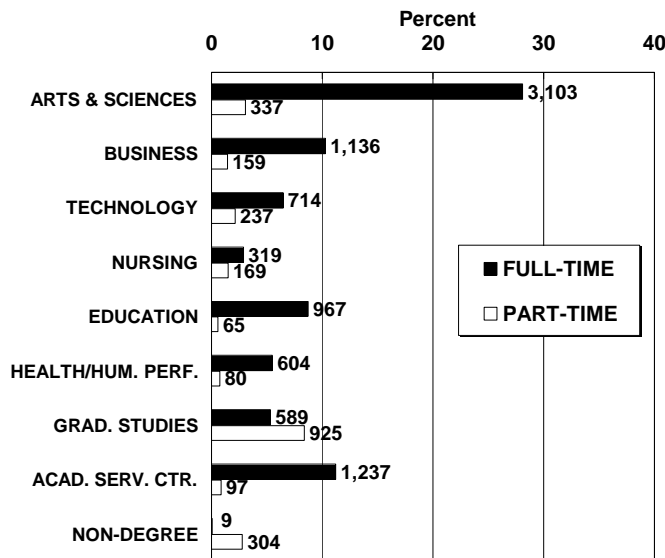

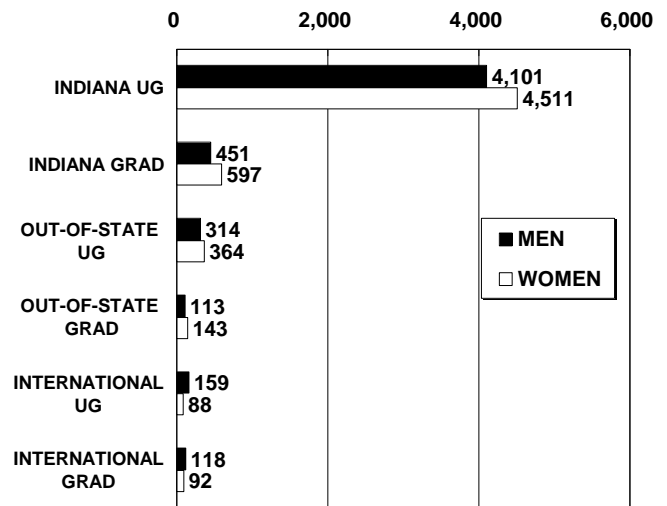
Enrollment by Status and Level



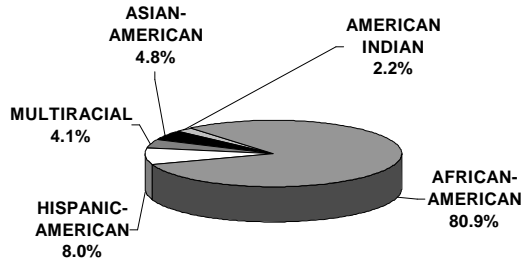
Enrollment by Status and School/College



Enrollment by Gender, Level, and Residency



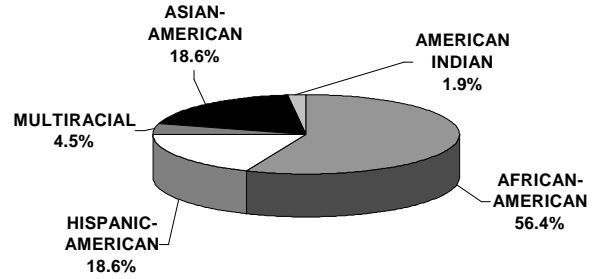

 Students of unknown origin comprise 105 (1.1%) of all undergraduate students

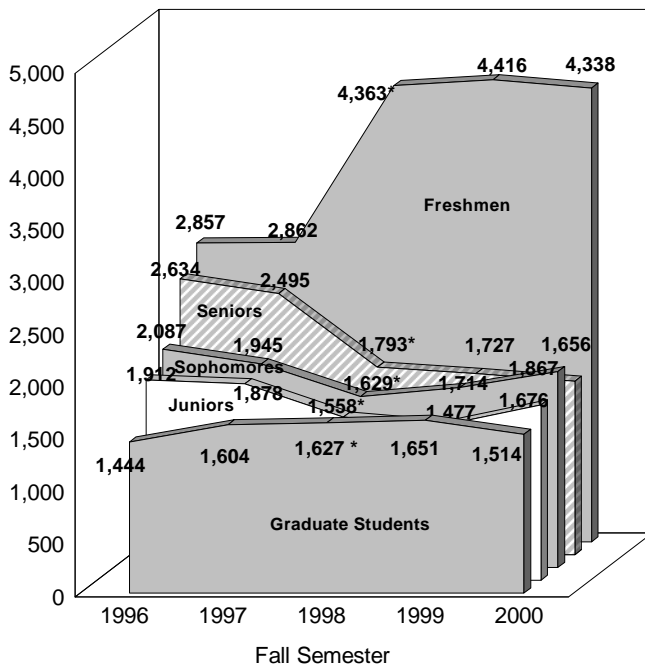
Graduate U.S. Minority Students



U.S. Minority Students comprise 156 (10.3%) of all graduate students

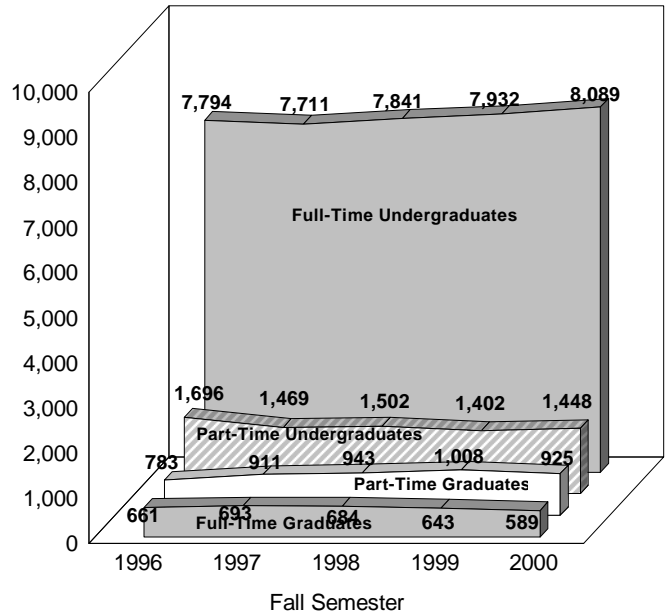
