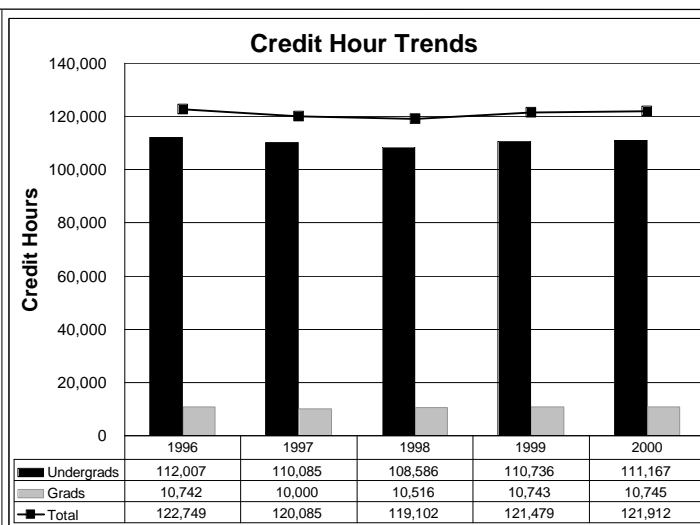
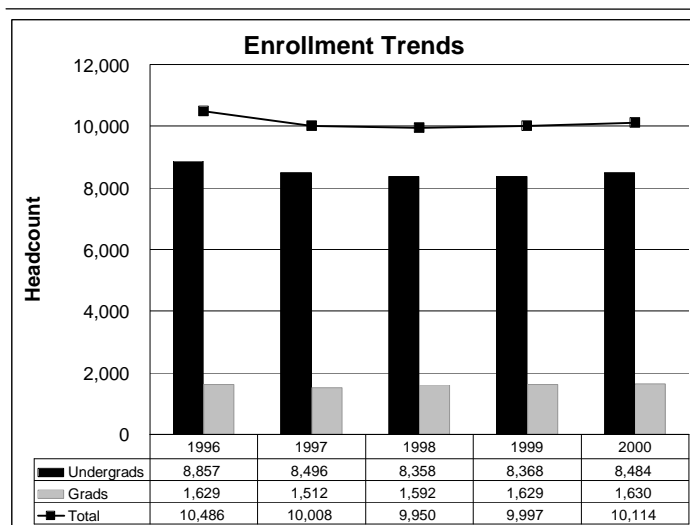

HIGHLIGHTS

ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM SPRING 1999 TO SPRING 2000

► UNIVERSITY TOTALS

- Total enrollment increased by 117 students or 1.2%.
- Total undergraduate enrollment increased by 116 students or 1.4%.
- Total graduate student enrollment increased by 1 student or 0.1%.
- Total full-time equivalent (FTE)³ students increased by 28.9 or 0.4%.

► CLASSIFICATION⁴

- Freshman enrollment increased by 241 students or 8.7%.
- Sophomore enrollment decreased by 14 students or 0.7%.
- Junior enrollment increased by 61 students or 3.8%.
- Senior enrollment decreased by 172 students or 8.4%.

► SCHOOL / COLLEGE

- Enrollment increased in Non-Degree (222 students or 155.2%), Technology (49 students or 6.2%), Education (40 students or 4.6%), Nursing (3 students or 0.7%), and Graduate Studies (1 student, or 0.1%). Enrollment decreased in Health & Human Performance (78 students or 10.4%), Student Academic Services (72 students or 6.9%), Business (13 students or 1.1%), and Arts and Sciences (35 students or 1.1%)

► U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS

- Total U.S. minority student enrollment increased by 103 students or 8.8%.
- Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 65 students or 6.3%
- Graduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 38 students or 28.2%

► FULL-TIME STATUS⁵

- Full-time enrollment decreased by 142 students or 1.8%.
- Full-time undergraduates decreased by 122 students or 1.7%.
- Full-time graduate students decreased by 20 students or 3.2%.

► PART-TIME STATUS⁵

- Part-time enrollment increased by 259 students or 11.5%.
- Part-time undergraduates increased by 238 students or 19.0%.
- Part-time graduate students increased by 21 students or 2.1%.

► IN-STATE RESIDENTS

- In-state students increased by 145 students or 1.7%.
- In-state undergraduates increased by 150 students or 2.0%.
- In-state graduate students decreased by 5 students or 0.4%.

► OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS

- Out-of-state students increased by 5 students or 0.6%.
- Out-of-state undergraduates increased by 1 student or 0.2%.
- Out-of-state graduate students increased by 4 students or 1.5%.

► INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

- International students decreased by 33 students or 7.0%.
- International undergraduates decreased by 35 students or 12.4%.
- International graduate students increased by 2 students or 1.0%.

¹ International count shown on Page 1 (442) differs from international counts shown on Page 3 (244+202=446), because Page 1 is based on country of origin at admission and Page 3 is based on ethnicity.

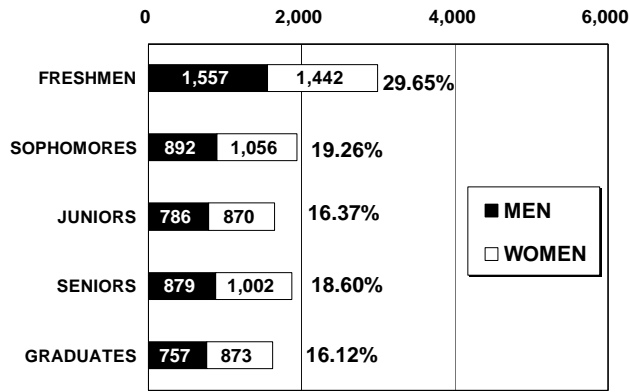

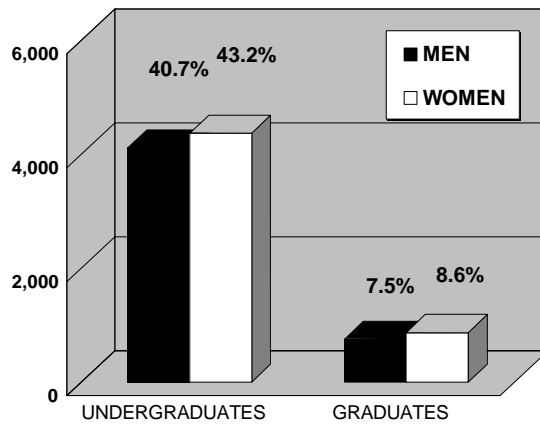

Enrollment by Gender and Classification



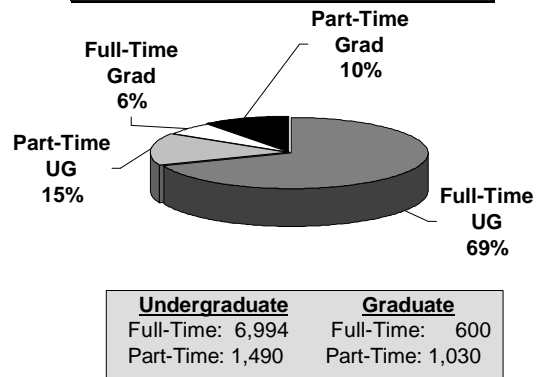
Enrollment by Gender and Level



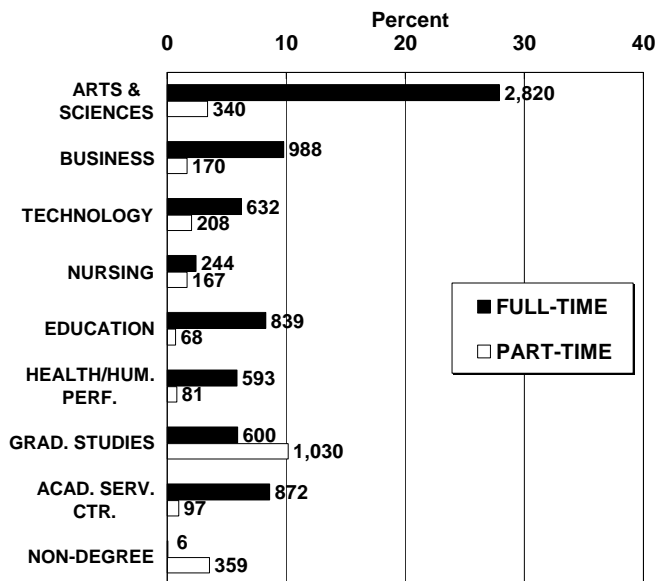

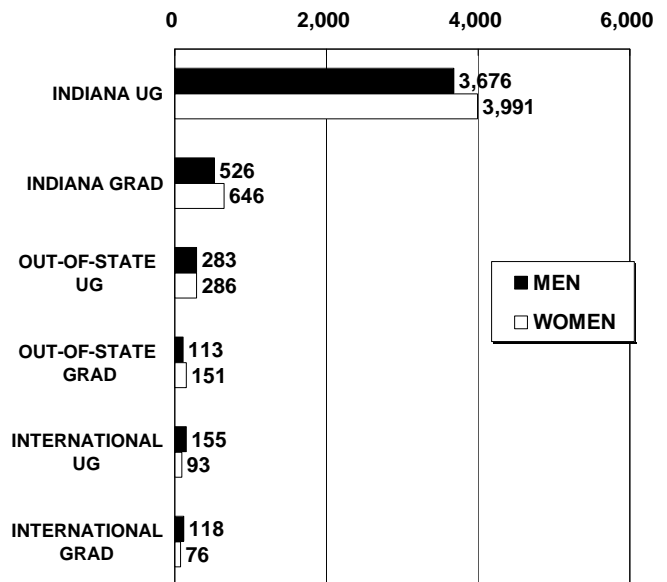
Enrollment by Status and Level



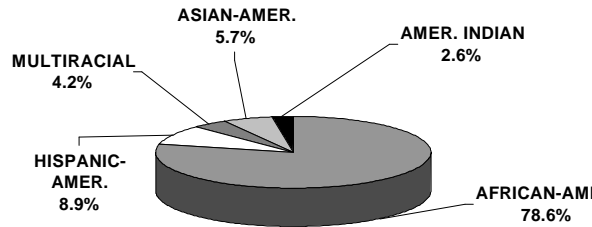
Enrollment by Status and School/College



Enrollment by Gender, Level, and Residency



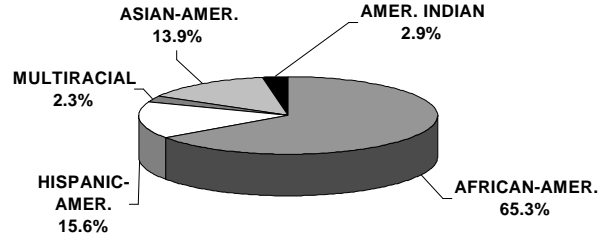
Undergraduate U.S. Minority Students

 Students of unknown origin comprise 1.0% (86) of all undergraduate students

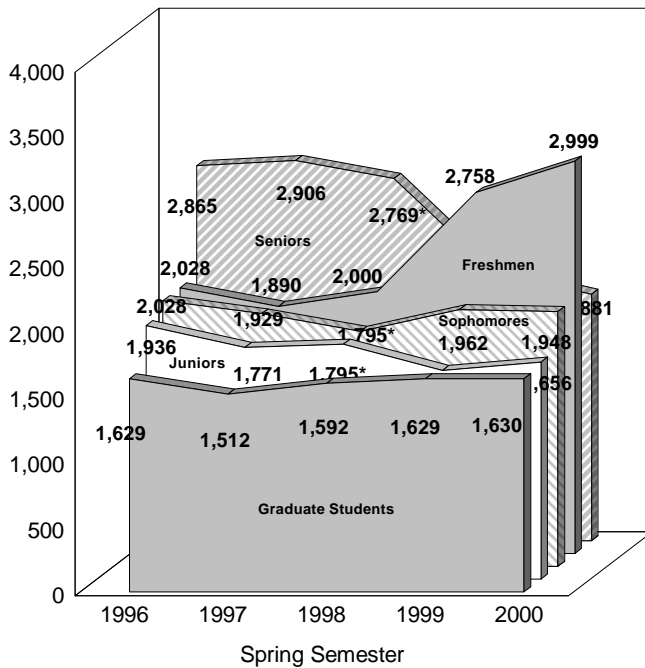
Graduate U.S. Minority Students



U.S. minority students comprise 10.6% (173) of all graduate students

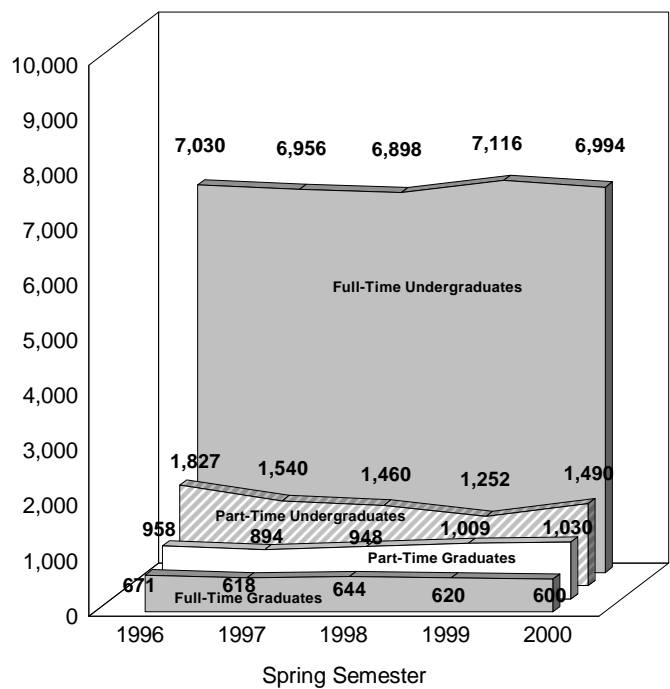
Caucasian students comprise 74.5% (1,215) of all graduate students
