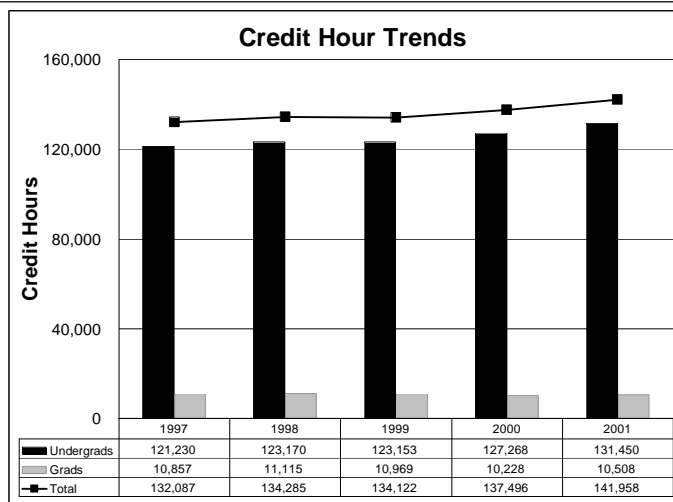
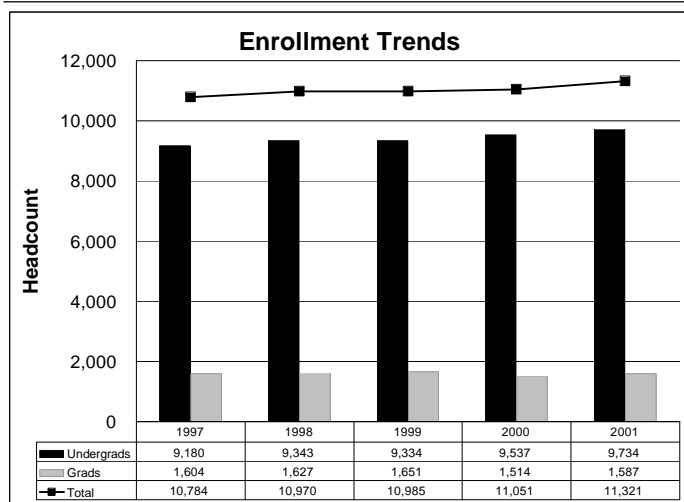

## HIGHLIGHTS

### ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM FALL 2000 TO FALL 2001

#### UNIVERSITY TOTALS

- Total enrollment increased by 270 students or 2.4%.
- Total undergraduate enrollment increased by 197 students or 2.1%.
- Total graduate student enrollment increased by 73 students or 4.8%.
- Total full-time equivalent (FTE)<sup>3</sup> students increased by 302.2 or 3.2%.

#### CLASSIFICATION<sup>4</sup>

- Freshman enrollment increased by 363 students or 8.4%.
- Sophomore enrollment decreased by 129 students or 6.9%.
- Junior enrollment decreased by 84 students or 5.0%.
- Senior enrollment increased by 47 students or 2.8%.

#### SCHOOL / COLLEGE

- Enrollment increased in Technology (77 students or 8.1%), Arts & Sciences (172 students or 5.0%), Graduate Studies (73 students or 4.8%), Nursing (15 students or 3.1%), Business (28 students or 2.2%), and Student Academic Services (10 students or 0.7%).
- Enrollment decreased in Non-Degree (61 students or 19.5%), Education (42 students or 4.1%), and Health & Human Performance (2 students or 0.3%).

#### U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS

- Total U.S. minority student enrollment increased by 51 students or 3.5%.
- Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 65 students or 5.0%.
- Graduate U.S. minority enrollment decreased by 14 students or 9.0%.

#### FULL-TIME STATUS<sup>5</sup>

- Full-time enrollment increased by 303 students or 3.5%.
- Full-time undergraduates increased by 307 students or 3.8%.
- Full-time graduate students decreased by 4 students or 0.7%.

#### PART-TIME STATUS<sup>5</sup>

- Part-time enrollment decreased by 33 students or 1.4%.
- Part-time undergraduates decreased by 110 students or 7.6%.
- Part-time graduate students increased by 77 students or 8.3%.

#### IN-STATE RESIDENTS

- In-state students increased by 152 students or 1.6%.
- In-state undergraduates increased by 218 students or 2.5%.
- In-state graduate students decreased by 66 students or 6.3%.

#### OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS

- Out-of-state students increased by 119 students or 12.7%.
- Out-of-state undergraduates increased by 16 students or 2.4%.
- Out-of-state graduate students increased by 103 student or 40.2%.

#### INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

- International students decreased by 1 students or 0.2%.
- International undergraduates decreased by 37 students or 15.0%.
- International graduate students increased by 36 students or 17.1%.

<sup>1</sup> The international count shown on Page 1 (456) is different from international counts shown on Page 3 (213+247=460), because Page 1 is based on country of origin at admission and Page 3 is based on ethnicity.

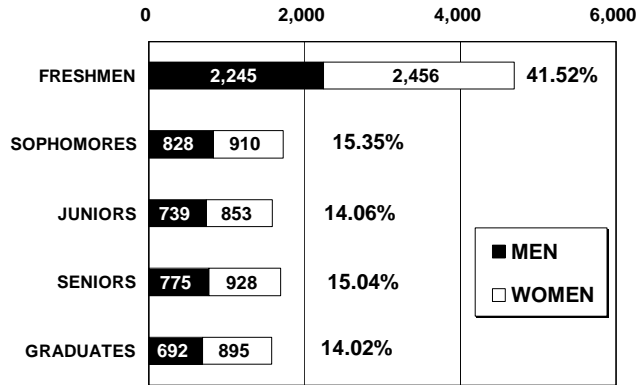

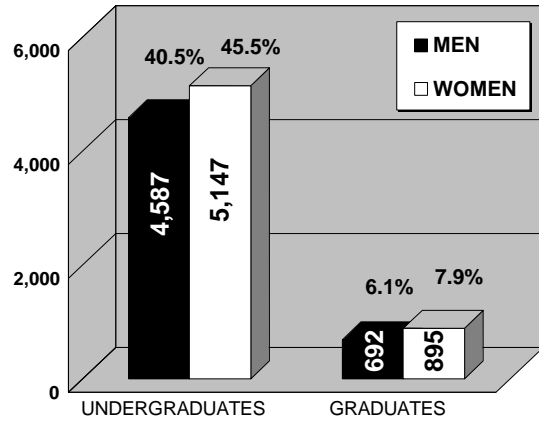

However, beginning Fall 1998, the calculation for classification is Earned Hours ONLY (Current Hours Enrolled are NOT included).

### Enrollment by Gender and Classification



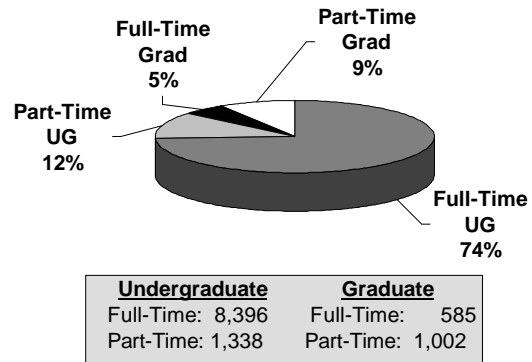
### Enrollment by Gender and Level



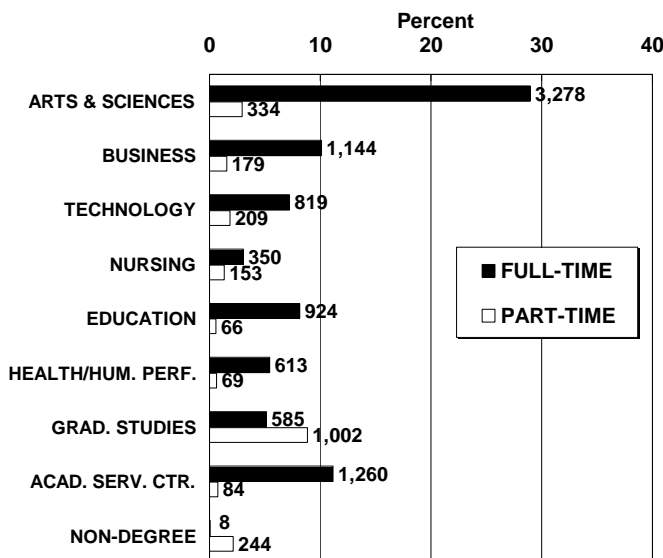

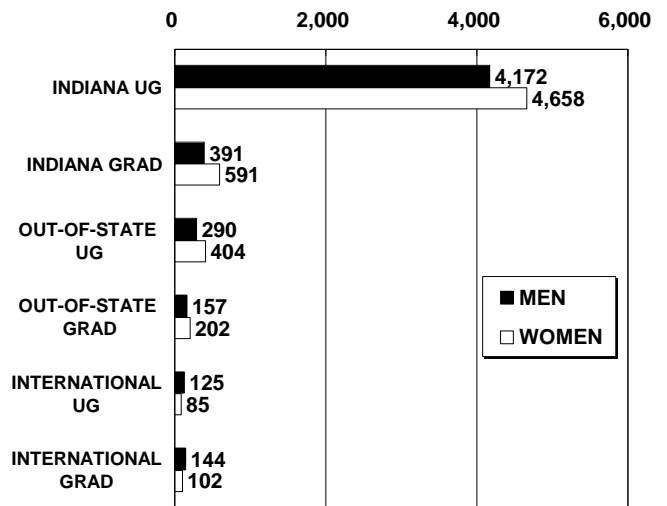
### Enrollment by Status and Level



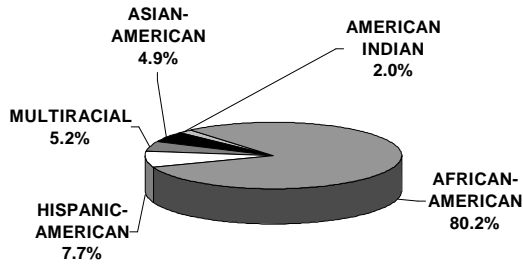
### Enrollment by Status and School/College



### Enrollment by Gender, Level, and Residency



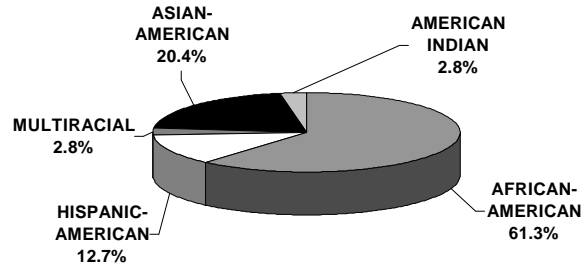

 Students of unknown origin comprise 128 (1.3%) of all undergraduate students

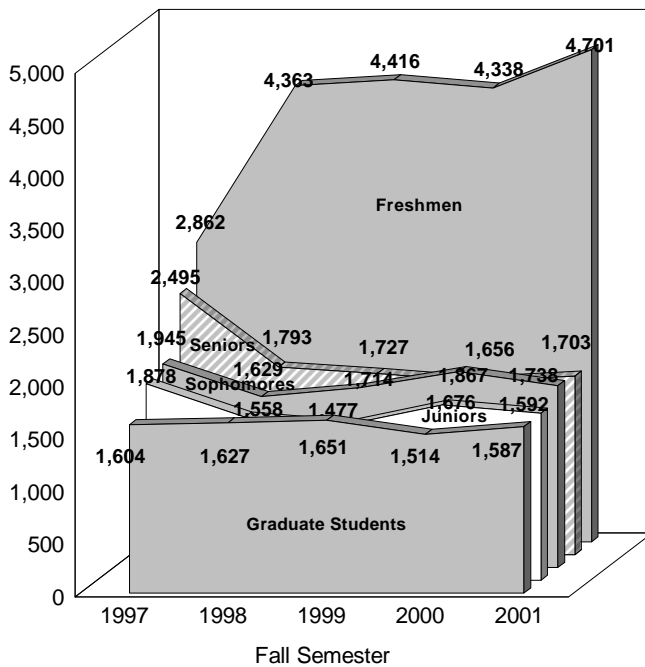
### Graduate U.S. Minority Students



**U.S. Minority Students comprise 142 (8.9%) of all graduate students**

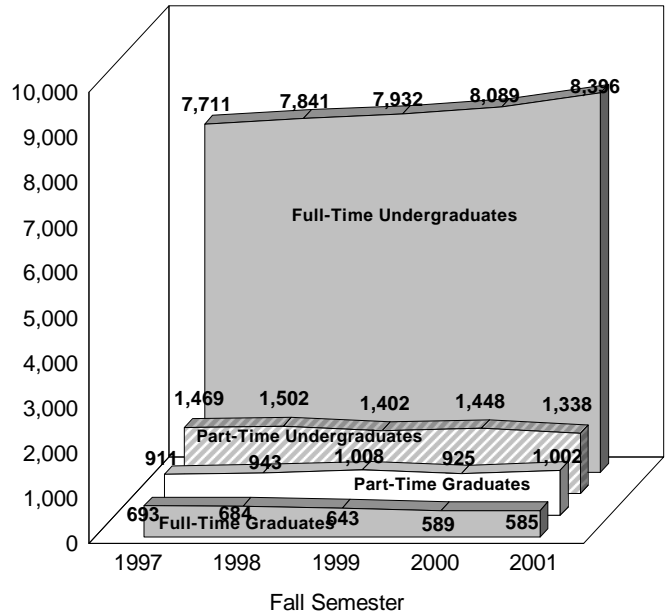
