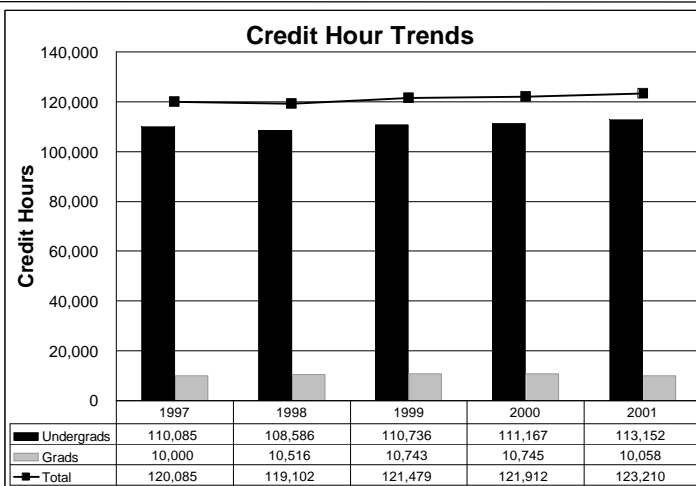
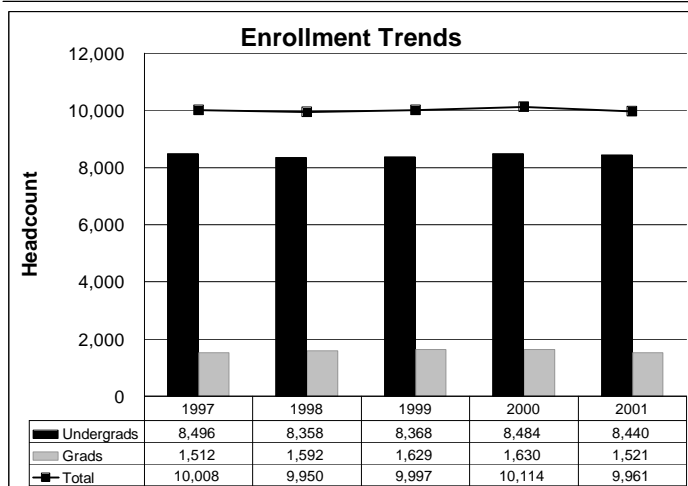

HIGHLIGHTS

ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM SPRING 2000 TO SPRING 2001

▶ UNIVERSITY TOTALS

- Total enrollment decreased by 153 students or 1.5%.
- Total undergraduate enrollment decreased by 44 students or 0.5%.
- Total graduate student enrollment decreased by 109 student or 6.7%.
- Total full-time equivalent (FTE)³ students increased by 75.0 or 0.9%.

▶ CLASSIFICATION⁴

- Freshman enrollment decreased by 90 students or 3.0%.
- Sophomore enrollment increased by 62 students or 3.2%.
- Junior enrollment decreased by 3 students or 0.2%.
- Senior enrollment decreased by 13 students or 0.7%.

▶ SCHOOL / COLLEGE⁵

- Enrollment increased in Student Academic Services (103 students or 10.6%), Technology (53 students or 6.3%), Nursing (21 students or 5.1%), Business 36 students or 3.1%), and Arts & Sciences (53 students, or 1.7%). Enrollment decreased in Non-Degree (249 students or 68.2%), Graduate Studies (109 students or 6.7%), Education (38 students or 4.2%), and Health and Human Performance (23 students or 3.4%)

▶ U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS

- Total U.S. minority student enrollment increased by 10 students or 0.8%.
- Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 30 students or 2.7%
- Graduate U.S. minority enrollment decreased by 20 students or 11.6%

▶ FULL-TIME STATUS⁶

- Full-time enrollment increased by 173 students or 2.3%.
- Full-time undergraduates increased by 201 students or 2.9%.
- Full-time graduate students decreased by 28 students or 4.7%.

▶ PART-TIME STATUS⁶

- Part-time enrollment decreased by 326 students or 12.9%.
- Part-time undergraduates decreased by 245 students or 16.4%.
- Part-time graduate students decreased by 81 students or 7.9%.

▶ IN-STATE RESIDENTS

- In-state students decreased by 192 students or 2.2%.
- In-state undergraduates decreased by 44 students or 0.6%.
- In-state graduate students decreased by 148 students or 12.6%.

▶ OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS

- Out-of-state students increased by 36 students or 4.3%.
- Out-of-state undergraduates increased by 23 student or 4.0%.
- Out-of-state graduate students increased by 13 students or 4.9%.

▶ INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

- International students increased by 3 students or 0.7%.
- International undergraduates decreased by 23 students or 9.3%.
- International graduate students increased by 26 students or 13.4%.

¹ International count shown on Page 1 (445) differs from international counts shown on Page 3 (230+223=453), because Page 1 is based on country of origin at admission and Page 3 is based on ethnicity.

² Average Age and Age by Level is based on 9,961 students for whom age data was available (100% of total enrollment).

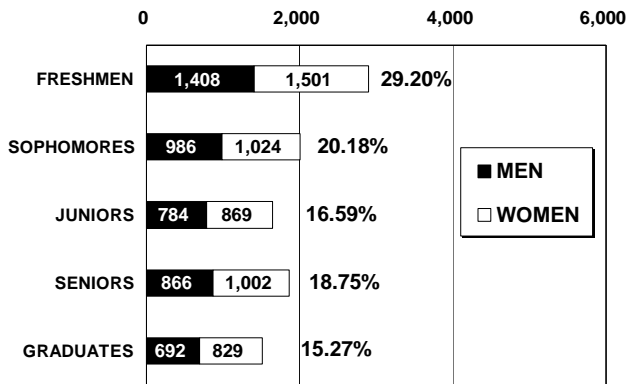
³ Total FTE Students = (Total Number of Undergraduate Credit Hours Enrolled / 15) + (Total Number of Graduate Credit Hours Enrolled / 12).

⁴ The calculation for classification (Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, Senior) was changed during the switchover to BANNER. Prior to Fall 1998, the calculation was Earned Hours + Current Hours Enrolled = Classification. However, beginning Fall 1998, the calculation for classification is Earned Hours ONLY (Current Hours Enrolled are NOT included).

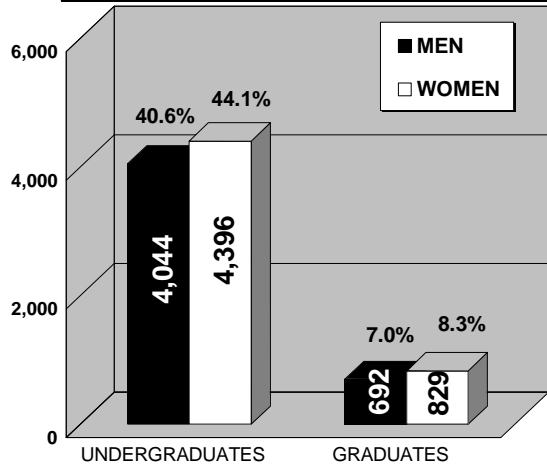

Enrollment by Gender and Classification



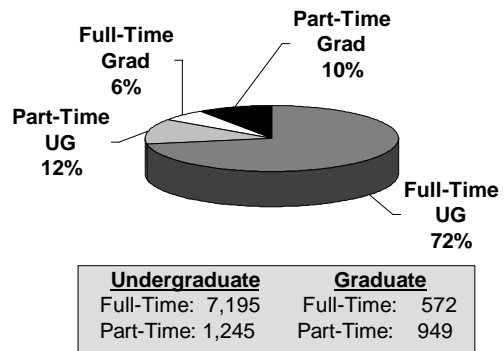
Enrollment by Gender and Level



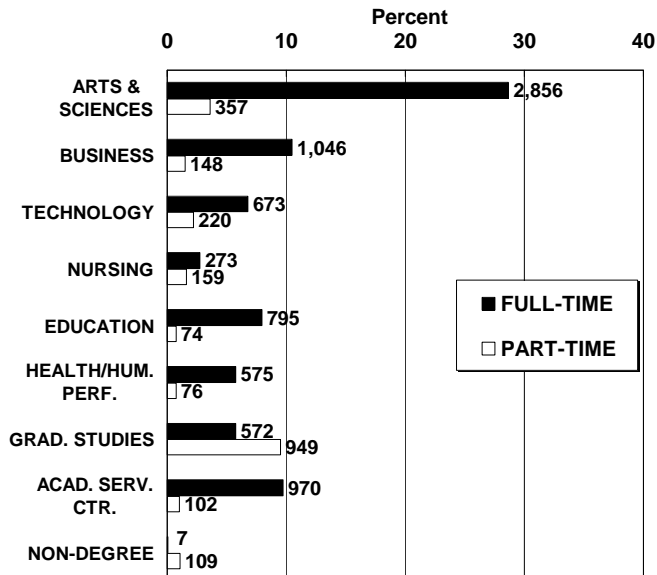

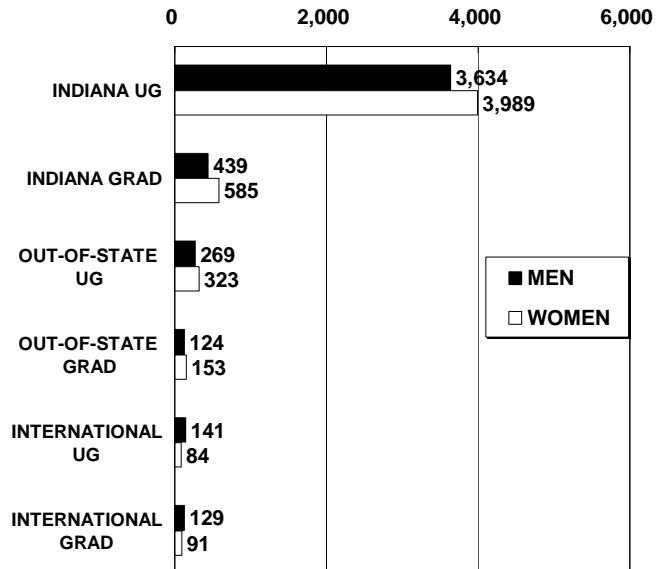
Enrollment by Status and Level



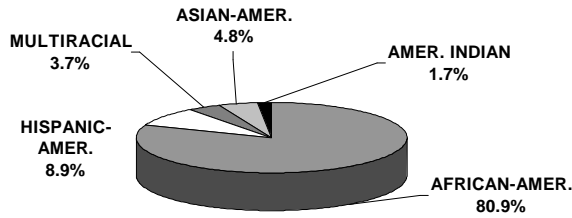
Enrollment by Status and School/College



Enrollment by Gender, Level, and Residency



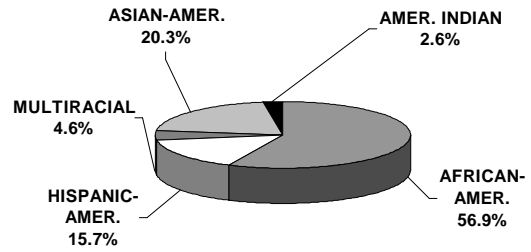
Undergraduate U.S. Minority Students

 Students of unknown origin comprise 1.1% (89) of all undergraduate students

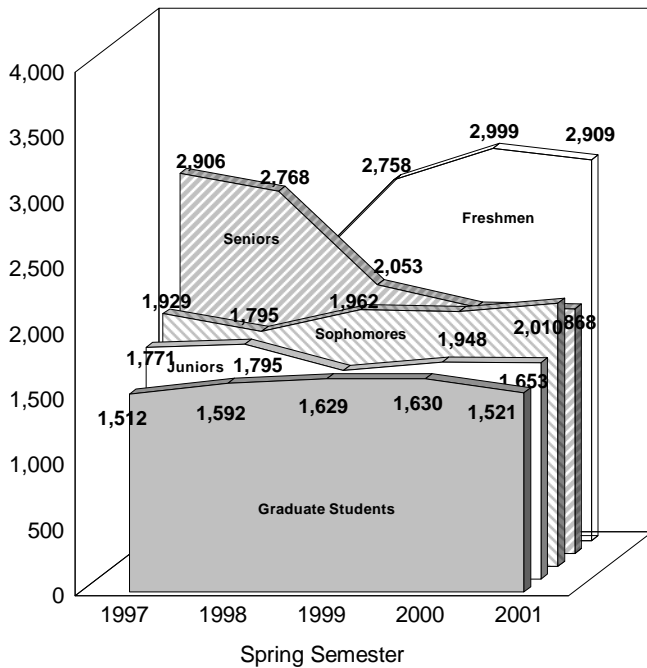
Graduate U.S. Minority Students



U.S. minority students comprise 10.1% (153) of all graduate students

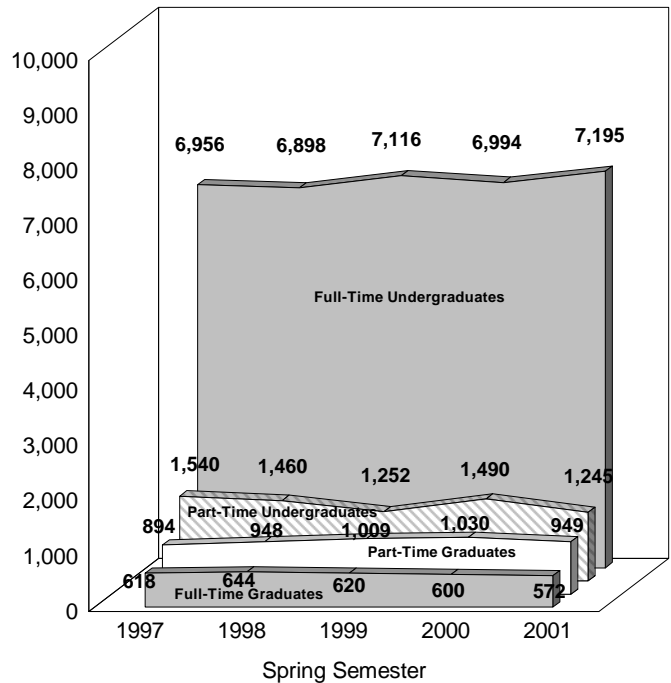
Caucasian students comprise 73.9% (1,124) of all graduate students
