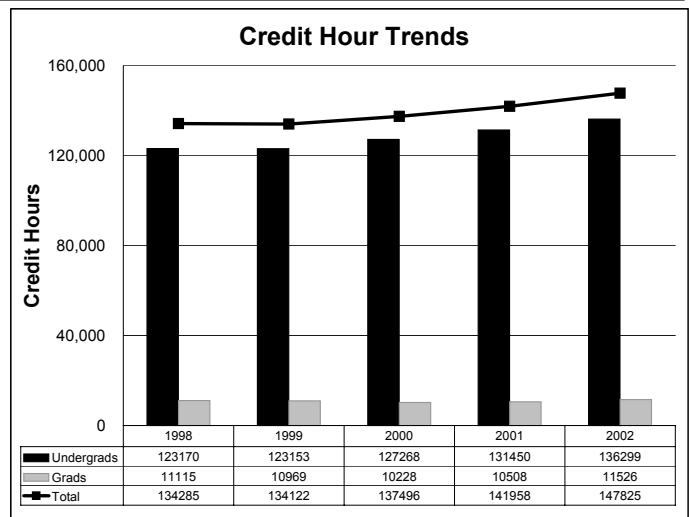
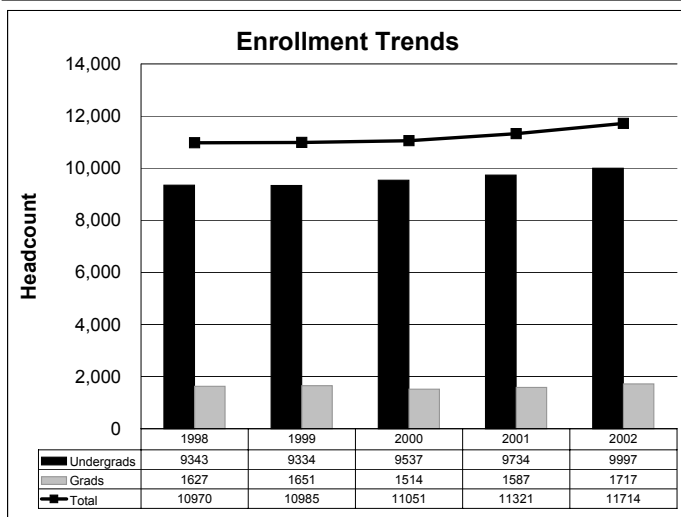

## HIGHLIGHTS

### ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM FALL 2001 TO FALL 2002

► **UNIVERSITY TOTALS**

- Total enrollment increased by 393 students or 3.5%.
- Total undergraduate enrollment increased by 263 students or 2.7%.
- Total graduate student enrollment increased by 130 students or 8.2%.
- Total full-time equivalent (FTE)<sup>3</sup> students increased by 408.1 or 4.2%.

► **CLASSIFICATION<sup>4</sup>**

- Freshman enrollment decreased by 74 students or 1.6%.
- Sophomore enrollment increased by 175 students or 10.1%.
- Junior enrollment increased by 67 students or 4.2%.
- Senior enrollment increased by 95 students or 5.6%.

► **SCHOOL / COLLEGE**

Enrollment increased in Non-Degree (129 students or 51.2%), Graduate Studies (130 students or 8.2%), Health & Human Performance (49 students or 7.2%), Technology (73 students or 7.1%), Arts & Sciences (253 students or 7.0%), and Nursing (32 students or 6.4%). Enrollment decreased in Education (8 students or 0.8%) and Academic Services (265 students or 19.7%). There was no increase or decrease in Business.

► **U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS**

- Total U.S. minority student enrollment increased by 80 students or 5.3%.
- Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 58 students or 4.3%.
- Graduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 22 students or 15.5%.

► **FULL-TIME STATUS<sup>5</sup>**

- Full-time enrollment increased by 227 students or 2.5%.
- Full-time undergraduates increased by 153 students or 1.8%.
- Full-time graduate students increased by 74 students or 12.6%.

► **PART-TIME STATUS<sup>5</sup>**

- Part-time enrollment increased by 166 students or 7.1%.
- Part-time undergraduates increased by 110 students or 8.2%.
- Part-time graduate students increased by 56 students or 5.6%.

► **IN-STATE RESIDENTS**

- In-state students increased by 279 students or 2.8%.
- In-state undergraduates increased by 243 students or 2.8%.
- In-state graduate students increased by 36 students or 3.7%.

► **OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS**

- Out-of-state students increased by 105 students or 10.0%.
- Out-of-state undergraduates increased by 50 students or 7.2%.
- Out-of-state graduate students increased by 55 student or 15.3%.

► **INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS**

- International students increased by 9 students or 2.0%.
- International undergraduates decreased by 30 students or 14.3%.
- International graduate students increased by 39 students or 15.9%.

<sup>1</sup> The international count shown on Page 1 (465) is different from international counts shown on Page 3 (186+298=484), because Page 1 is based on country of origin at admission and Page 3 is based on ethnicity.

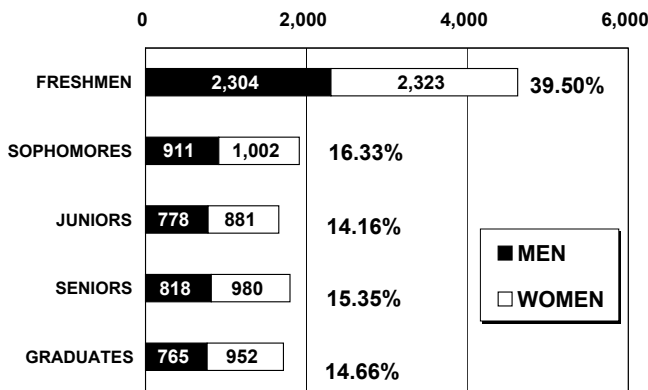

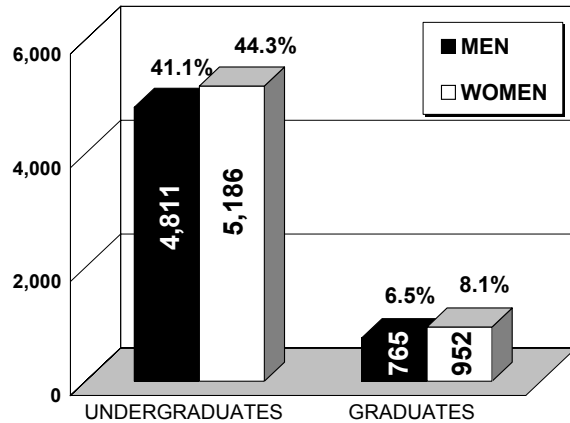

Prior to Fall 1988, the calculation was Earned Hours + Current Hours Enrolled = Classification. However, beginning Fall 1998, the calculation for classification is Earned Hours ONLY (Current Hours Enrolled are NOT included).

<sup>5</sup> FULL-TIME: enrolled for 12 or more hours (Undergraduate), 9 or more hours (Graduate); PART-TIME: enrolled for less than 12 hours (Undergraduate), less than 9 hours (Graduate).

### Enrollment by Gender and Classification



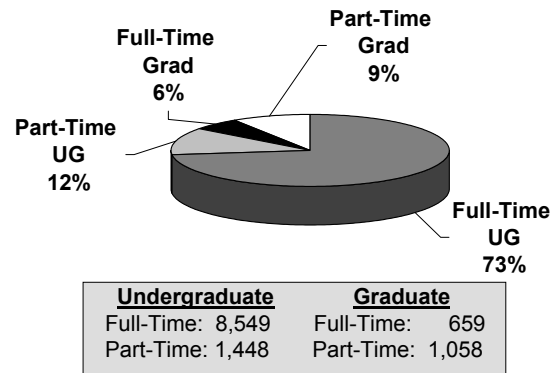
### Enrollment by Gender and Level



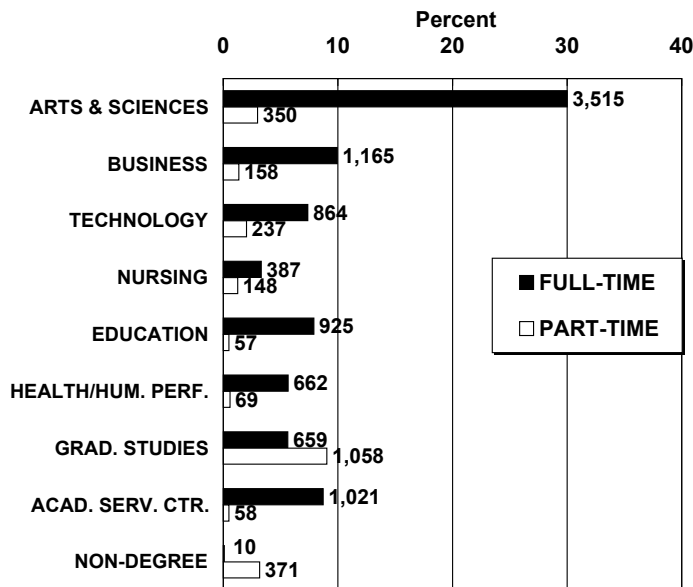

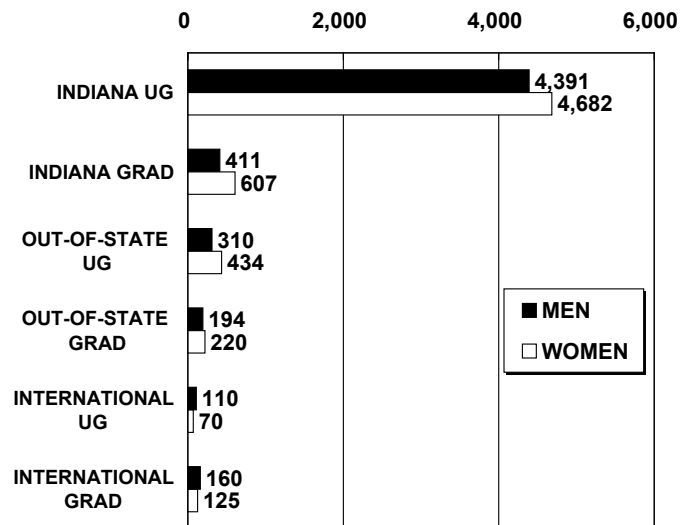
### Enrollment by Status and Level



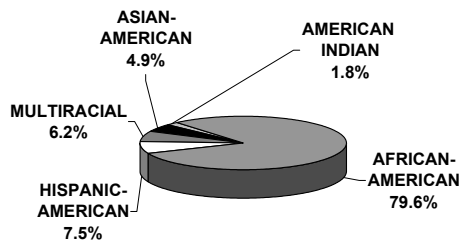
### Enrollment by Status and School/College



### Enrollment by Gender, Level, and Residency



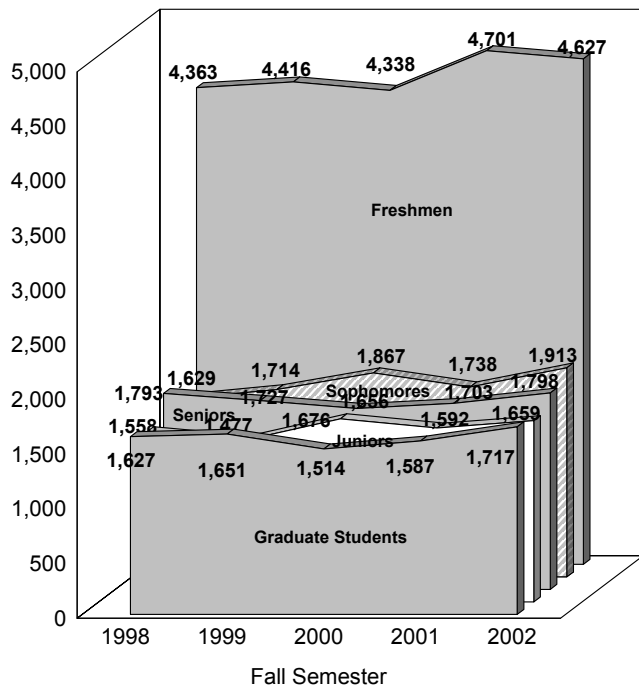
### Undergraduate U.S. Minority Students

### Enrollment Trends by Classification



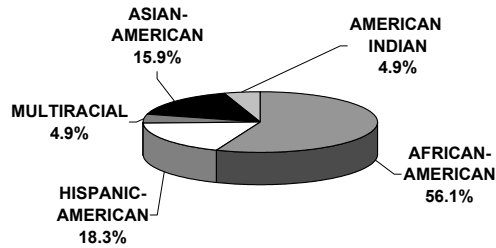

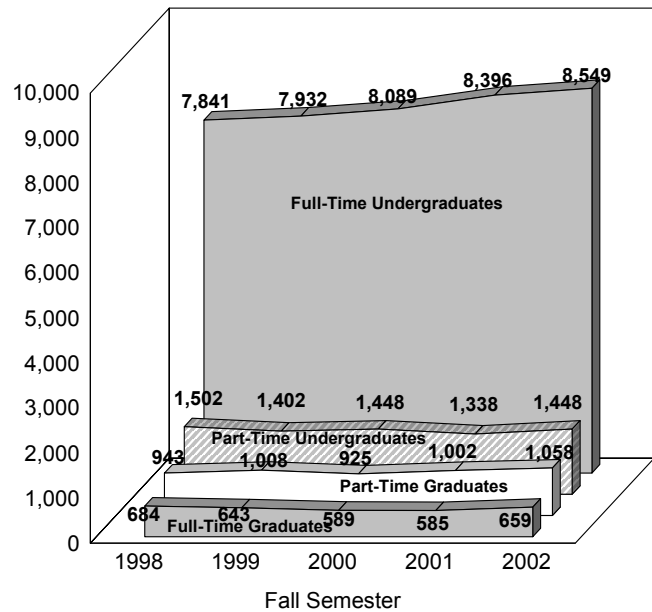
### Graduate U.S. Minority Students
