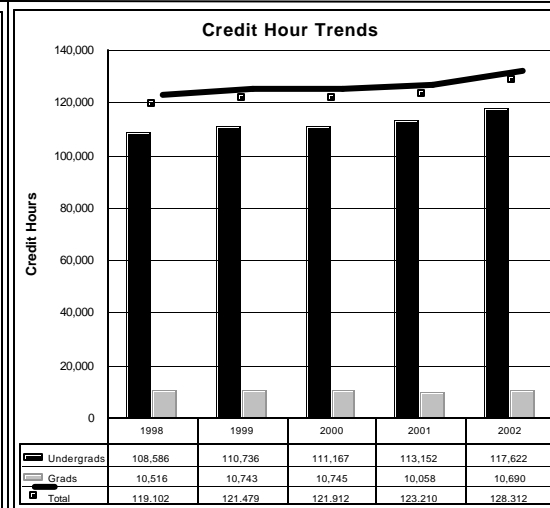
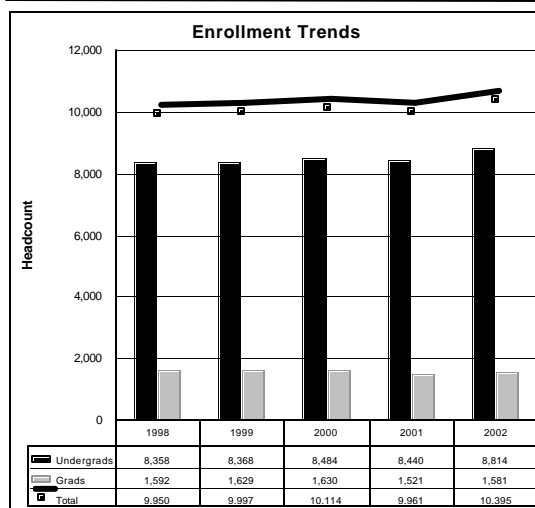

HIGHLIGHTS

ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM SPRING 2001 TO SPRING 2002

- ▶ **UNIVERSITY TOTALS**
 - Total enrollment increased by 434 students or 4.4%.
 - Total undergraduate enrollment increased by 374 students or 4.4%.
 - Total graduate student enrollment increased by 60 student or 3.9%.
 - Total full-time equivalent (FTE)³ students increased by 350.7 or 4.2%.
- ▶ **CLASSIFICATION⁴**
 - Freshman enrollment increased by 199 students or 6.8%.
 - Sophomore enrollment increased by 47 students or 2.3%.
 - Junior enrollment increased by 67 students or 4.1%.
 - Senior enrollment increased by 61 students or 3.3%.
- ▶ **SCHOOL / COLLEGE⁵**
 - Enrollment decreased in Student Academic Services (87 students or 8.1%).
 - Enrollment increased in Non-Degree (210 students or 181.0%), Arts & Sciences (115 students or 3.6%), Technology (65 students or 7.3%), Graduate Studies (60 students or 3.9%), Business (42 students or 3.5%), Health & Human Performance (16 students or 2.5%), Nursing (7 students or 1.6%), and Education (6 students or 0.7%).
- ▶ **U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS**
 - Total U.S. minority student enrollment increased by 60 students or 4.7%.
 - Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 72 students or 6.4%.
 - Graduate U.S. minority enrollment decreased by 12 students or 7.8%.
- ▶ **FULL-TIME STATUS⁶**
 - Full-time enrollment increased by 234 students or 3.0%.
 - Full-time undergraduates increased by 208 students or 2.9%.
 - Full-time graduate students increased by 26 students or 4.5%.
- ▶ **PART-TIME STATUS⁶**
 - Part-time enrollment increased by 200 students or 9.1%.
 - Part-time undergraduates increased by 166 students or 13.3%.
 - Part-time graduate students increased by 34 students or 3.6%.
- ▶ **IN-STATE RESIDENTS**
 - In-state students increased by 284 students or 3.3%.
 - In-state undergraduates increased by 355 students or 4.7%.
 - In-state graduate students decreased by 71 students or 6.9%.
- ▶ **OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS**
 - Out-of-state students increased by 132 students or 15.2%.
 - Out-of-state undergraduates increased by 50 student or 8.5%.
 - Out-of-state graduate students increased by 82 students or 29.6%.
- ▶ **INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS**
 - International students increased by 18 students or 4.0%.
 - International undergraduates decreased by 31 students or 13.8%.
 - International graduate students increased by 49 students or 22.3%.

¹ International count shown on Page 1 (463) differs from international counts shown on Page 3 (198+272=470), because Page 1 is based on country of origin at admission and Page 3 is based on ethnicity.

² Average Age and Age by Level is based on 10,373 students for whom age data was available (99.79% of total enrollment).

³ Total FTE Students = (Total Number of Undergraduate Credit Hours Enrolled / 15) + (Total Number of Graduate Credit Hours Enrolled / 12).

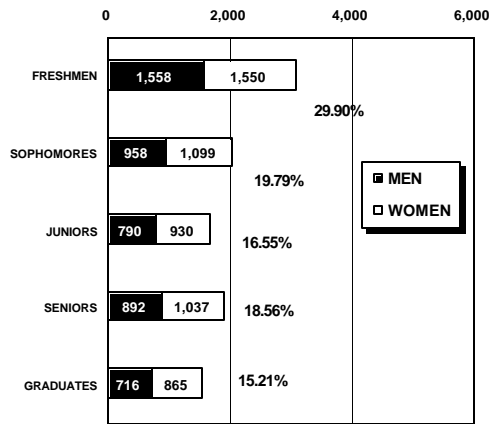

Enrolled = Classification. However, beginning Fall 1998, the calculation for classification is Earned Hours ONLY (Current Hours Enrolled are NOT included).

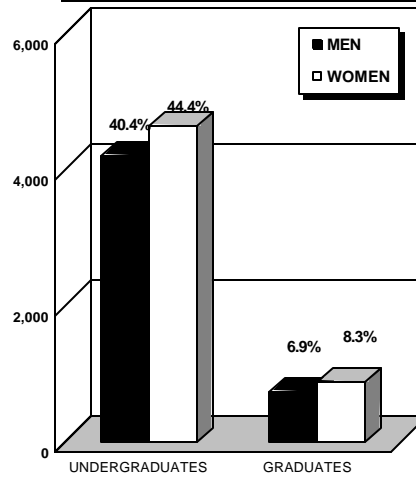

Enrollment by Gender and Classification



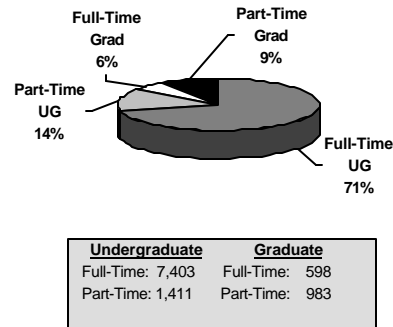
Enrollment by Gender and Level



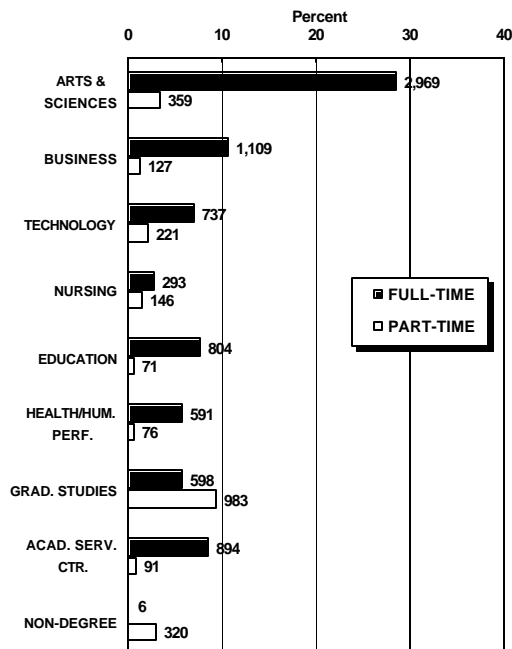

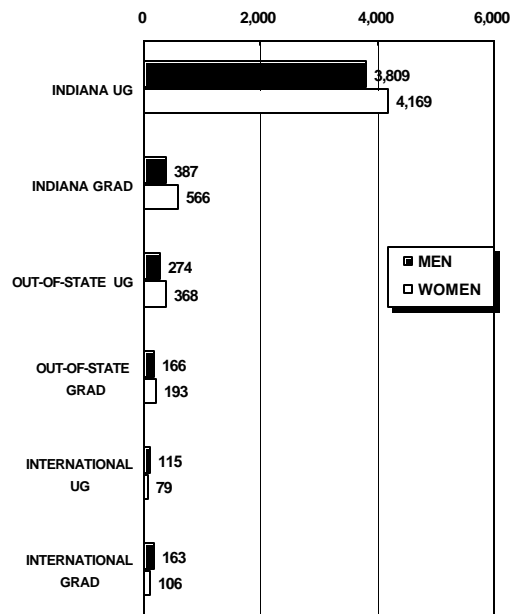
Enrollment by Status and Level



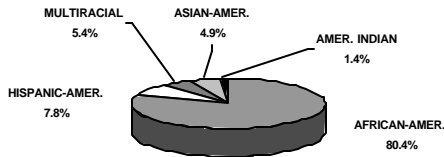
Enrollment by Status and School/College



Enrollment by Gender, Level, and Residency



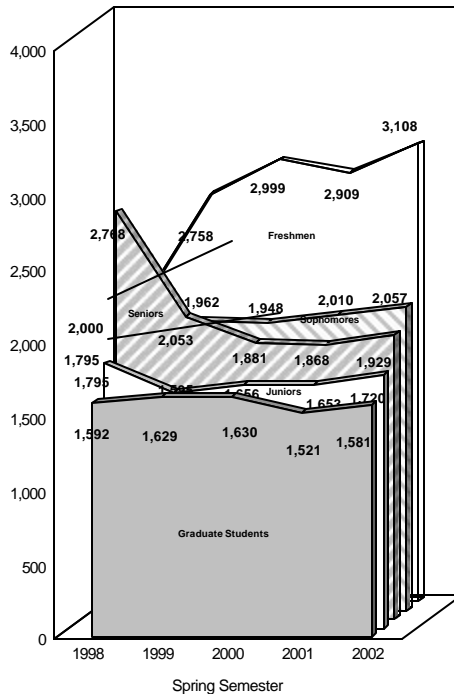
Undergraduate U.S. Minority Students

Enrollment Trends by Classification

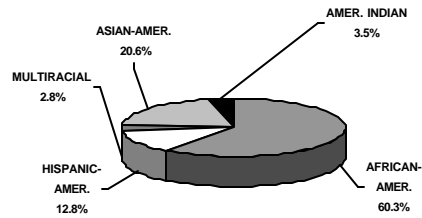

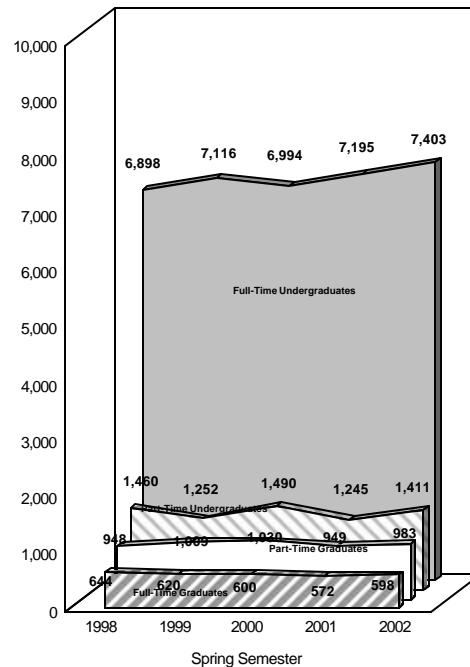
Graduate U.S. Minority Students
