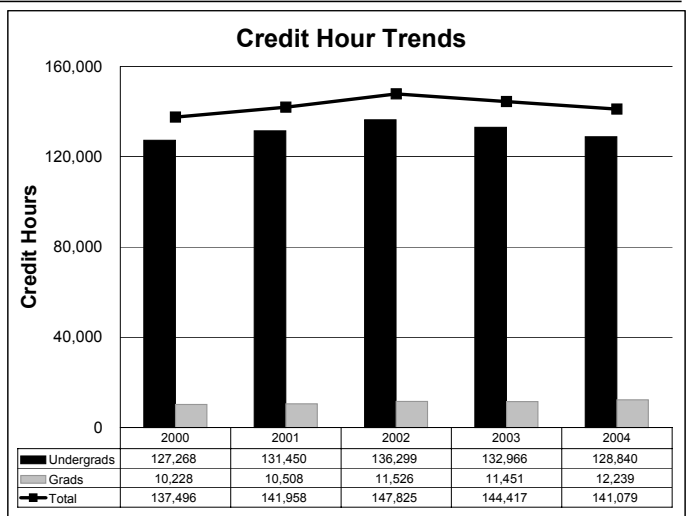
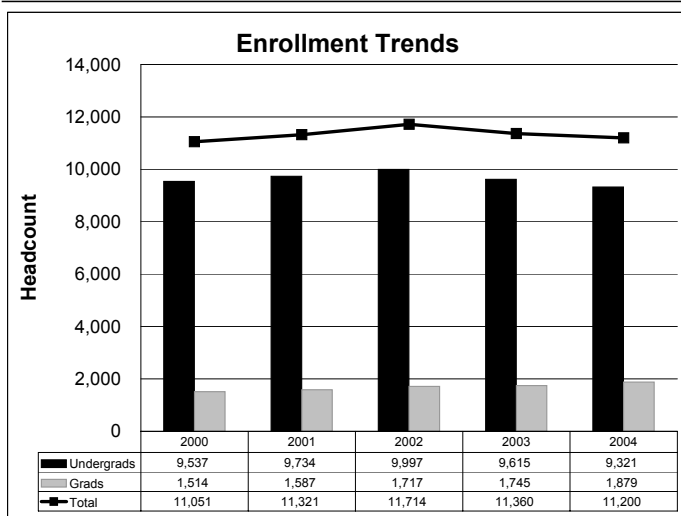

HIGHLIGHTS

ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM FALL 2003 TO FALL 2004

► **UNIVERSITY TOTALS**

- Total enrollment decreased by 160 students or 1.4%
- Total undergraduate enrollment decreased by 294 students or 3.1%
- Total graduate student enrollment increased by 134 students or 7.7%
- Total full-time equivalent (FTE)³ students decreased by 209.4 or 2.1%

► **CLASSIFICATION⁴**

- Freshman enrollment decreased by 644 students or 15.5%
- Sophomore enrollment increased by 153 students or 8.2%
- Junior enrollment increased by 113 students or 6.4%
- Senior enrollment increased by 84 students or 4.5%

► **COLLEGE**

- Enrollment increased in Graduate Studies (134 students or 7.7%), Non-Degree (15 students or 6.8%), and in Nursing (13 students or 2.6%).
- Enrollment decreased in Student Academic Services (146 students or 13.8%), Arts & Sciences (59 students or 1.5%), Education (57 students or 6.3%), Health & Human Performance (46 students or 6.1%), and in Technology (14 students or 1.3%).
- There was no increase or decrease in Business.

► **U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS**

- Total U.S. minority student enrollment increased by 82 students or 5.2%
- Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 42 students or 3.0%
- Graduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 40 students or 20.7%

► **FULL-TIME STATUS⁵**

- Full-time enrollment decreased by 267 students or 2.9%
- Full-time undergraduates decreased by 295 students or 3.5%
- Full-time graduate students increased by 28 students or 4.3%

► **PART-TIME STATUS⁵**

- Part-time enrollment increased by 107 students or 4.7%
- Part-time undergraduates increased by 1 student or 0.1%
- Part-time graduate students increased by 106 students or 9.6%

► **IN-STATE RESIDENTS**

- In-state students decreased by 207 students or 2.1%
- In-state undergraduates decreased by 263 students or 3.0%
- In-state graduate students increased by 56 students or 5.3%

► **OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS**

- Out-of-state students increased by 56 students or 4.6%
- Out-of-state undergraduates decreased by 26 students or 3.3%
- Out-of-state graduate students increased by 82 student or 19.4%

► **INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS**

- International students decreased by 9 students or 2.1%
- International undergraduates decreased by 5 students or 3.0%
- International graduate students decreased by 4 students or 1.5%

¹ The international count shown on Page 1 (427) is different from the international count shown on Page 3 (151+251=402), because Page 1 is based on country of origin at admission and Page 3 is based on ethnicity.

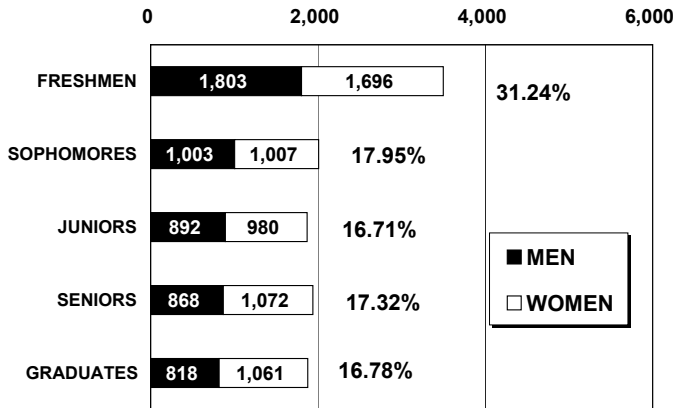

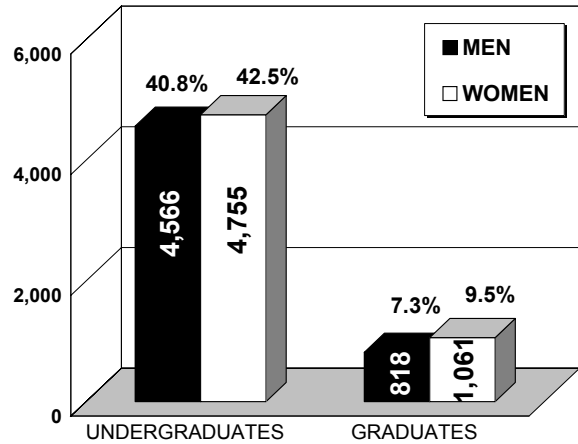

Enrollment by Gender and Classification



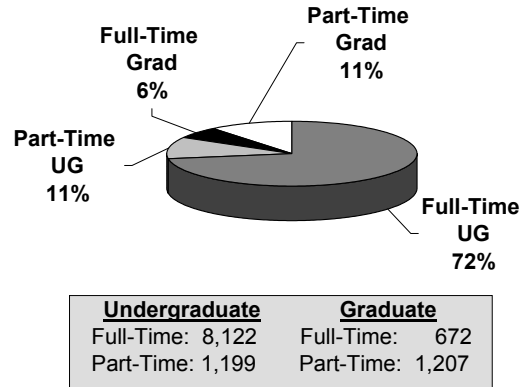
Enrollment by Gender and Level



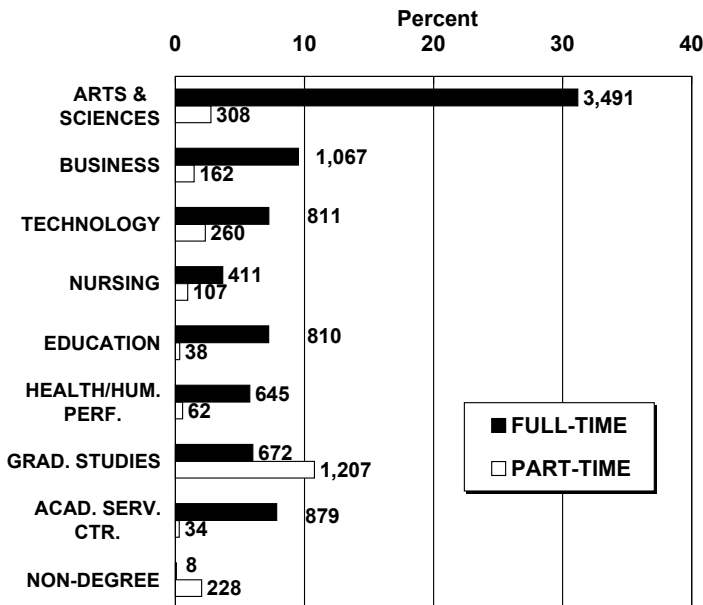

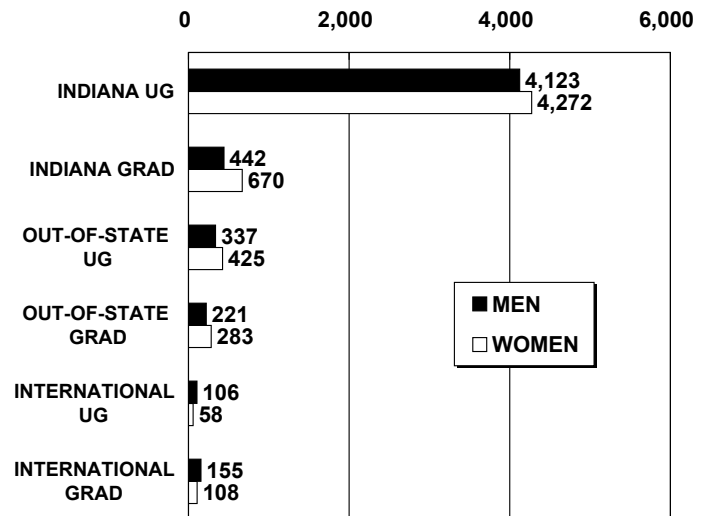
Enrollment by Status and Level



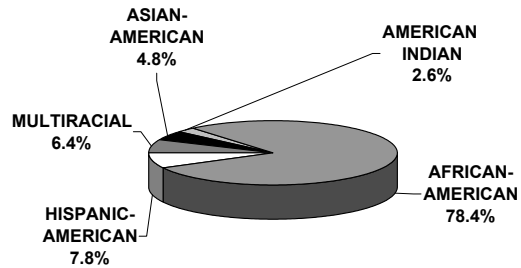
Enrollment by Status and College



Enrollment by Gender, Level, and Residency



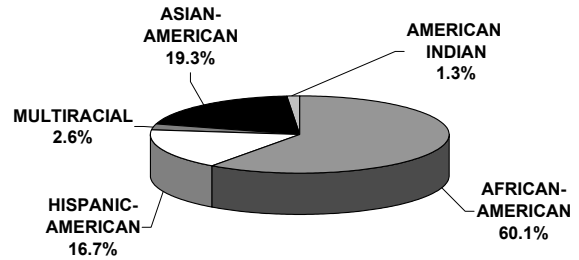

 Students of unknown origin comprise 155 (1.7%) of all undergraduate students

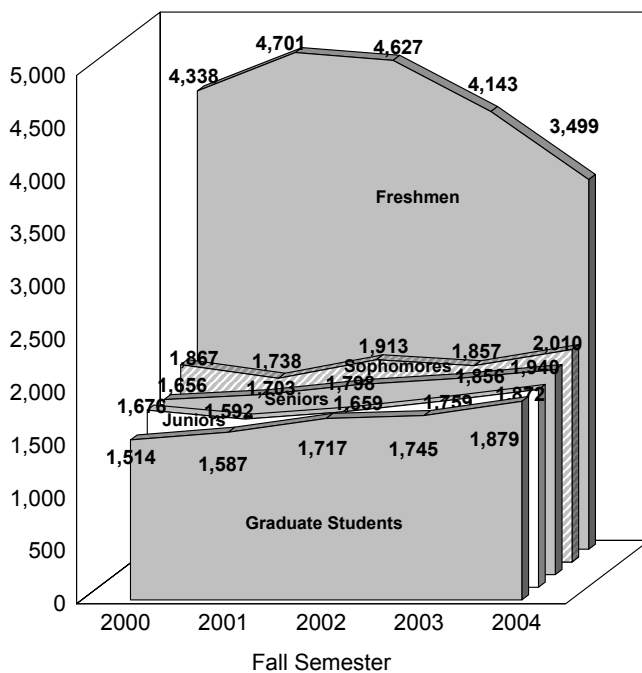
Graduate U.S. Minority Students



U.S. Minority Students comprise 233 (12.4%) of all graduate students

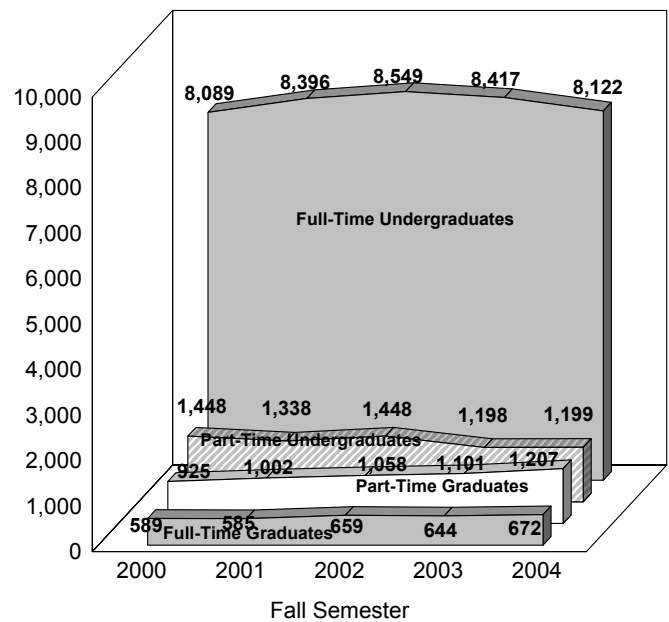
Caucasian students comprise 1,329 (70.7 %) of all graduate students
