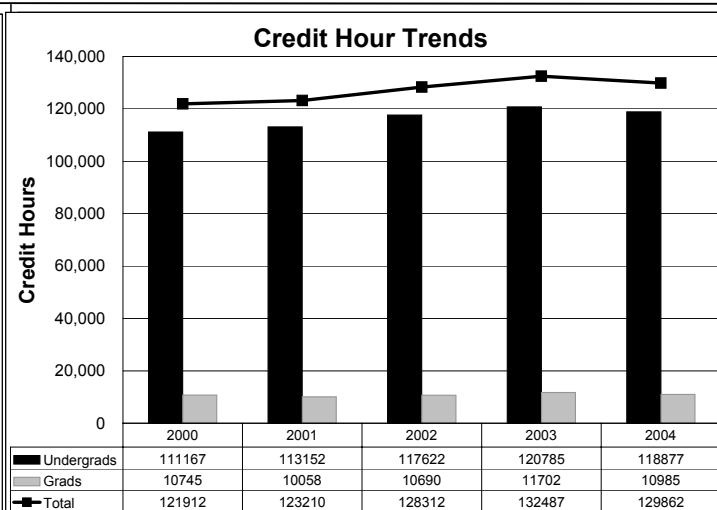
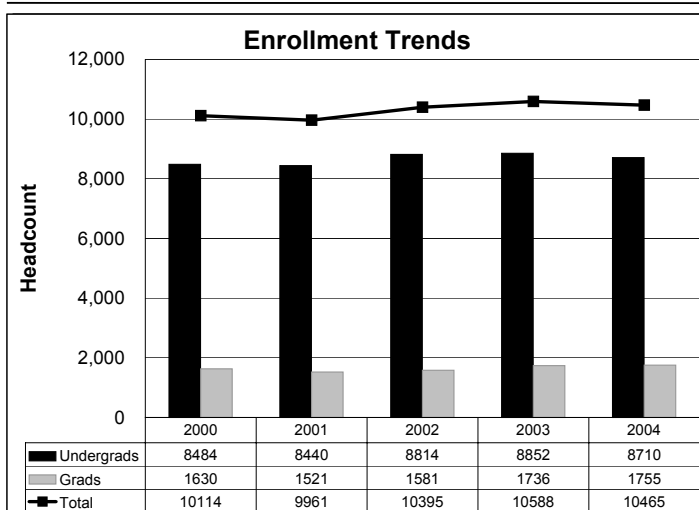

HIGHLIGHTS

ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM SPRING 2002 TO SPRING 2003

UNIVERSITY TOTALS

- Total enrollment decreased by 123 students or 1.2%.
- Total undergraduate enrollment decreased by 142 students or 1.6%.
- Total graduate student enrollment increased by 19 students or 1.1%.
- Total full-time equivalent (FTE)³ students decreased by 186.9 or 2.1%.

CLASSIFICATION⁴

- Freshman enrollment decreased by 245 students or 8.4%.
- Sophomore enrollment decreased by 13 students or 0.6%.
- Junior enrollment decreased by 72 students or 3.7%.
- Senior enrollment increased by 188 students or 9.7%.

SCHOOL / COLLEGE⁵

- Enrollment increased in Arts & Sciences (20 students or 0.6%), Health & Human Performance (20 students or 2.9%), Graduate Studies (19 students or 1.1%), and Technology (4 students or 0.4%).
- Enrollment decreased in Student Academic Services (58 students or 7.1%), Education (40 students or 4.7%), Nursing (37 students or 7.8%), Non-Degree (32 students or 11.0%) and Business (19 students or 1.6%).

U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS

- Total U.S. minority student enrollment increased by 71 students or 5.0%.
- Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 37 students or 3.0%.
- Graduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 34 students or 20.7%.

FULL-TIME STATUS⁶

- Full-time enrollment decreased by 204 students or 2.5%.
- Full-time undergraduates decreased by 133 students or 1.7%.
- Full-time graduate students decreased by 71 students or 10.8%.

PART-TIME STATUS⁶

- Part-time enrollment increased by 81 students or 3.5%.
- Part-time undergraduates decreased by 9 students or 0.7%.
- Part-time graduate students increased by 90 students or 8.4%.

IN-STATE RESIDENTS

- In-state students decreased by 145 students or 1.6%.
- In-state undergraduates decreased by 189 students or 2.4%.
- In-state graduate students increased by 44 students or 4.3%.

OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS

- Out-of-state students increased by 57 students or 5.2%.
- Out-of-state undergraduates increased by 46 students or 7.0%.
- Out-of-state graduate students increased by 11 students or 2.5%.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

- International students decreased by 35 students or 7.9%.
- International undergraduates increased by 1 student or 0.6%.
- International graduate students decreased by 36 students or 12.9%.

¹ International count shown on Page 1 (408) differs from international counts shown on Page 3 (156+240=396), because Page 1 is based on country of origin at admission and Page 3 is based on ethnicity.

² Average Age and Age by Level is based on 10,459 students for whom age data was available (99.9% of total enrollment).

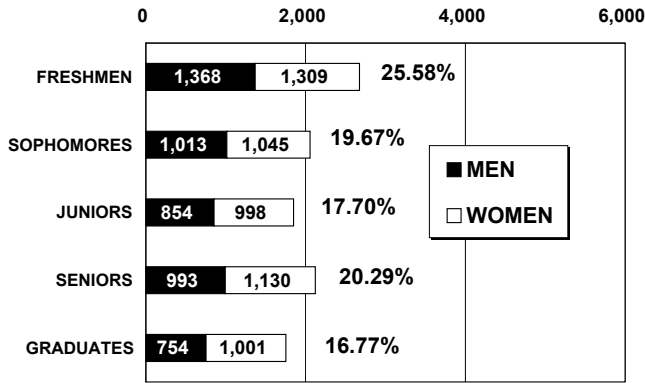

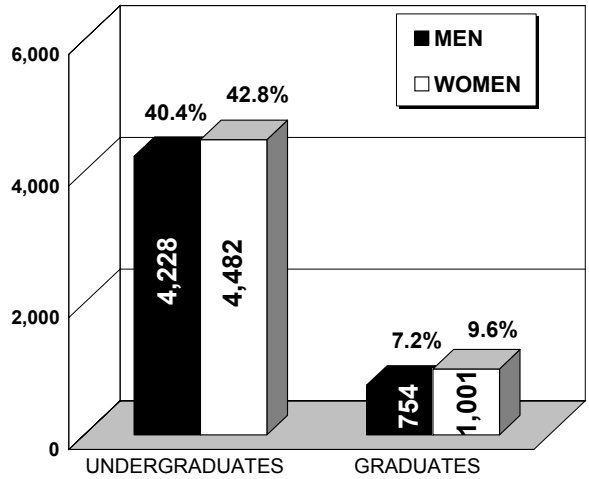

Enrollment by Gender and Classification



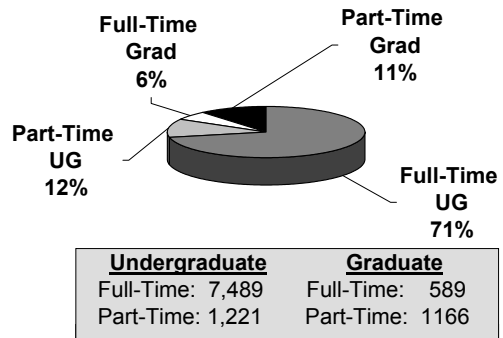
Enrollment by Gender and Level



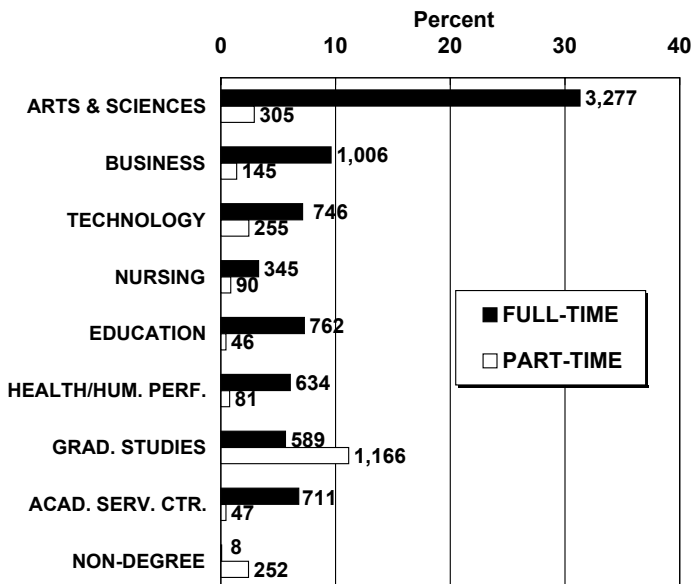

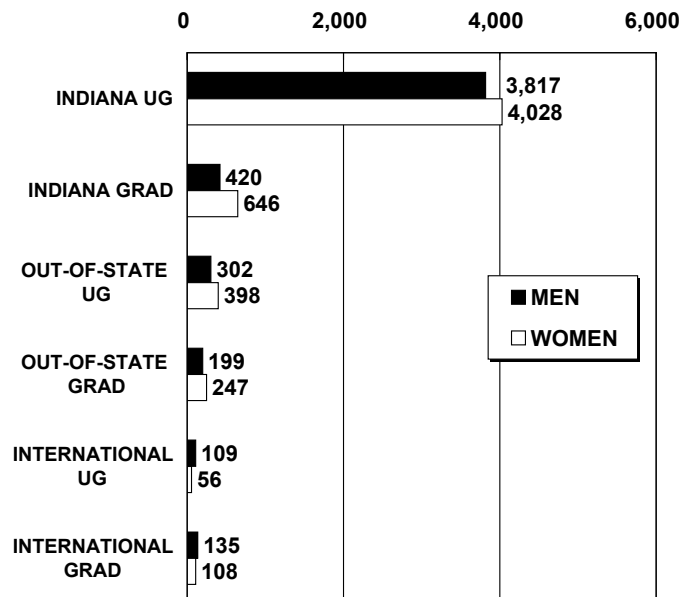
Enrollment by Status and Level



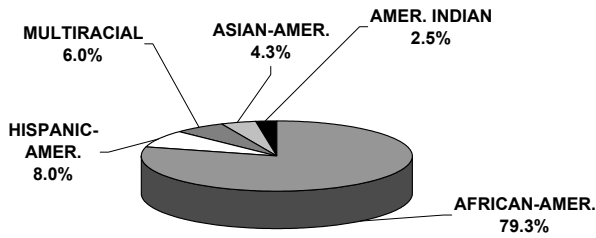
Enrollment by Status and School/College



Enrollment by Gender, Level, and Residency



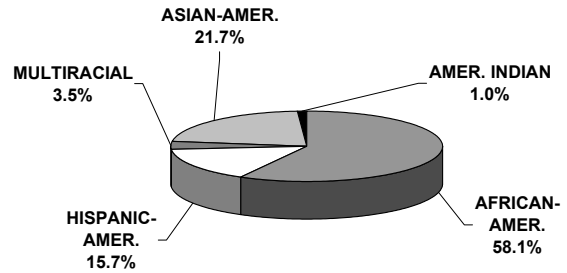

 Students of unknown origin comprise 1.3% (110) of all undergraduate students

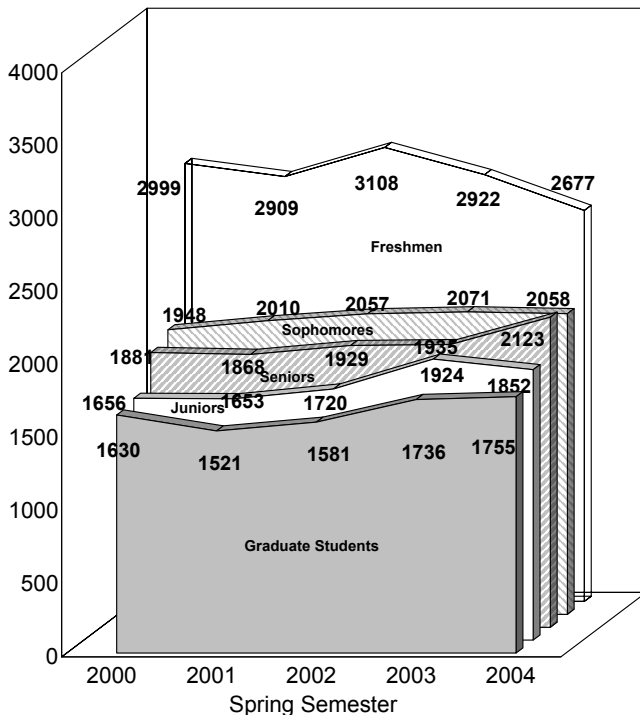
Graduate U.S. Minority Students



U.S. minority students comprise 11.3% (198) of all graduate students

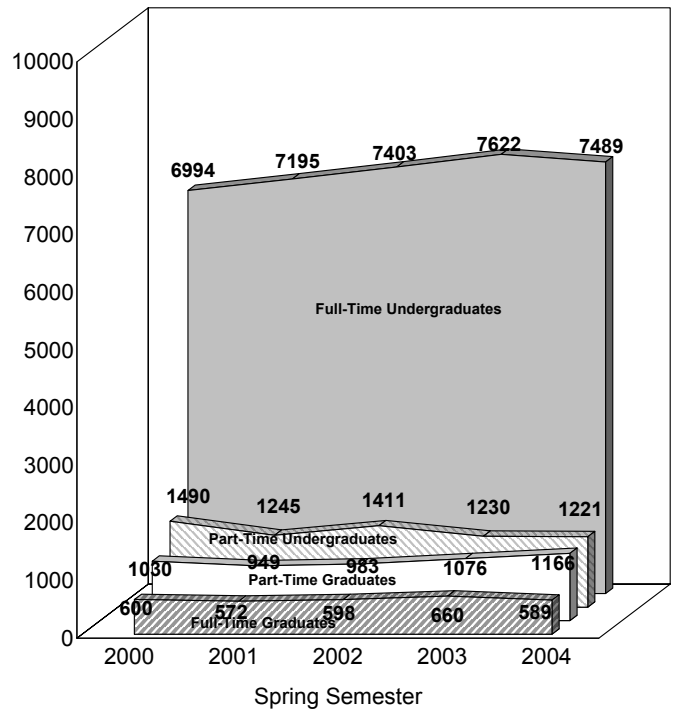
Caucasian students comprise 72.0% (1,264) of all graduate students
