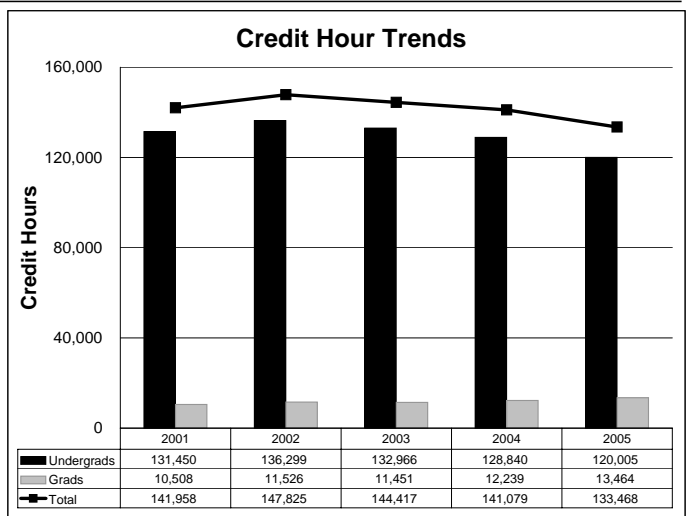
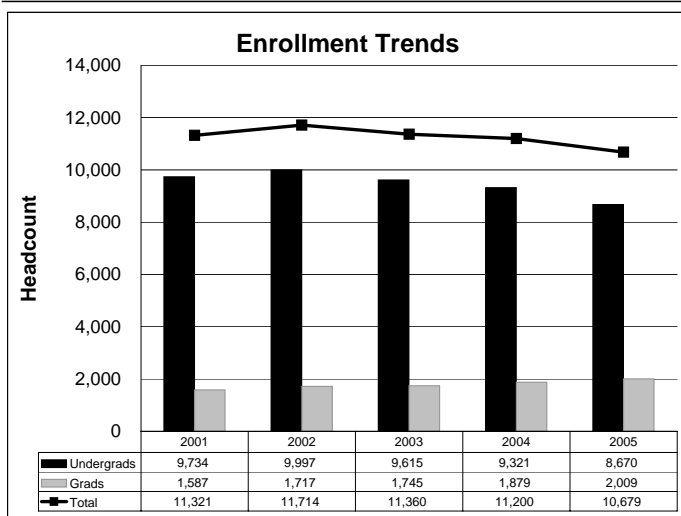

## HIGHLIGHTS

### ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM FALL 2004 TO FALL 2005

► **UNIVERSITY TOTALS**

- Total enrollment decreased by 521 students or 4.7%
- Total undergraduate enrollment decreased by 651 students or 7.0%
- Total graduate student enrollment increased by 130 students or 6.9%
- Total full-time equivalent (FTE)<sup>3</sup> students decreased by 487 or 5.1%

► **CLASSIFICATION<sup>4</sup>**

- Freshman enrollment decreased by 206 students or 5.9%
- Sophomore enrollment decreased by 312 students or 15.5%
- Junior enrollment decreased by 141 students or 7.5%
- Senior enrollment increased by 8 students or 0.4%

► **COLLEGE**

- Enrollment increased in Graduate Studies (130 students or 6.9%).
- Enrollment decreased in Arts & Sciences (248 students or 6.5%), Non Degree (97 students or 41.1%), Technology (92 students or 8.6%), Education (82 students or 9.7%), Student Academic Services (46 students or 5.0%), Health & Human Performance (40 students or 5.7%), Business (36 students or 2.9%), and in Nursing (10 students or 1.9%).

► **U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS**

- Total U.S. minority student enrollment decreased by 82 students or 4.9%.
- Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment decreased by 122 students or 8.5%.
- Graduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 40 students or 17.2%.

► **FULL-TIME STATUS<sup>5</sup>**

- Full-time enrollment decreased by 368 students or 4.2%.
- Full-time undergraduates decreased by 494 students or 6.1%.
- Full-time graduate students increased by 126 students or 18.8%.

► **PART-TIME STATUS<sup>5</sup>**

- Part-time enrollment decreased by 153 students or 6.4%.
- Part-time undergraduates decreased by 157 students or 13.1%.
- Part-time graduate students increased by 4 students or 0.3%.

► **IN-STATE RESIDENTS**

- In-state students decreased by 700 students or 7.4%.
- In-state undergraduates decreased by 706 students or 8.4%.
- In-state graduate students increased by 6 students or 0.5%.

► **OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS**

- Out-of-state students increased by 174 students or 13.7%.
- Out-of-state undergraduates increased by 73 students or 9.6%.
- Out-of-state graduate students increased by 101 students or 20.0%.

► **INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS**

- International students increased by 5 students or 1.2%.
- International undergraduates decreased by 18 students or 11.0%.
- International graduate students increased by 23 students or 8.7%.

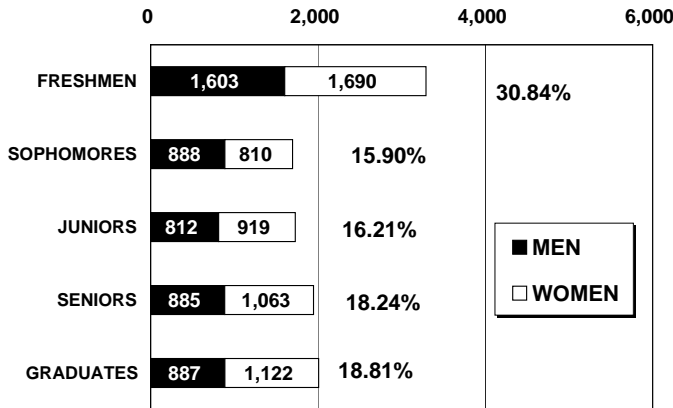

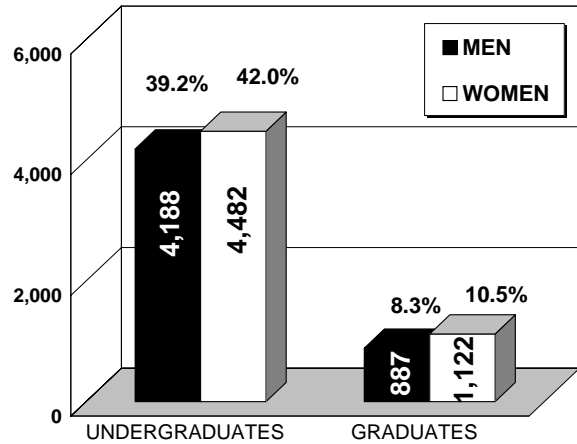

### Enrollment by Gender and Classification



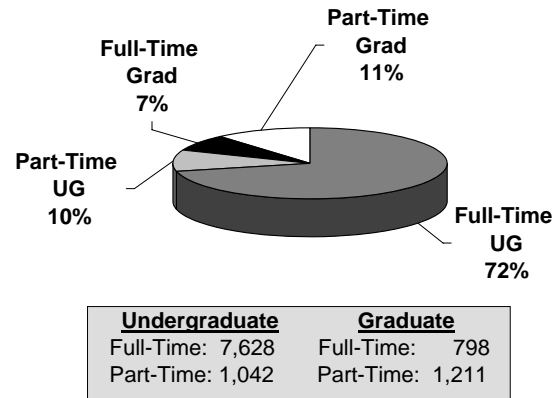
### Enrollment by Gender and Level



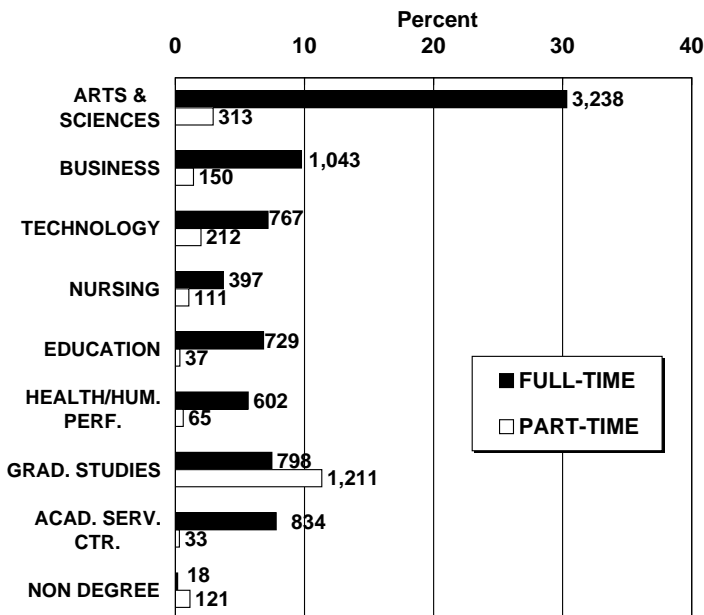

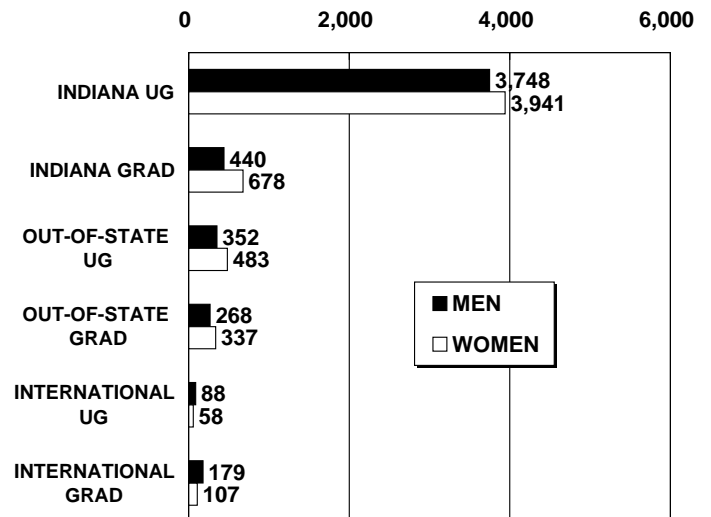
### Enrollment by Status and Level



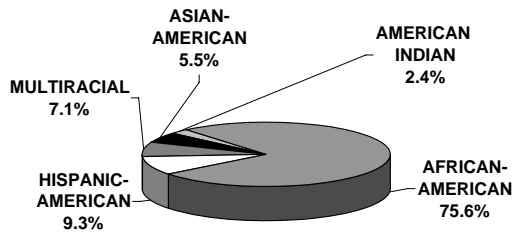
### Enrollment by Status and College



### Enrollment by Gender, Level, and Residency



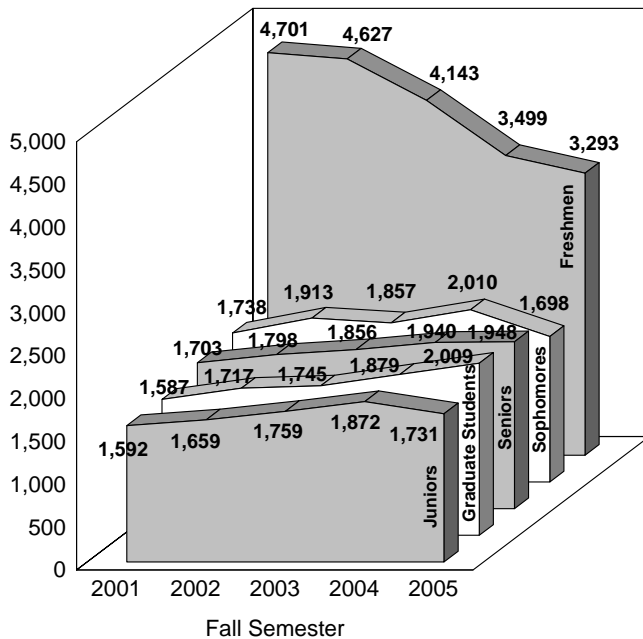

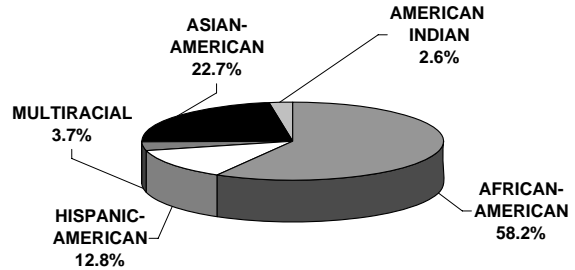

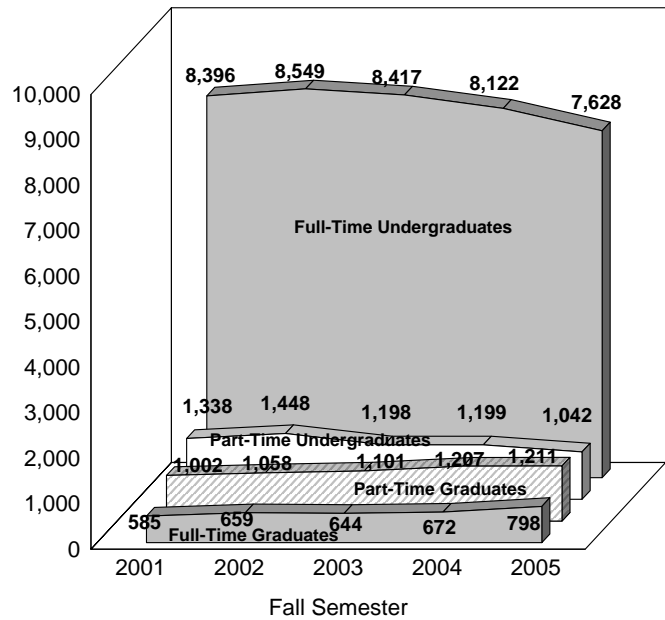
### Graduate U.S. Minority Students
