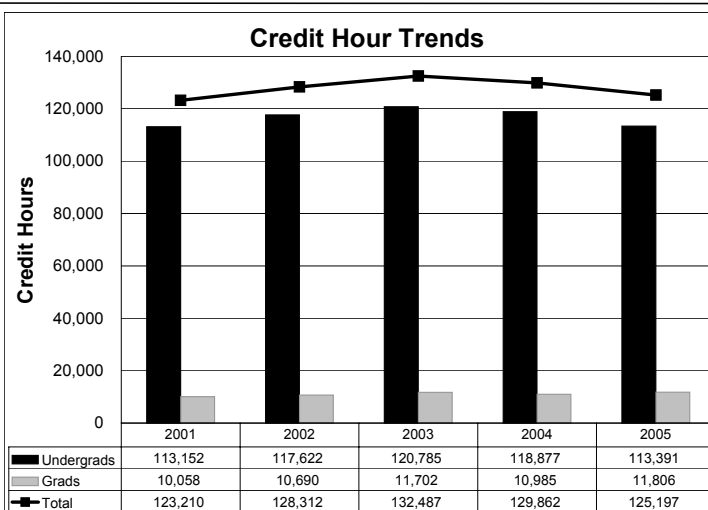
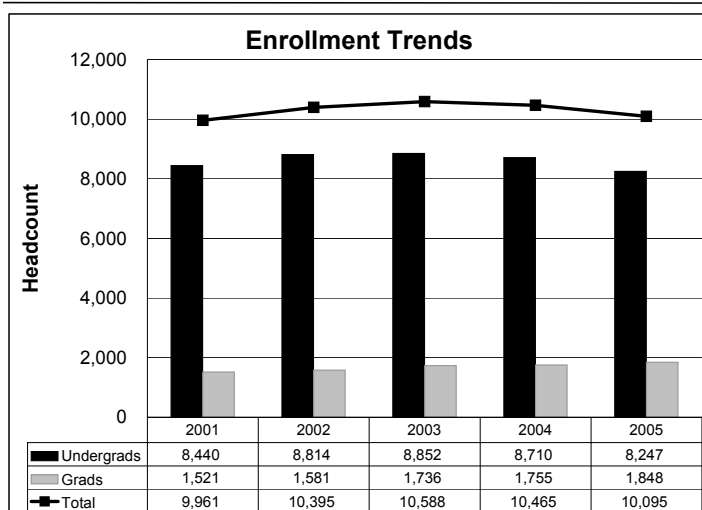

HIGHLIGHTS

ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM SPRING 2004 TO SPRING 2005

► UNIVERSITY TOTALS

Total enrollment decreased by 370 students or 3.5%.
Total undergraduate enrollment decreased by 463 students or 5.3%.
Total graduate student enrollment increased by 93 students or 5.3%.
Total full-time equivalent (FTE)³ students decreased by 297.4 or 3.4%.

► CLASSIFICATION⁴

Freshman enrollment decreased by 406 students or 15.2%.
Sophomore enrollment decreased by 129 students or 6.3%.
Junior enrollment increased by 85 students or 4.6%.
Senior enrollment decreased by 13 students or 0.6%.

► COLLEGE⁵

Enrollment increased in Graduate Studies (93 students or 5.3%) & Nursing (16 students or 3.7%). Enrollment decreased in Non-Degree (146 students or 56.2%), Arts & Sciences (112 students or 3.1%), Student Academic Services (69 students or 9.1%), Education (59 students or 7.3%), Health & Human Performance (50 students or 7.0%), Business (26 students or 2.3%), and Technology (17 students or 1.7%).

► U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS

Total U.S. minority student enrollment decreased by 33 students or 2.2%.
Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment decreased by 65 students or 5.0%.
Graduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 32 students or 16.2%.

► FULL-TIME STATUS⁶

Full-time enrollment decreased by 241 students or 3.0%.
Full-time undergraduates decreased by 311 students or 4.2%.
Full-time graduate students increased by 70 students or 11.9%.

► PART-TIME STATUS⁶

Part-time enrollment decreased by 129 students or 5.4%.
Part-time undergraduates decreased by 152 students or 12.4%.
Part-time graduate students increased by 23 students or 2.0%.

► IN-STATE RESIDENTS

In-state students decreased by 418 students or 4.7%.
In-state undergraduates decreased by 430 students or 5.5%.
In-state graduate students increased by 12 students or 1.1%.

► OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS

Out-of-state students increased by 51 students or 4.5%.
Out-of-state undergraduates decreased by 12 students or 1.7%.
Out-of-state graduate students increased by 63 students or 14.1%.

► INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

International students decreased by 3 students or 0.7%.
International undergraduates decreased by 21 student or 12.7%.
International graduate students increased by 18 students or 7.4%.

¹ International count shown on Page 1 (405) differs from international counts shown on Page 3 (132+241=373), because Page 1 is based on country of origin at admission and Page 3 is based on ethnicity.

² Average Age and Age by Level is based on 10,090 students for whom age data was available (99.95% of total enrollment).

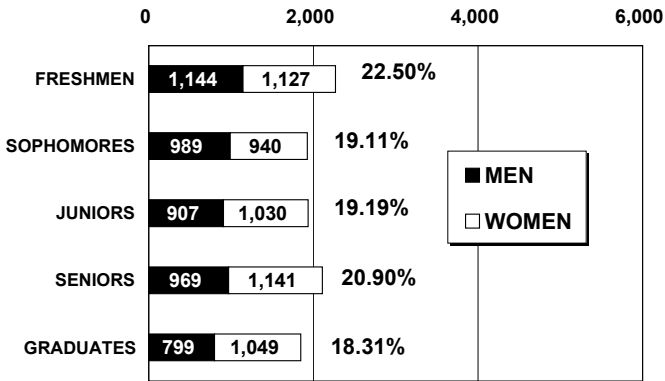

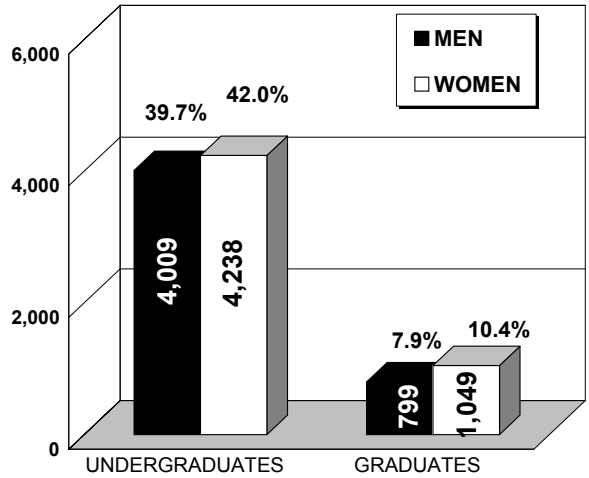

Enrollment by Gender and Classification



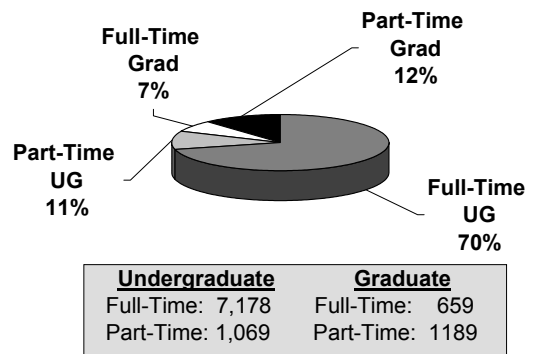
Enrollment by Gender and Level



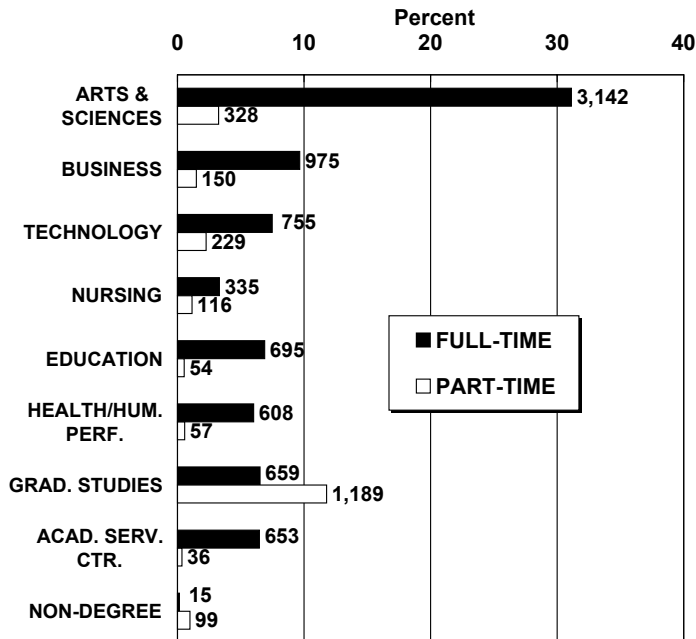

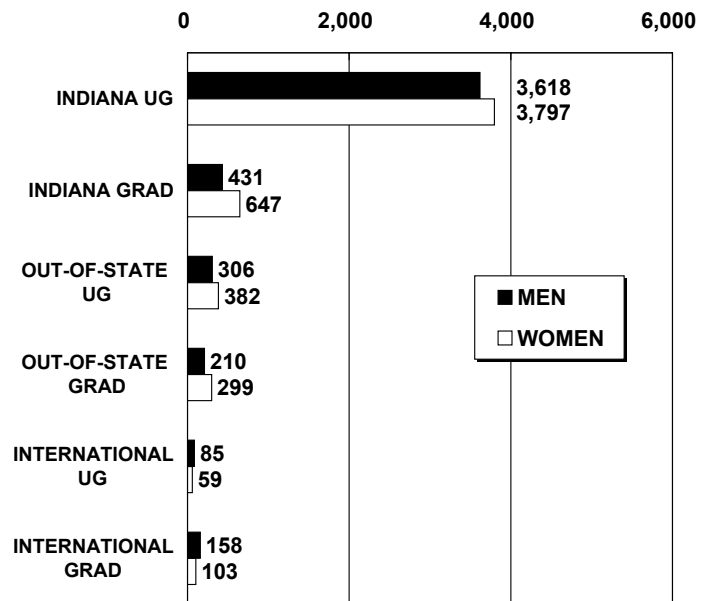
Enrollment by Status and Level



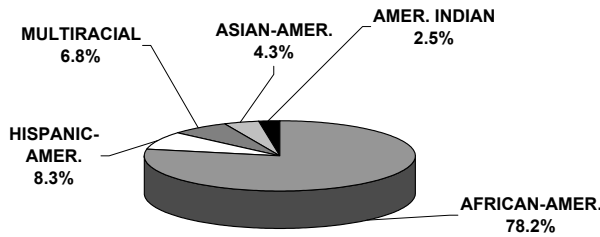
Enrollment by Status and College



Enrollment by Gender, Level, and Residency



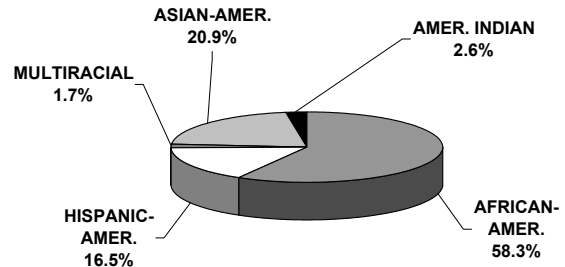
Undergraduate U.S. Minority Students

 Students of unknown origin comprise 1.8% (145) of all undergraduate students

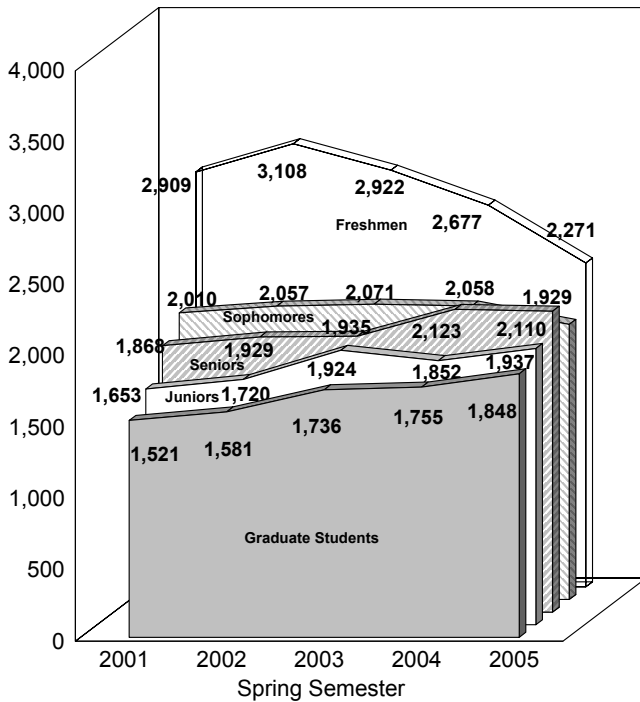
Graduate U.S. Minority Students



U.S. minority students comprise 12.4% (230) of all graduate students

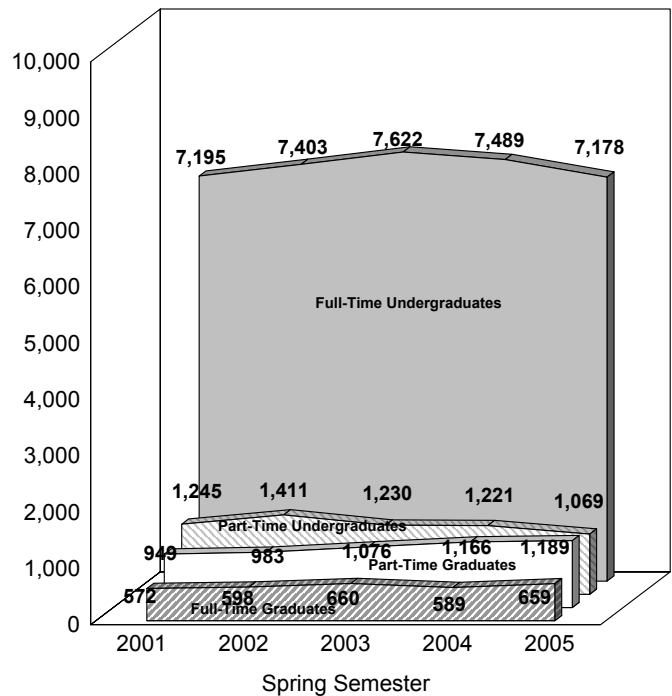
Caucasian students comprise 71.5% (1,322) of all graduate students
