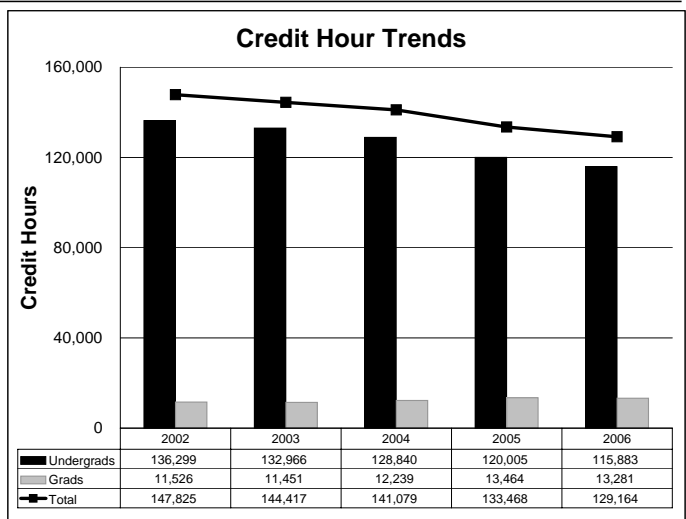
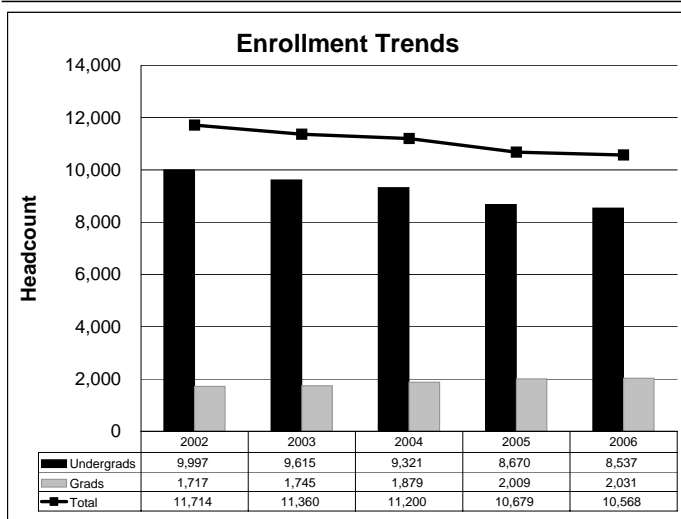

## HIGHLIGHTS

### ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM FALL 2005 TO FALL 2006

► **UNIVERSITY TOTALS**

Total enrollment decreased by 111 students or 1.0%  
 Total undergraduate enrollment decreased by 133 students or 1.5%.  
 Total graduate student enrollment increased by 22 students or 1.1%.  
 Total full-time equivalent (FTE)<sup>3</sup> students decreased by 290 or 3.2%.

► **CLASSIFICATION<sup>4</sup>**

Freshman enrollment decreased by 223 students or 6.8%.  
 Sophomore enrollment decreased by 58 students or 3.4%.  
 Junior enrollment increased by 6 students or 0.3%.  
 Senior enrollment increased by 142 students or 7.3%.

► **COLLEGE**

Enrollment increased in Non Degree (53 students or 38.1%), Nursing (139 students or 27.4%), Student Academic Services (12 students or 1.4%), and Graduate Studies (22 students or 1.1%). Enrollment decreased in Health & Human Performance (90 students or 13.5%), Education (86 students or 11.2%) Arts & Sciences (118 students or 3.3%), Technology (32 students or 3.3%), and in Business (11 students or 0.9%).

► **U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS**

Total U.S. minority student enrollment increased by 84 students or 5.3%.  
 Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 93 students or 7.1%.  
 Graduate U.S. minority enrollment decreased by 9 students or 3.3%.

► **FULL-TIME STATUS<sup>5</sup>**

Full-time enrollment decreased by 360 students or 4.3%.  
 Full-time undergraduates decreased by 329 students or 4.3%.  
 Full-time graduate students decreased by 31 students or 3.9%.

► **PART-TIME STATUS<sup>5</sup>**

Part-time enrollment increased by 249 students or 11.1%.  
 Part-time undergraduates increased by 196 students or 18.8%.  
 Part-time graduate students increased by 53 students or 4.4%.

► **IN-STATE RESIDENTS**

In-state students decreased by 249 students or 2.8%.  
 In-state undergraduates decreased by 197 students or 2.6%.  
 In-state graduate students decreased by 52 students or 4.7%.

► **OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS**

Out-of-state students increased by 122 students or 8.5%.  
 Out-of-state undergraduates increased by 71 students or 8.5%.  
 Out-of-state graduate students increased by 51 students or 8.4%.

► **INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS**

International students increased by 16 students or 3.7%.  
 International undergraduates decreased by 7 students or 4.8%.  
 International graduate students increased by 23 students or 8.0%.

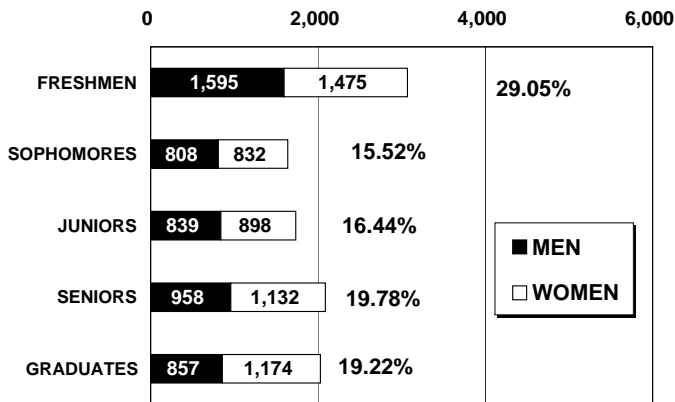

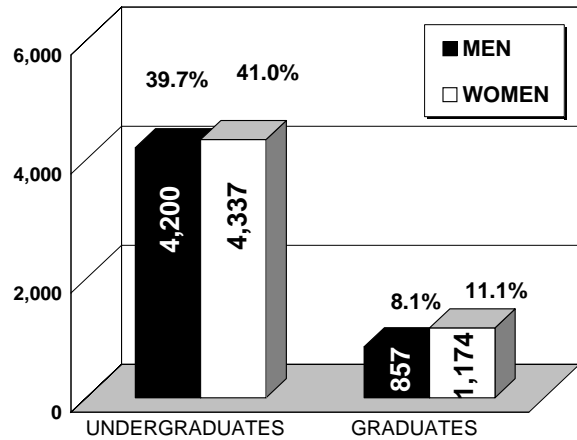

### Enrollment by Gender and Classification



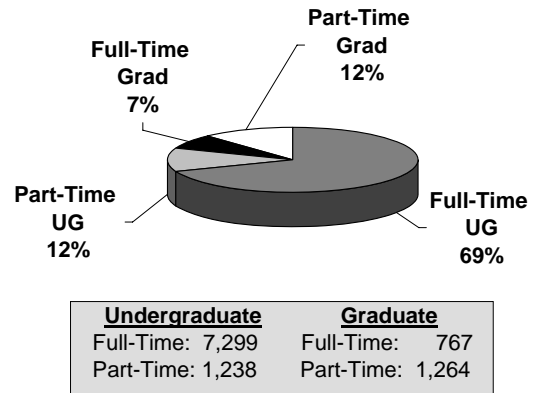
### Enrollment by Gender and Level



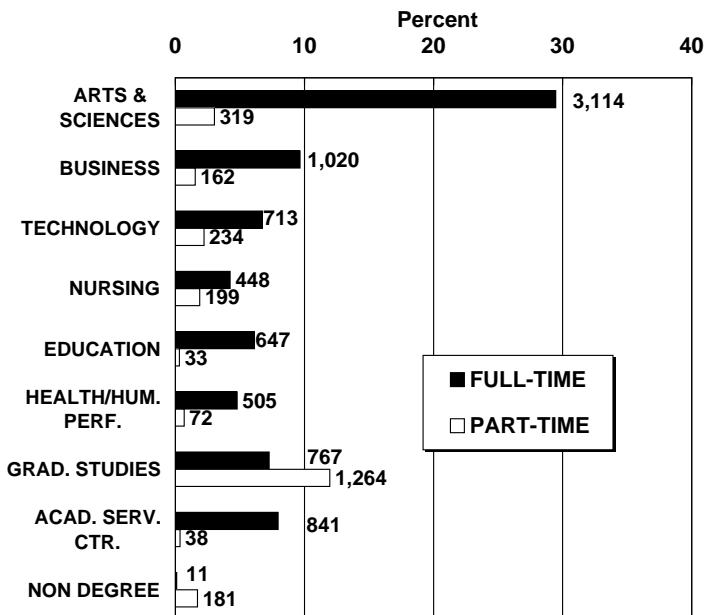

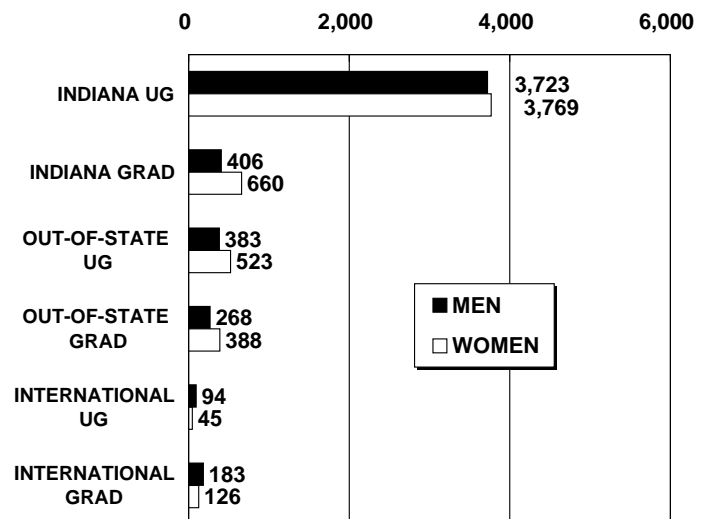
### Enrollment by Status and Level



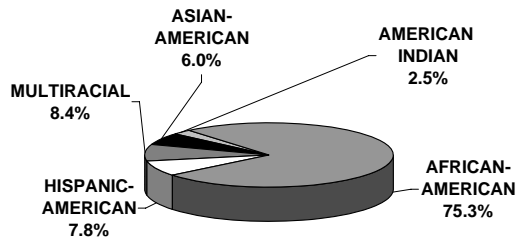
### Enrollment by Status and College



### Enrollment by Gender, Level, and Residency



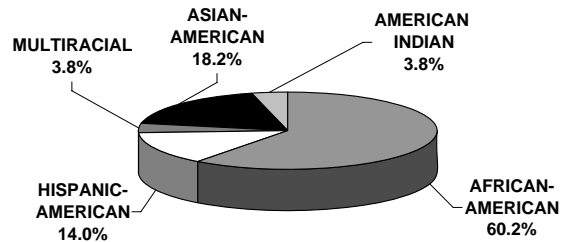

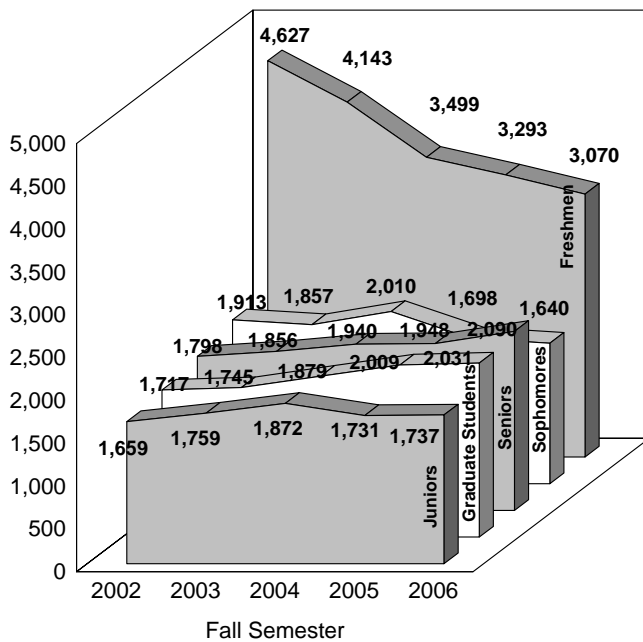
### Graduate U.S. Minority Students



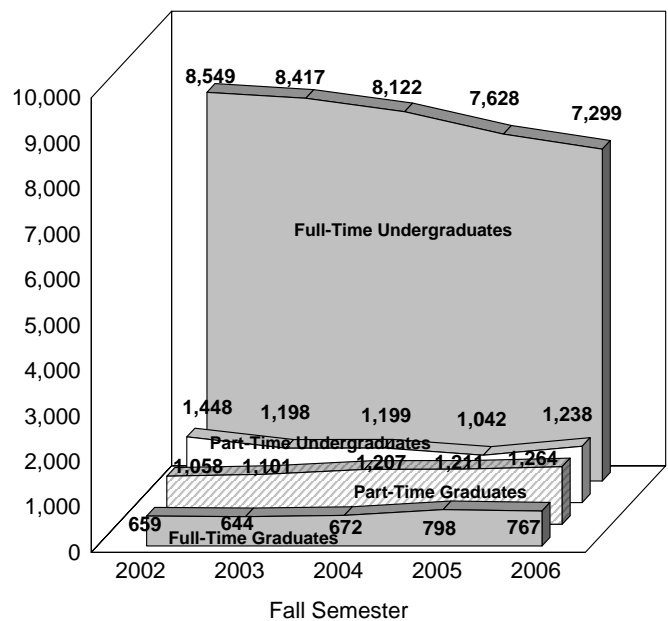
