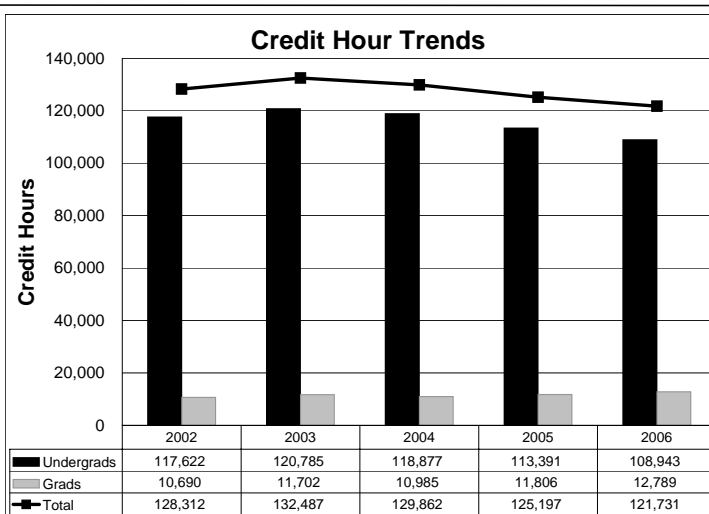
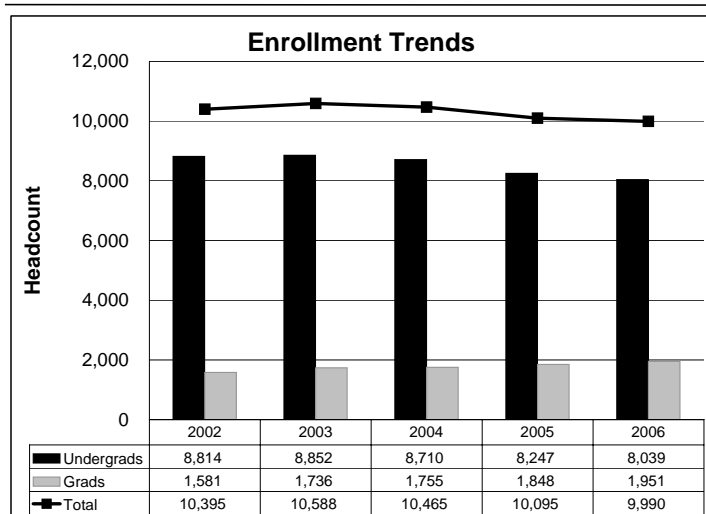

## HIGHLIGHTS

### ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM SPRING 2005 TO SPRING 2006

#### ► UNIVERSITY TOTALS

- Total enrollment decreased by 105 students or 1.0%.
- Total undergraduate enrollment decreased by 208 students or 2.5%.
- Total graduate student enrollment increased by 103 students or 5.6%.
- Total full-time equivalent (FTE)<sup>3</sup> students decreased by 214.7 or 2.5%.

#### ► CLASSIFICATION<sup>4</sup>

- Freshman enrollment decreased by 122 students or 5.4%.
- Sophomore enrollment decreased by 165 students or 8.6%.
- Junior enrollment decreased by 102 students or 5.3%.
- Senior enrollment increased by 181 students or 8.6%.

#### ► COLLEGE<sup>5</sup>

- Enrollment increased in Graduate Studies (103 students or 5.6%), Nursing (59 students or 13.1%), Non Degree (42 students or 36.8%), Business (16 students or 1.4%), and Student Academic Services (2 students or 0.3%).
- Enrollment decreased in Arts and Sciences (135 students or 3.9%), Education (95 students or 12.7%), Technology (59 students or 6.0%), and Health & Human Performance (38 students or 5.7%).

#### ► U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS

- Total U.S. minority student enrollment increased by 17 students or 1.2%.
- Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment decreased by 13 students or 1.1%.
- Graduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 30 students or 13.0%.

#### ► FULL-TIME STATUS<sup>6</sup>

- Full-time enrollment decreased by 296 students or 3.8%.
- Full-time undergraduates decreased by 321 students or 4.5%.
- Full-time graduate students increased by 25 students or 3.8%.

#### ► PART-TIME STATUS<sup>6</sup>

- Part-time enrollment increased by 191 students or 8.5%.
- Part-time undergraduates increased by 113 students or 10.6%.
- Part-time graduate students increased by 78 students or 6.6%.

#### ► IN-STATE RESIDENTS

- In-state students decreased by 240 students or 2.8%.
- In-state undergraduates decreased by 266 students or 3.6%.
- In-state graduate students increased by 26 students or 2.4%.

#### ► OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS

- Out-of-state students increased by 136 students or 11.4%.
- Out-of-state undergraduates increased by 64 students or 9.3%.
- Out-of-state graduate students increased by 72 students or 14.1%.

#### ► INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

- International students decreased by 1 student or 0.2%.
- International undergraduates decreased by 6 student or 4.2%.
- International graduate students increased by 5 students or 1.9%.

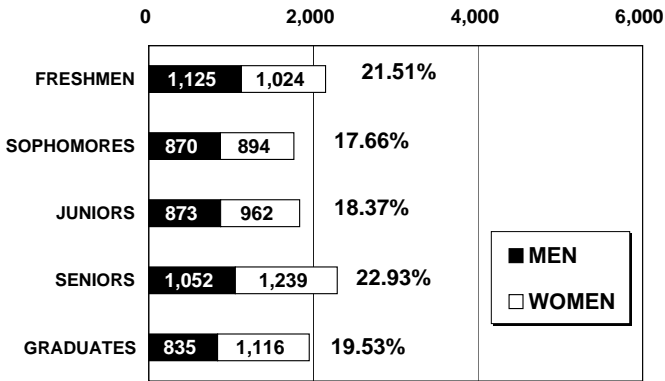

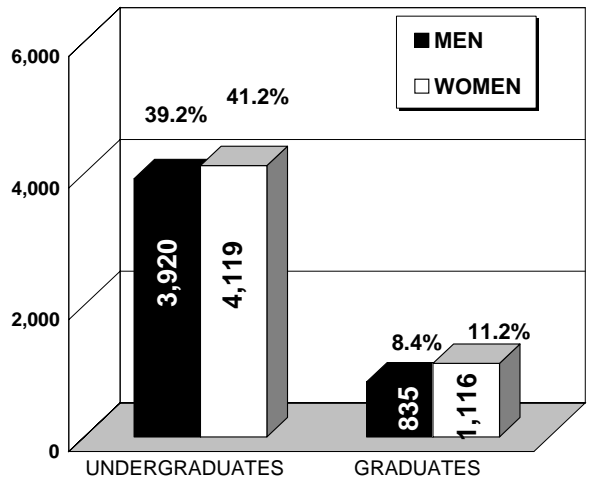

### Enrollment by Gender and Classification



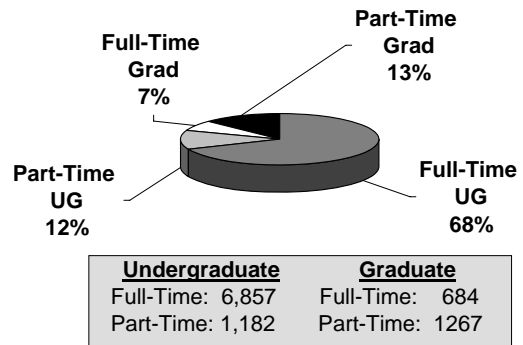
### Enrollment by Gender and Level



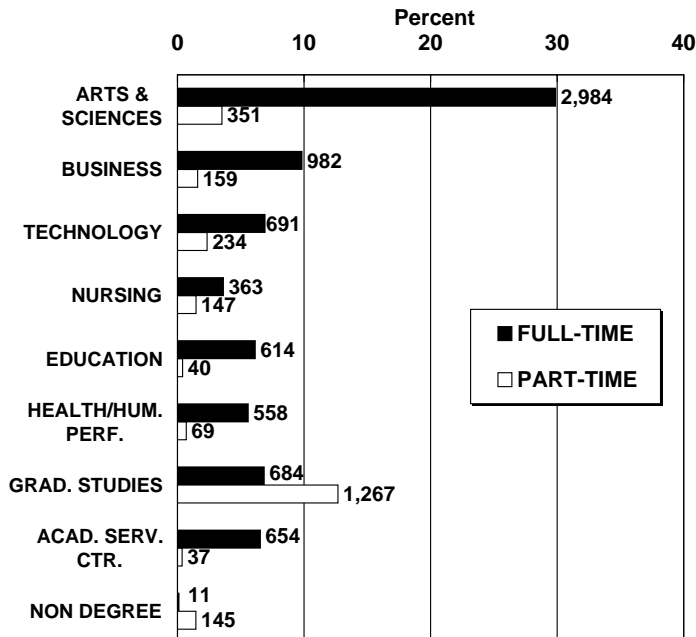

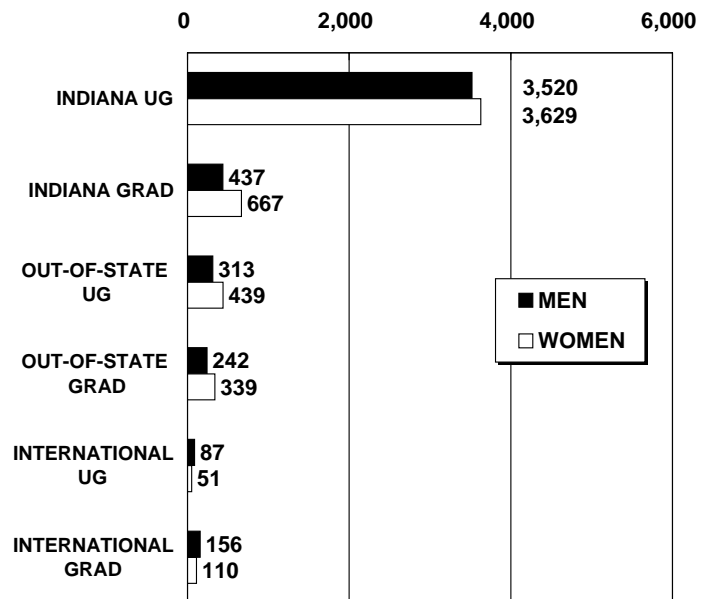
### Enrollment by Status and Level



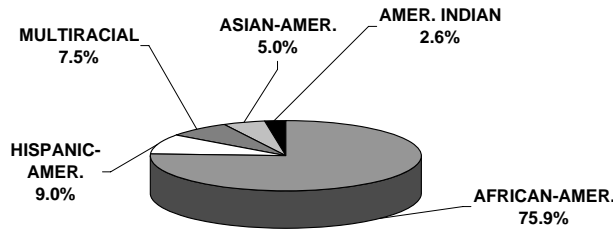
### Enrollment by Status and College



### Enrollment by Gender, Level, and Residency



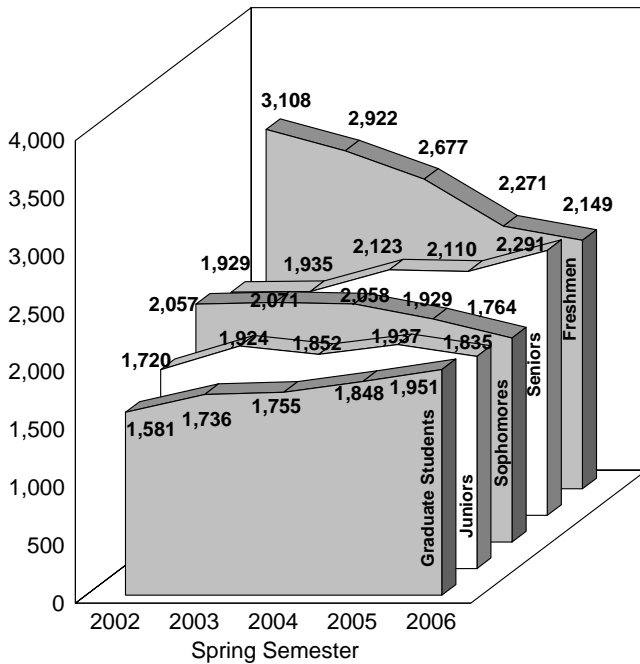
### Undergraduate U.S. Minority Students

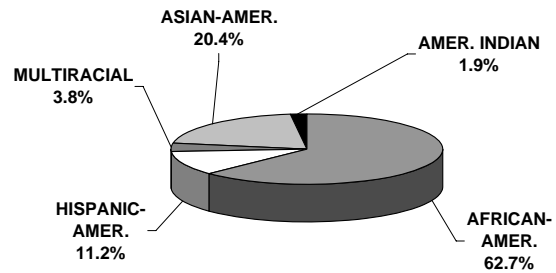

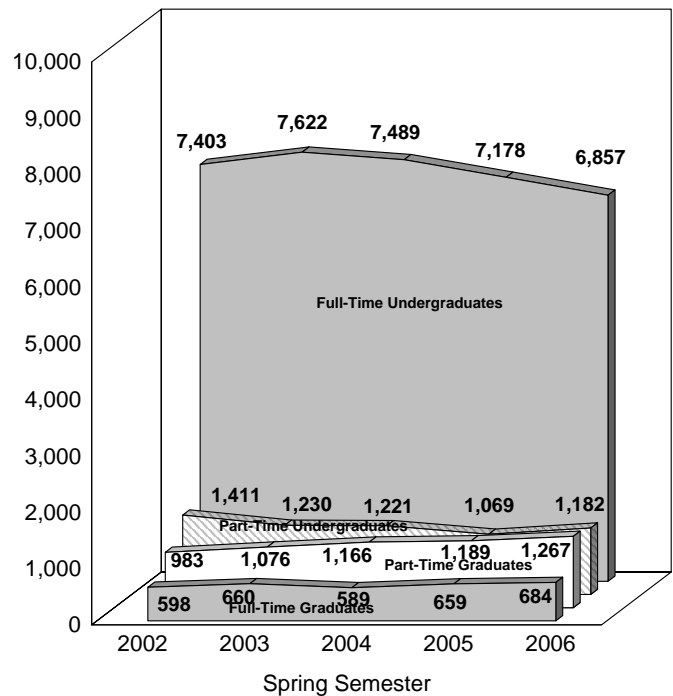
### Graduate U.S. Minority Students
