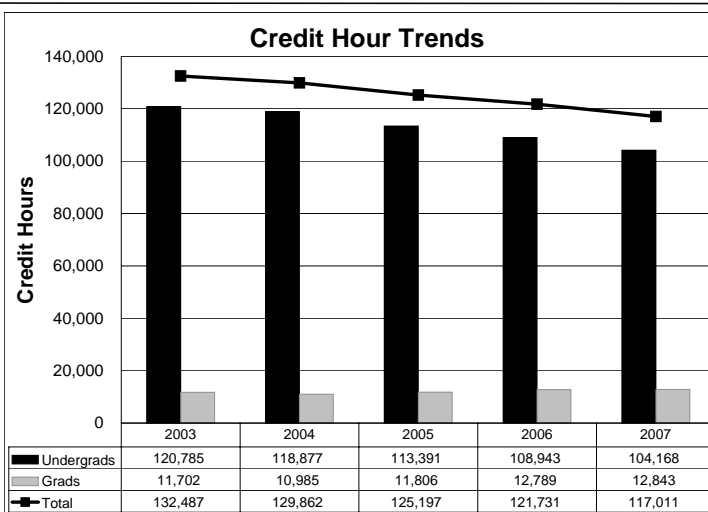
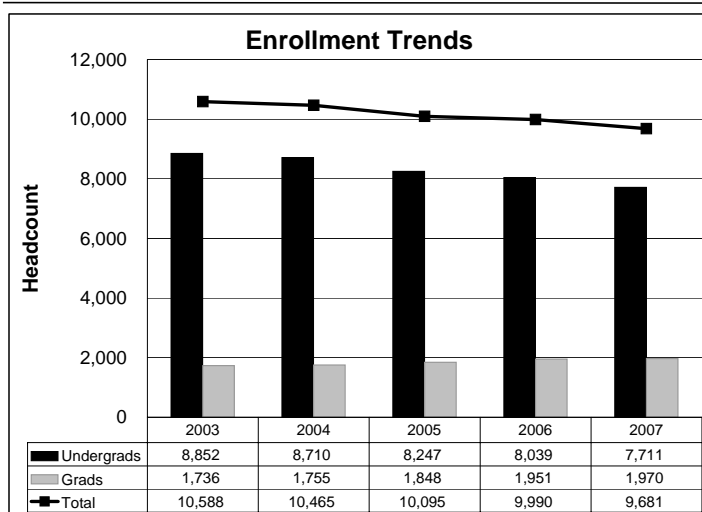

HIGHLIGHTS

ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM SPRING 2006 TO SPRING 2007

► UNIVERSITY TOTALS

- Total enrollment decreased by 309 students or 3.1%.
- Total undergraduate enrollment decreased by 328 students or 4.1%.
- Total graduate student enrollment increased by 19 students or 1.0%.
- Total full-time equivalent (FTE)³ students decreased by 313.8 or 3.8%.

► CLASSIFICATION⁴

- Freshman enrollment decreased by 86 students or 4.0%.
- Sophomore enrollment decreased by 174 students or 9.9%.
- Junior enrollment decreased by 111 students or 6.0%.
- Senior enrollment increased by 43 students or 1.9%.

► COLLEGE⁵

- Enrollment increased in Nursing (97 students or 19.0%) and in Graduate Studies (19 students or 1.0%). Enrollment decreased in Arts and Sciences (129 students or 3.9%), Business (98 students or 8.6%), Technology (74 students or 8.0%), Health & Human Performance (70 students or 11.2%), Non Degree (30 students or 19.2%), Education (22 students or 3.4%), and Student Academic Services (2 students or 0.3%).

► U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS

- Total U.S. minority student enrollment increased by 12 students or 0.8%.
- Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 5 students or 0.4%.
- Graduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 7 students or 2.7%.

► FULL-TIME STATUS⁶

- Full-time enrollment decreased by 292 students or 3.9%.
- Full-time undergraduates decreased by 311 students or 4.5%.
- Full-time graduate students increased by 19 students or 2.8%.

► PART-TIME STATUS⁶

- Part-time enrollment decreased by 17 students or 0.7%.
- Part-time undergraduates decreased by 17 students or 1.4%.
- Part-time graduate students stayed the same.

► IN-STATE RESIDENTS

- In-state students decreased by 470 students or 5.7%.
- In-state undergraduates decreased by 387 students or 5.4%.
- In-state graduate students decreased by 83 students or 7.5%.

► OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS

- Out-of-state students increased by 133 students or 10.0%.
- Out-of-state undergraduates increased by 60 students or 8.0%.
- Out-of-state graduate students increased by 73 students or 12.6%.

► INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

- International students increased by 28 students or 6.9%.
- International undergraduates decreased by 1 student or 0.7%.
- International graduate students increased by 29 students or 10.9%.

¹ International count shown on Page 1 (432) differs from international counts shown on Page 3 (114+277=391), because Page 1 is based on country of origin at admission and Page 3 is based on ethnicity.

² Average Age and Age by Level is based on all students (9,681) for whom age data was available (100% of total enrollment).

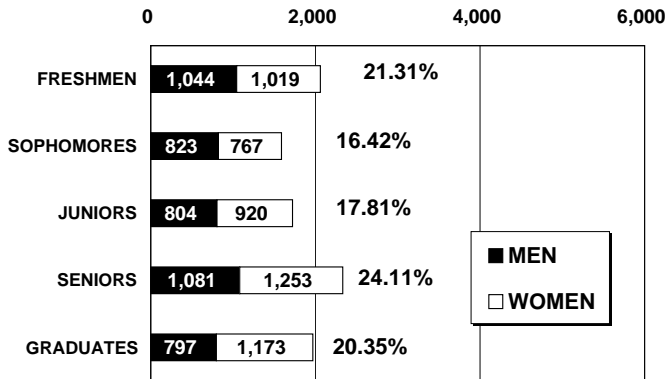

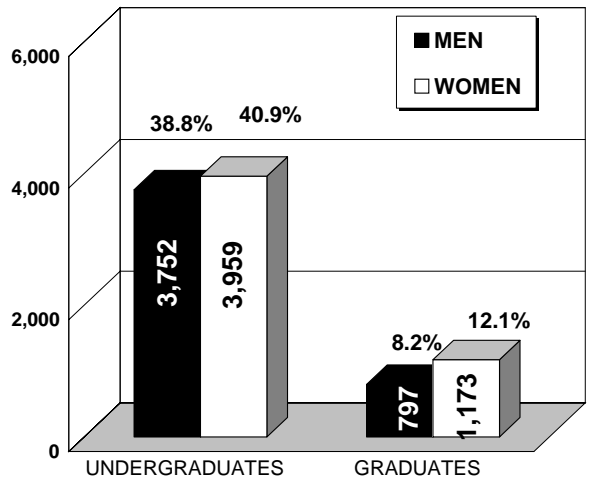

Enrollment by Gender and Classification



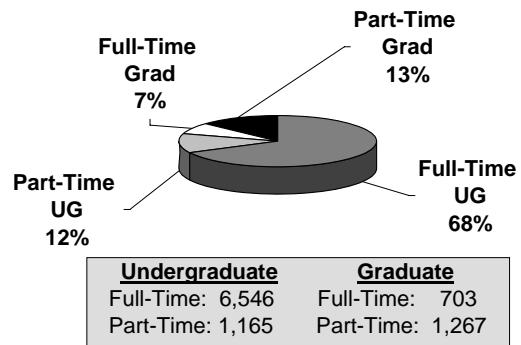
Enrollment by Gender and Level



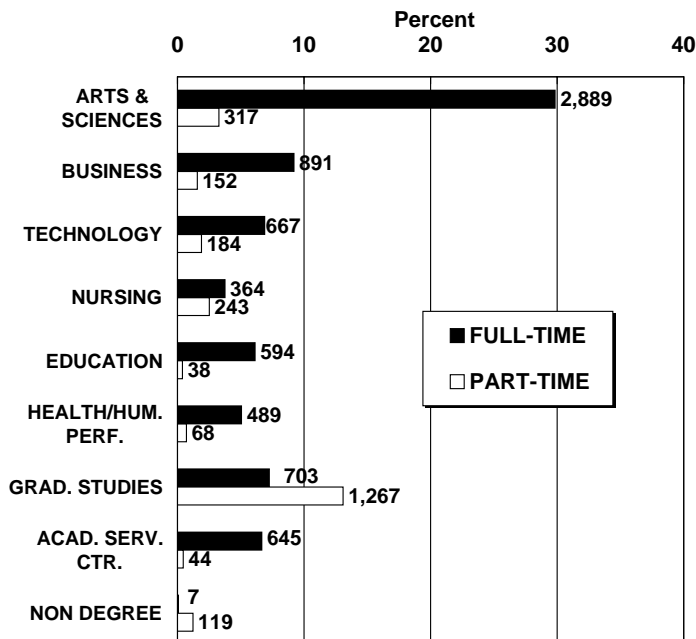

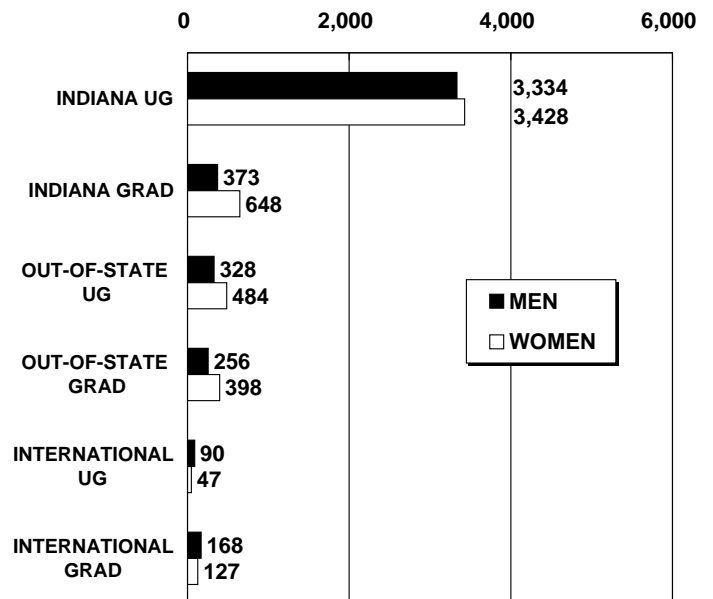
Enrollment by Status and Level



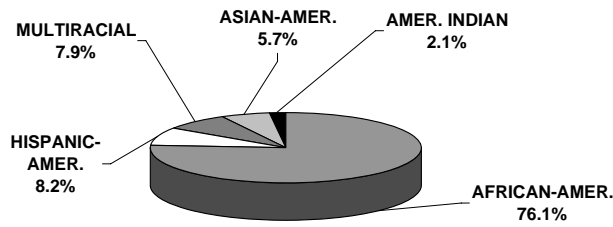
Enrollment by Status and College



Enrollment by Gender, Level, and Residency



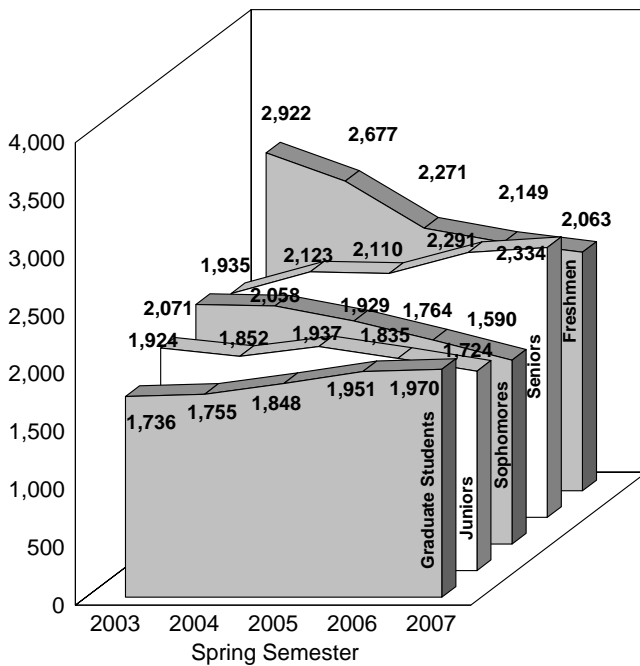

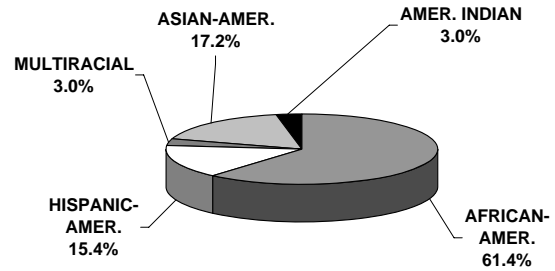

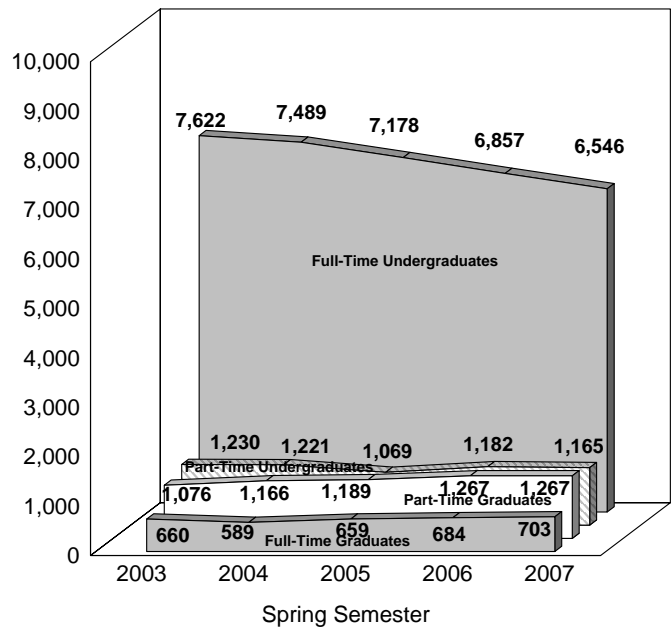
Graduate U.S. Minority Students
