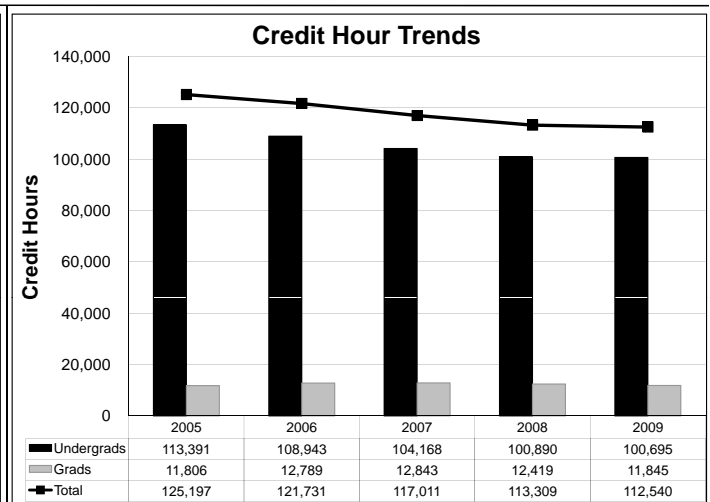
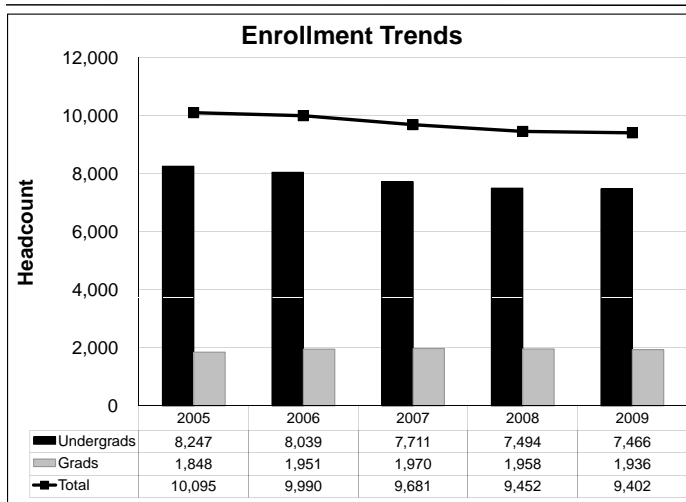

HIGHLIGHTS

ENROLLMENT CHANGES FROM SPRING 2008 TO SPRING 2009

► UNIVERSITY TOTALS

- Total enrollment decreased by 50 students or 0.5%.
- Total undergraduate enrollment decreased by 28 students or 0.4%.
- Total graduate student enrollment decreased by 22 students or 1.1%.
- Total full-time equivalent (FTE)³ students decreased by 60.9 or 0.8%.

► CLASSIFICATION⁴

- Freshman enrollment increased by 65 students or 3.2%.
- Sophomore enrollment increased by 11 students or 0.7%.
- Junior enrollment decreased by 16 students or 1.0%.
- Senior enrollment decreased by 88 students or 3.8%.

► COLLEGE⁵

- Enrollment increased in Student Academic Services (87 students or 13.2%), Nursing, Health, and Human Services (32 students or 2.6%), and Technology (9 students or 1.1%). Enrollment decreased in Business (66 students or 6.2%), Non Degree (47 students or 40.5%), Arts and Sciences (26 students or 0.9%), Graduate Studies (22 students or 1.1%), and Education (17 students or 2.9%).

► U.S. MINORITY STUDENTS

- Total U.S. minority student enrollment increased by 93 students or 6.2%.
- Undergraduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 51 students or 4.1%.
- Graduate U.S. minority enrollment increased by 42 students or 15.4%.

► FULL-TIME STATUS⁶

- Full-time enrollment increased by 10 students or 0.1%.
- Full-time undergraduates increased by 27 students or 0.4%.
- Full-time graduate students decreased by 17 students or 2.7%.

► PART-TIME STATUS⁶

- Part-time enrollment decreased by 60 students or 2.4%.
- Part-time undergraduates decreased by 55 students or 4.7%.
- Part-time graduate students decreased by 5 students or 0.4%.

► IN-STATE RESIDENTS

- In-state students decreased by 103 students or 1.4%.
- In-state undergraduates decreased by 117 students or 1.8%.
- In-state graduate students increased by 14 students or 1.4%.

► OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS

- Out-of-state students increased by 36 students or 2.3%.
- Out-of-state undergraduates increased by 43 students or 4.7%.
- Out-of-state graduate students decreased by 7 students or 1.0%.

► INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

- International students increased by 17 students or 3.8%.
- International undergraduates increased by 46 student or 27.1%.
- International graduate students decreased by 29 students or 10.6%.

¹ International count shown on Page 1 (461) differs from international counts shown on Page 3 (220+184=404), because Page 1 is based on country of origin at admission and Page 3 is based on ethnicity.

² Average Age and Age by Level is based on all students (9,402) for whom age data was available (100% of total enrollment).

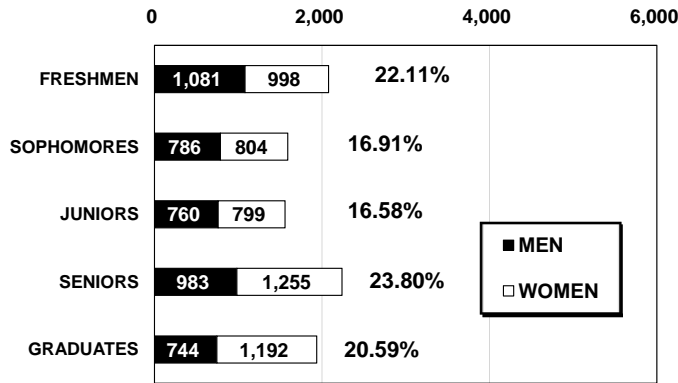

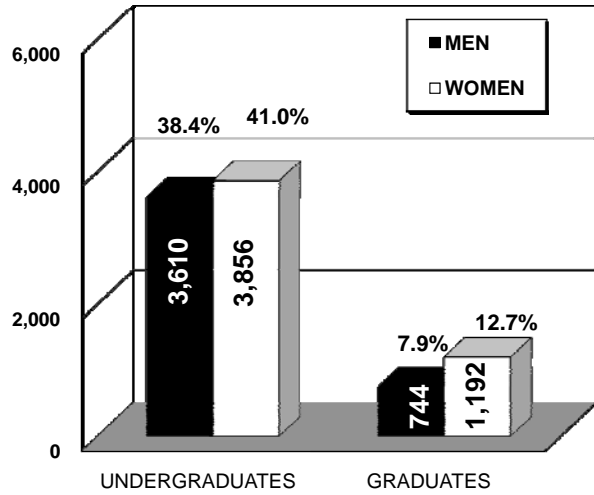

Enrollment by Gender and Classification



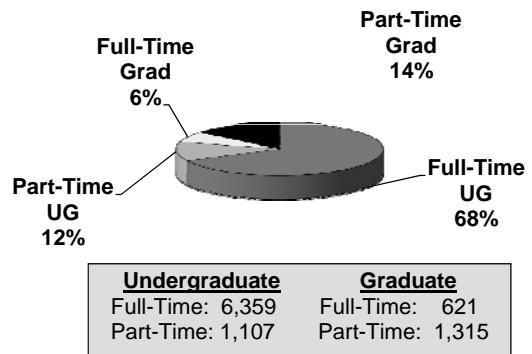
Enrollment by Gender and Level



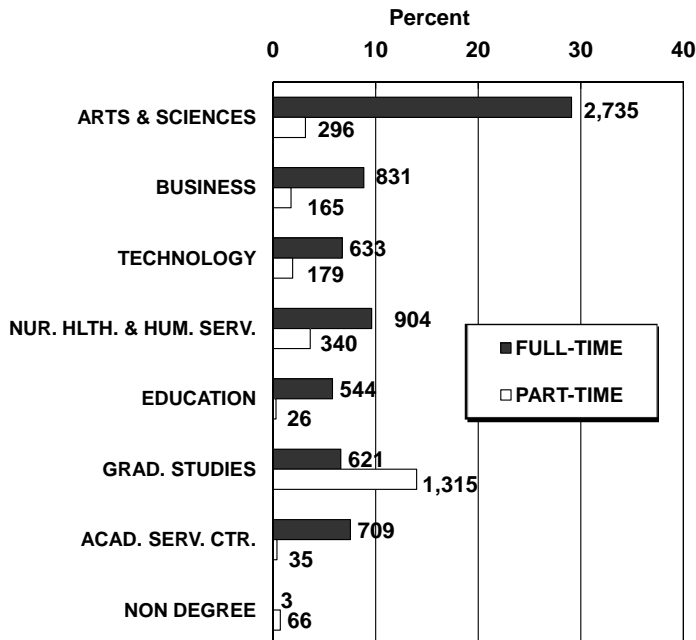

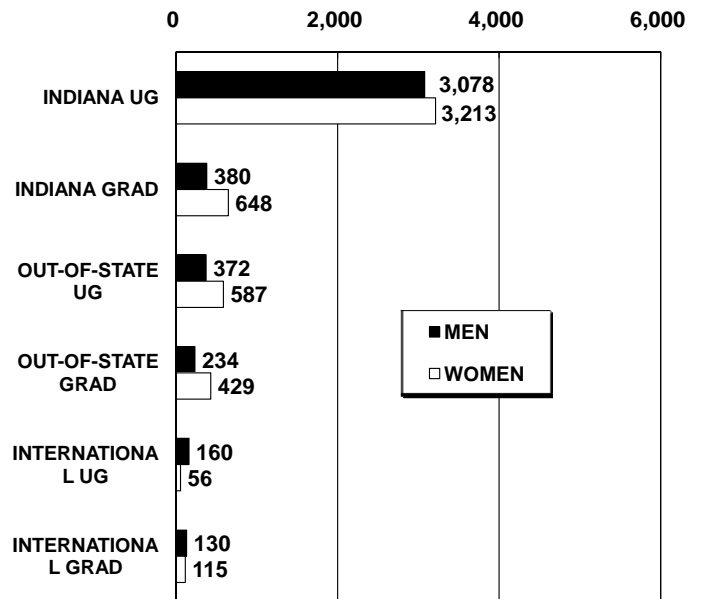
Enrollment by Status and Level



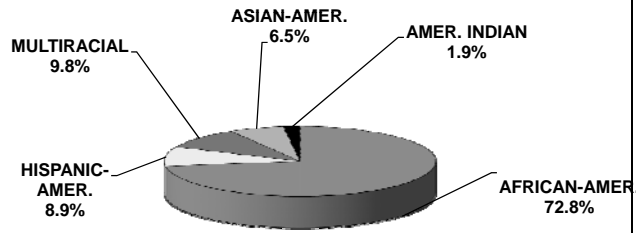
Enrollment by Status and College



Enrollment by Gender, Level, and Residency



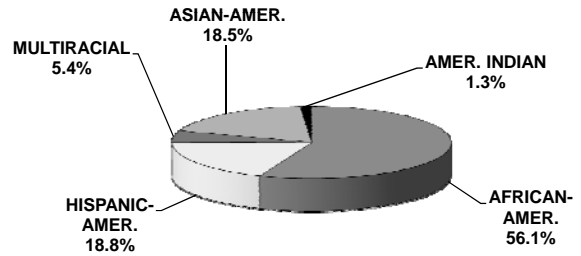
Undergraduate U.S. Minority Students

 Students of unknown origin comprise 1.4% (106) of all undergraduate students

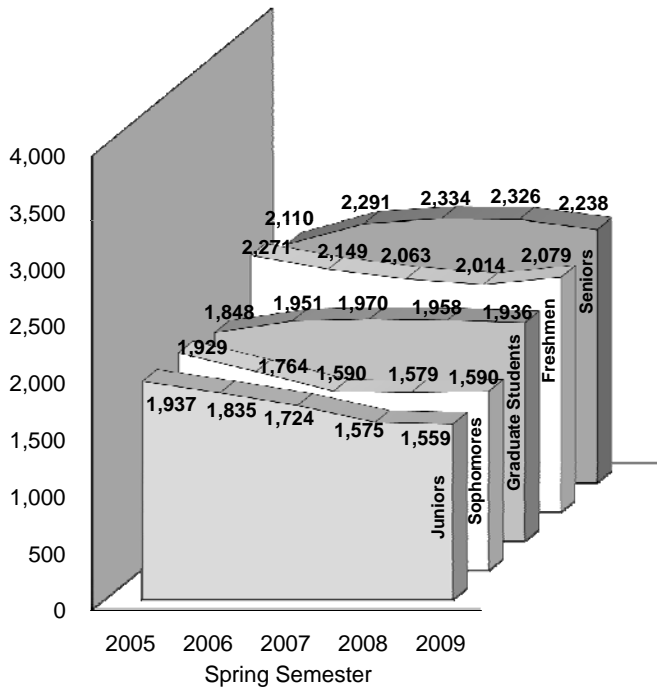
Graduate U.S. Minority Students



U.S. minority students comprise 16.2% (314) of all graduate students

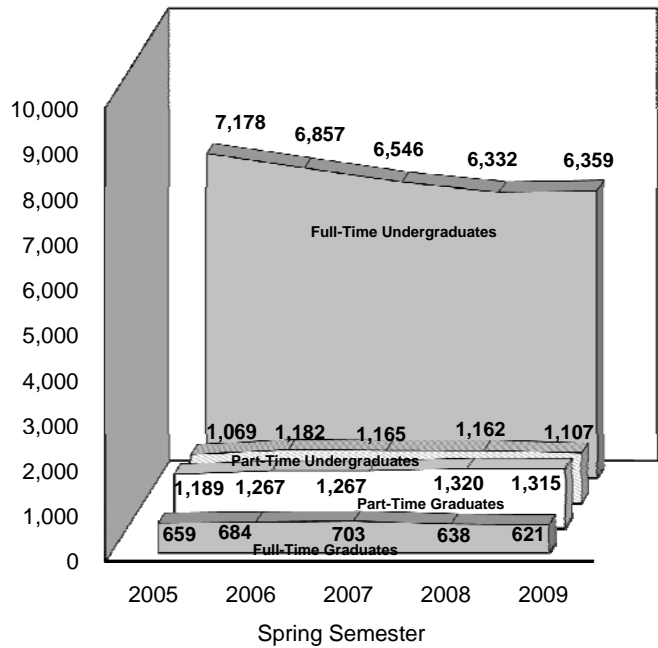
Caucasian students comprise 72.1% (1,395) of all graduate students
