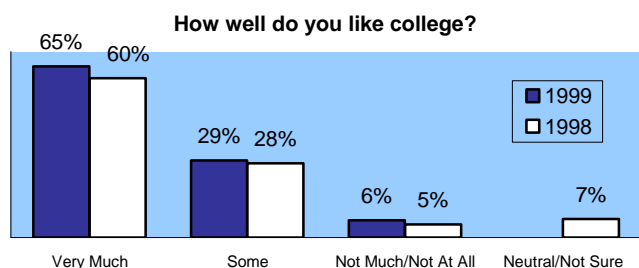


Health and Human Performance 1999 First Year Profile Freshman Class of Fall 1998

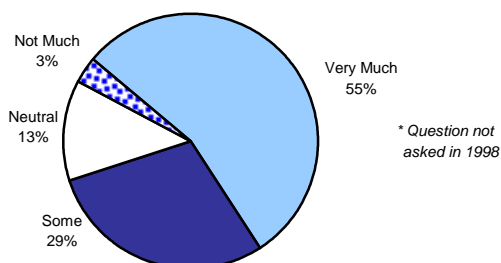
NOTE: DUE TO SMALL SAMPLE SIZES, SOME STATISTICS MAY NOT BE APPROPRIATE FOR ANALYTICAL PURPOSES.

The new First Year Experience Survey was administered to Fall 1998 freshmen in late Spring 1999. The questionnaire, which was revised in 1998, is designed to follow up on questions contained in the Student Information Questionnaire (SIQ) administered during NSARP. The purpose of this report is to provide a profile of 1998 freshmen enrolled in Health and Human Performance (HHP) at the end of their freshman year. HHP freshmen represent 4.7% of all 1998 freshmen and 6.3% of the respondent pool (31 responses out of 489 total). These HHP freshmen are also compared to their counterparts in the 1997 freshman class, who completed the survey in spring 1998.

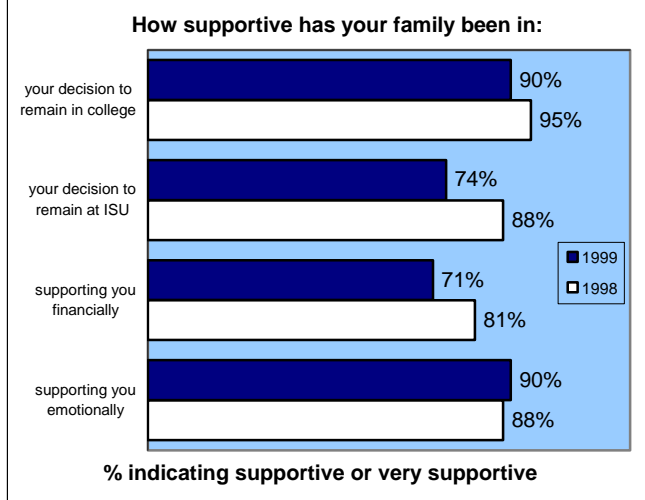
I. General Satisfaction

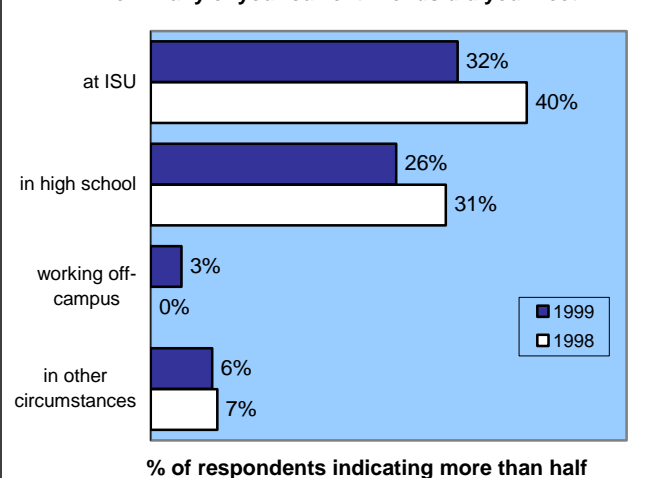

How many of your current friends did you meet:



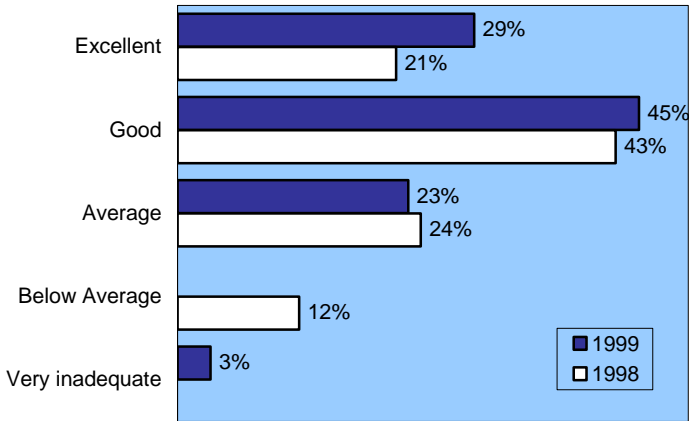

How would you rate your high school education?

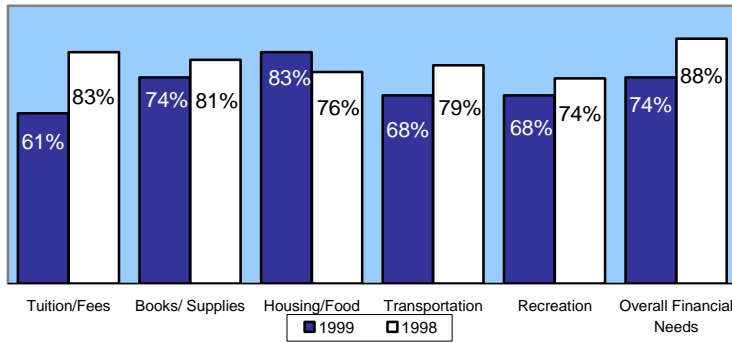

At least 7% of HHP freshmen spent more than 35 hours per week socializing, which is down from 13% in 1998.

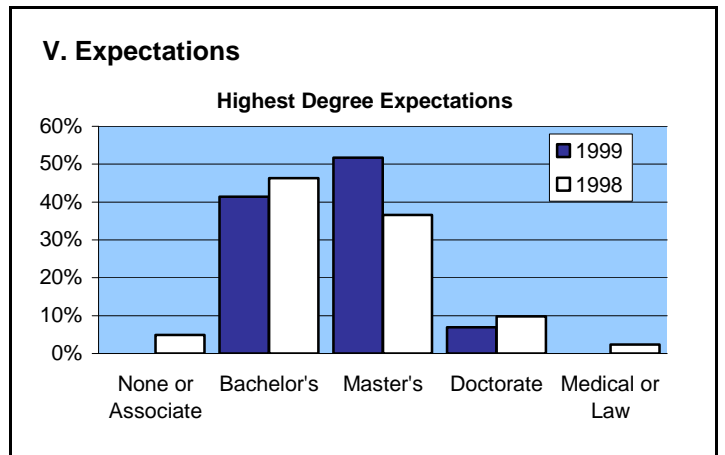
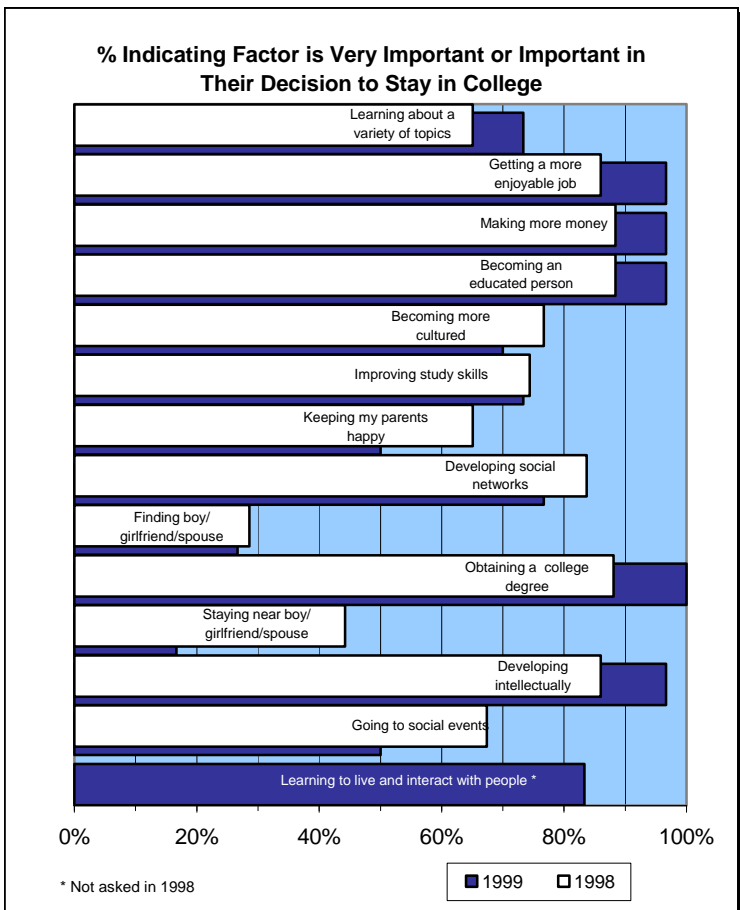

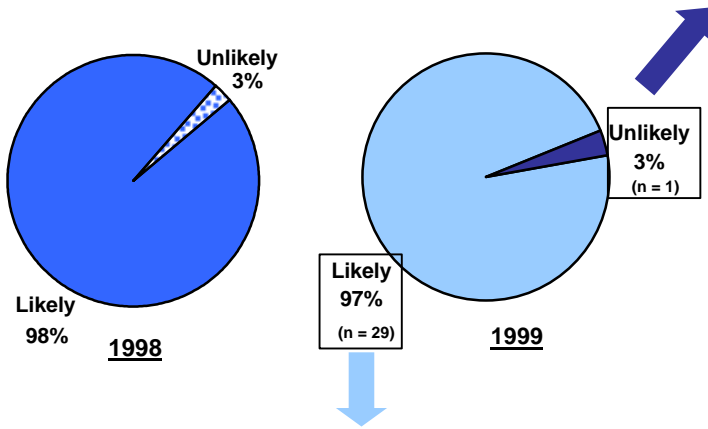

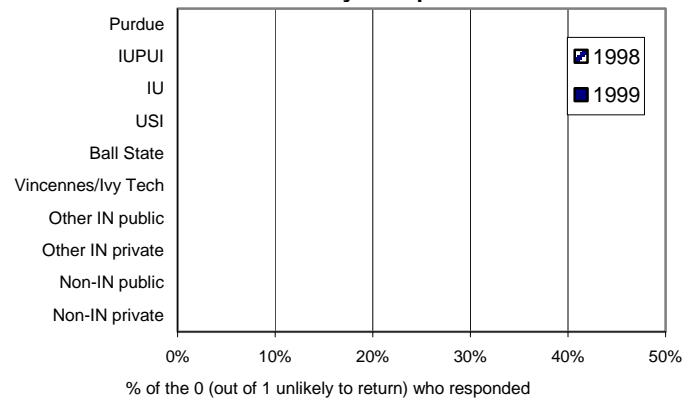
