All institutions in the Regional ranking are in the Midwest region.

Five ranking factors totaling 18% of the previous formula are no longer considered, beginning with the 2024 college rankings. These factors were class size, the proportion of a school's faculty with terminal degrees, alumni giving rate, the proportion of graduates borrowing and high school class standing. Although each of these statistics adhered to industry standard definitions from the Common Data Set and the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE), they were not collected or computed by the U.S. Department of Education and therefore not as universally reported by schools.
