Thesis Statement The purpose of this initiative is to increase grant and contract revenue to ISU through faculty and student research.

1. Introduction/Background – What?

As a high undergraduate university that is also a doctoral research University (Carnegie classification M4/R), Indiana State University supplements its traditional funding (state and tuition) with research grants and contracts revenue. Our potential for increasing this revenue will be enhanced by support for our faculty in these endeavors. This year's initiative builds upon and learns from last year's initiatives.

2. Proposal/Purpose/Justification – Why?

Increase Grants and Contract Revenue

- Increase the number of proposal submissions
- Help build interdisciplinary research teams
- Encourage new faculty to submit grants as practice
- Encourage, reward and recognize grant efforts
- Encourage external grants over internal grant dependency

3. Discussion of Past Years Results – Benchmark Successes?

COMPETE

The most promising of the grant endeavors is the COMPETE program. Through COMPETE, strategic plan seed funding is used to develop pilot data for major external grant proposals. Four rounds of COMPETE awards have been issued since FY14. This program requires repayment of the grant funds by the department if the researcher does not submit grant proposals totaling at least 10 times the amount awarded. New faculty members (before midpoint to tenure) only need to repay half of SP funds if external proposal goals are not met. Given the repayment obligations of these awards, grant submissions totaling \$385,000 are anticipated by September 2015. The table below summarizes the COMPETE awards made to date and the anticipated effect on external grant proposals.

Collaborate

Although the Collaborate speed networking events were well attended, only 1 small external grant proposal can be attributed to that program. Therefore, no funds are requested in FY16 for Collaborate.

URC/UAEC Changes

In FY15, the University Research Committee (URC) grant program and the University Arts Endowment Grant (UAEC) program guidelines were edited to encourage proposals to external funding agencies. Over the longer term, this change will reduce dependency on internal grant programs and result in an increase in external grant proposals submitted. No strategic plan funds were needed to implement this change.

Recognition Program

The Recognition Program included letters and coins from President Bradley to faculty who were successful in attaining external grants and contracts.

6. Budget – How Much, a General Discussion of Funds Use?

COMPETE - \$100,000 – Funds are used to develop pilot data sets to increase the competitiveness of large proposals to federal and state agencies. The awards can be up to 10,000 each so we anticipate granting up to 10 awards. Awardees must apply for at least 10 times the amount of their award in external grants
