Year in Review

Accomplishments

As you have heard, increasing public awareness of Indiana State University's accomplishments is crucial to building student enrollment, influencing policy makers, and developing a place of pre-eminence in the Midwest. What do you consider to be your department's 5-10 top accomplishments for the 2004-2005 year that will help contribute to this effort?

- in response to a very clear demand on the side of our graduate students, the CS group completed the design and submission of a new Masters program in CS - the Department has significantly increased the amount of moneys brought to the University via a number of successful grant applications - in the area of research, department members have published 14 articles, with two more accepted for publication, presented 11 talks at conferences in the US and 8 talks at international conferences, published 9 reviews, refereed 12 papers for various research journals, and attended 8 conferences - the Department successfully organized a regional MAA conference attended in April 2004 by over 200 participants - Department members have actively worked in various committees throughout the University - one of the most important achievements was hiring a new department chair in 2005 - one of our graduates has been hired with the National Security Agency, a very good sign of recognition of the quality of our program - we have established a learning community for our incoming freshmen

department members have published 14 articles, with two more accepted for publication, presented 11 talks at conferences in the US and 8 talks at international conferences, published 9 reviews, refereed 12 papers for various research journals, and attended 8 conferences we would like to make research a more "collective effort" in the dept. - the new chair intends to establish some kind of a cooperation seminar

we started to offer a number of web based classes that seem to be very popular with the students - the classes over the web are beginning Math and CS classes, and some more specialized CS classes our MathEd program does not have any distance or web based classes yet we also traditionally teach a distance based Calculus 301

Our Math program review has been postponed twice with respect to hiring a new department chair. During the spring semester 2005 we have finally decided to implement the assessment tools described in the next section. We will start using them in fall 2005 for both Math and CS program. Math Ed program has been repeatedly praised for their use of assessment for improving the program. A capstone course for the MathEd program has been submitted to the appropriate committees.
