One of the major accomplishments of the year was for the continued accreditation the program for another six years. As far as revenue generated for the past year, as of 02/17/05, cash on hand was \$38,434.78. Total revenue for the date was \$52,756.65 and expenses were \$14,321.87. There were added expenses that had to be paid this year that included a student worker and outside printing of the additional accreditation manuals that were required by the American Nurses Credentialing Center. The student worker was hired to assist the AA1 and the Director.
